THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated January 24, from His Majesty's Representative at Monte Video, enclosing the following translation of a Decree respecting quarantine:—

**Translation.**

The existence of bubonic plague at Porto Alegre having been officially confirmed the National Board of Health issued the following Decree yesterday (23rd January):—

ARTICLE 1. Ships coming from Porto Alegre will undergo five days' sanitary observation counting from the date of their departure.

ARTICLE 2. Passengers proceeding from other localities (*sic*), (i.e., other places in the State of Rio Grande), can enter the country at the following points:—

Artigus, Acegua, San Luis Chuy, Paso de Centurion, Cebollati, San Eugenio, and Santa Rosa. Such persons must produce a certificate from the Uruguayan Consular authorities stating that they have resided for more than ten days in the place from which they are coming.

ARTICLE 3. These certificates will be demanded either by the Sanitary, the Police, or the Customs Authorities.

ARTICLE 4. The passage of the frontier at points other than those specified on Article 2 is prohibited.

## SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREAS.

THE following Areas are now *Areas Infected with Swine-Fever* under the above-mentioned Acts:—

**Berkshire and Hampshire.**—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Wantage, Ilsley, Lambourn, Newbury (including the detached part thereof), Reading and Wokingham, the parishes of East Shefford and West Shefford, and the borough of Wokingham, in the administrative county of Berks; the petty sessional divisions of Kingsclere, Basingstoke, and Odiham, and the borough of Basingstoke, in the administrative county of Southampton; and also comprising the boroughs of Newbury and Reading (12 February, 1902).

**Buckinghamshire.**—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Stoke and Burnham, and the parishes of Hughenden, West Wycombe, Chepping Wycombe Rural, Little Marlow, Wooburn, and Hedsor, in the administrative county of Buckingham; and also comprising the borough of Chepping Wycombe (6 September, 1900).

**Cambridgeshire.**—An area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Bottisham and Cambridge, in the administrative county of Cambridge; and also comprising the borough of Cambridge (12 February, 1902).

**Essex.**—(1.) ## Interpretation of Terms.

1. For the purposes of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "Council" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Warrington, acting by the Council, the term "the borough" means the borough of Warrington, the term "car" means any carriage using any tramway laid down within the borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

## Entering and Leaving Cars.

2. Every passenger shall enter or mount upon or depart from or get off a car by the hindmost or conductor's platform and not otherwise.

## Smoking.

3. No person shall, smoke inside a car or on the conductor's platform, or on the top of a car in front of the upright trolley standard.

## Musical Instruments.

4. No person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, sound or play upon any musical instrument.

## Offensive Conduct.

5. No persons shall spit upon any seat, floor, or other part of any car, or commit any nuisance in, upon, or against any car.

No person shall wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

## Intoxicated Persons and Improper Language.

6. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or mount upon any car.

No person shall use any profane, obscene, or abusive language in or upon any car.

Every person offending against this Bye-law may, in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed, be prevented from mounting or entering any car, or may summarily be removed from any car by, or under the direction of, the conductor.

## Wilful Damage.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or otherwise damage any seat or cushion, or wilfully mark, scratch, or break any window of any car, or remove or deface any number-plate, or notice, in, or on, any car, or otherwise wilfully damage any such car. Every person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

## Offensive Clothing.

8. No person, whose dress or clothing will, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the seats or cushions of such car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, and no person who, in the opinion of the conductor, may for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall be allowed to enter or remain in, or upon, any car, and may be prevented from mounting any car.

No person shall enter a car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found upon any car, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the car upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned.

## Payment of Fares.

9. Each passenger shall upon demand pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized servant of the Council, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

## Tickets or Checks.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket or check (if any), when required so to do, to the conductor, or other duly authorized servant of the Council, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or check, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

## Wrongful Use of Workmen's Tickets.

11. No person not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Warrington Corporation Tramways Order, or the Act of Parliament confirming the same, shall use, or attempt to use, any ticket

or check intended only for artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

#### Personal Luggage.

12. Every person about to enter or mount upon any car and having any luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, if so requested by the conductor, place such luggage upon the front or driver's platform, and shall not take or place the same in the interior or on the roof of the car, unless permitted by the conductor so to do.

#### Standing on Steps, Staircase, or Platform.

13. No person, other than a servant of the Council, shall be permitted to stand either on the top, or roof, or in the interior of any car. No person shall sit on the outside rail on the top or roof of any car, and shall not travel on the steps, staircase, or platform of any car, without the permission of the conductor. No person shall hold or hang on to any part of any car, or travel therein or thereby, otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

#### Entering Full Cars.

14. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is authorized to carry, no additional person, not being a servant of the Council, shall enter, mount, or remain in, or on, any such car after being warned by the conductor not to do so.

#### Entering or Leaving Cars in Motion.

15. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any car while it is in motion.

#### Dogs or other Animals.

16. No person shall take a dog or other animal into, or on, any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor or any passenger. Any dog or other animal taken into, or on any car in breach of this Bye-law, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon the request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, such dog, or other animal, may be removed by, or under the direction of, the conductor.

#### Loaded Firearms.

17. No person shall enter, or get upon, or travel in, or on, any car whilst in possession of any loaded firearm, or any article or thing which, in the opinion of the conductor, may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

#### Obstruction of Officers.

18. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Council in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with, any car.

#### Impeding Traffic.

19. No person shall wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on any of the tramways.

#### Stations and Stopping Places.

20. It shall be lawful for the Council, from time to time, in such streets as they may think expedient, to appoint and vary junctions and stations, and other places where the cars shall start, or stop, for the purpose of taking up, or setting down, passengers; and it shall not be incumbent upon the conductor of a car to stop the same for the purpose of taking up, or setting down, passengers except when requested so to do at any of such junctions, stations, and other such places.

#### Penalties.

21. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s.

22. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of May, 1902.

#### COUNTY BOROUGH OF WARRINGTON.

#### Distance from other Cars.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at less distance than 50 yards.

#### Prohibiting Stopping at Certain Places.

4. Except at a passing place or terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

#### Passing Vehicles.

5. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

#### Interference with Traffic.

6. The driver or conductor of a car shall not needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

#### Number of Passengers.

7. The driver or conductor of a car shall not permit any passenger beyond the number which the car is authorized to carry to enter or remain in or upon any part of the car.

#### Copy of Bye-laws.

8. The conductor of every car shall carry with him a copy of these Bye-laws, and shall, on request of any passenger, produce the same to, and shall permit the same to be perused by, such passenger.

#### Penalties.

9. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not

exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

10. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of May, 1902.
