WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Essex) Order, 1901.

Dated 18th December, 1901.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Essex I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Essex) Order, 1901."

Birns.

Close Time varied.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited within the county of Essex shall be varied so as to be between the 14th day of March and the 16th day of August in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The provisions of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within so much of the County of Essex as is within the Metropolitan Police District to the following Wild Birds in the same manner as if these Brds were included in the Scledule to the Act:—

Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swal'ow, Martins (Hirundo urbica, Hirundo riparia), Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Kestrel, Mcrlin, Hobby, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Osprey, Magpie, Shrikes (Lanius colluria, Lanius minor, Lanius excubitor). The Kingfisher protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 15th day of August in any year and the 15th day of March following the killing or taking of the Kingfisher is prohibited throughout the County of Essex.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During the period between the 15th day of August in any year and the 15th day of March following the killing or taking of the following kinds of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Essex:—

Nightingale, Goldfinch, Lark, Nightjar, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Kingfisher, Cuckoo, Barn Owl. Tawny Owl, Long Eared Owl, Short Eared Owl, Kestrel, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Merlin, Hobby, Osprey, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Sand Martin, House Martin, Swift, Bearded Tot (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Shrikes, Magpie, Wheatear, Stonernat, Whinchat, Red Start, Flycatchers, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Black Cap, Garden Warbler, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiffichaff, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Long Tailed Tit, Nuthatch, Wren, Golden Crested Wren, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wag'ail, Grey Wagtail, Hawfinch, Linnet, Common Bunting, Snow Bunting, Landrail or Corncrake, Coot, Chaffinch, Tree Creeper.

Certain Districts exempted from the operation of .
the foregoing Clause.

VI. I hereby exempt from the portion of this Order numbered V, the whole County of Essex, except the portion lying within the Metropolitan Police District, and except the parishes of Epping, Epping Upland, Theydon Bois, Theydon Garnon, and Lambourne.

All Birds protected on Sundays within a certain Area.

VII. During the period between the 15th day of August in any year and the 15th day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in all such part of the County of Essex cutside the Metropolitan Police District as lies to the east of the London and Norwich Main Line of the Great Eastern Railway, and also the following parishes or parts of parishes on the west side of the same line:—Ardleigh, Manningtree, Aldham, West Bergholt, Boxted, Chapel, Wakes Colne, Copford, Dedham, Fordham, Great Horkesley, Little Horkesley, Laugham, Mount Bures, Great Tey, Little Tey, Mark's Tey, Wormingford, Mountnessing, Shenfield, Brentwood, South Weald, Noak Hill, Romford, Havering, and Hornchurch.

Eggs

Certain Eggs protected in that part of the County within the Metropolitan Police District.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within so much of the County of Essex as is within the Metropolitan Police District:—

Nightingale, Goldfinch, Larks (Alauda arvensis, Alauda arborea), Nightjar, Woodpeckers (Gecinus viridis, Picus major, Picus minor), Kingfisher, Cuckoo, Owls (Asio otus, Strix flammea, Syrnium aluco), Kestrel, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Merlin, Hobby, Osprey, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Martins (Hirundo urbica, Hirundo riparia), Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Shrikes (Lanius colluria, Lanius minor, Lanius excubitor), Magpie, Wheatear, Stonechat, Whinchat, Redstart, Flycatchers

(Muscicapa grisala, Muscicapa atricapilla), Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Blackcap, Garden Warbler, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiff-chaff, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Long Tailed Tit, Nuthatch, Wren, Golden Crested Wren, Wagtails (Motacilla viridis, Motacilla lugubris, Motacilla melanope, Motacilla raii), Hawfinch Linnet, Buntings (Emberiza rustica, Emberiza melanocephala, Emberiza citrinella), Starling, Landrail or Corncrake, Coot.

All Eggs protected within a certain Area.

IX. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the following area for a period of five years from the date of this Order.

The whole of the foreshore, including the shirgle, sand hills, salt marshes, creeks, and other uninclosed lands extending from high-water mark to the first boundary of enclosed or cultivated lands separating the foreshore from them, between the following points on the coast, viz. :-

From Harwich Lighthouse to Shoeburyness, such parts of the tidal river Blackwater as are above the town of Maldon, such parts of the river Colne as are above Wivenhoe, and such parts of the river Crouch as are above Battles Bridge being excepted from the said area.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extent and Enforcement.

1. This Order applies to and shall be in force in the District and part of a District of Local Authorities mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall be enforced by the Local Authority of such District or part of a District.

Muzzling of Dogs.

2.-(1.) No dog shall be allowed to be in or on any public place unless such dog is efficiently muzzled with a wire cage muzzle so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while wearing the same to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent such dog from breathing

freely or lapping water.
(2.) Provided that the provisions of this Article

shall not apply—

(a.) to packs of bounds or to any dog while being used for sporting purposes or for the capture or destruction of vermin, and in every case in charge of a competent person;

(b.) to any dog while being taken to or from an exhibition, show, or other place, if such dog is confined in a suitable hamper, crate, hox, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Unmuzzled Dogs.

- 3.—(1.) Any dog found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:
 - (i.) If the dog is diseased or suspected or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog it shall be forthwith slaughtered.
 - (ii.) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other
 - (iii.) In any other case the dog shall be detained in some proper place and be there kept for such period as the Local Authority think expedient: Provided that where the person having charge of or the owner of a dog so detained is known, the Local Authority shall cause notice to be forthwith given to such person or owner of the fact of the dog having been so seized and detained, and the dog shall, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the in-fringement of this Order, be given up to such person or owner on payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such detention. If the dog so seized and detained has not been claimed by such person or owner within three days after the seizure, or, where I

such person or owner is known, within two days after the aforesaid notice has been given, the Local Authority may cause the dog to be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Local Authority deem expedient.

(2.) Every dog shall for the purposes of this Article be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

General Provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897,

4. Subject to the provisions of this Order, all the provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897 shall, so far as the same are applicable, continue to apply, during the continuance of this Order, to the District and part of a District to which this Order applies.

Offences.

5. If any dog is found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person allowing the same to be in or on such public place in contravention of this Order, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
