## WILD BIRD (ENGLAND):

The Wild Birds Protection (East Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1902.

Dated 27th February, 1902.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council of the East Riding of Yorkshire, I hereby make the following Order:—

### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (East Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1902."

### BIRDS.

#### *Close Time Extended.*

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended, so far as concerns the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire, so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in each year.

**Eggs.***All Eggs protected within certain Areas.*

III. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' Eggs is prohibited for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

(1.) On the Promontory of Spurn, including Kilnsea Warren south of the line taken by the road leading from the Village of Kilnsea towards the site of the old Village of Kilnsea.

(2.) On Hornsea Mere and the lands immediately adjoining, the boundary of which area (outlined in pink on an Ordnance map sealed with the Seal of the Secretary of State, dated the 27th February, 1902, and deposited with the Clerk of the County Council) commences at a point on the Hornsea and Seaton Road 7 chains east of Mill Lane, and proceeds in a south-easterly direction along the road past the north-east side of "Great Wassand" for a distance of about 51 chains, thence along a footpath on the south side of the Mere to Lelly Lane, thence north-easterly for  $1\frac{1}{4}$  chains along the north side of Lelly Lane, thence in a north - westerly direction along the boundary fence dividing property belonging to Mr. William Bethell and Mr. Constable to the Mere, thence along the edge of the water of the Mere to and along a stream passing the west front of Ventnor House, to the Hornsea and Seaton Road, and then along the south side of the said road to the above-mentioned point 7 chains east of Mill Lane.

IV. The Order of the 15th February, 1901, is hereby repealed.

I HEREBY give notice, pursuant to the 9th section of the Act 5 and 6 Victoria, cap. 110, intituled "An Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey," that I have received a notice from Messrs. Monks, Hall, and Co. Limited, Warrington, given pursuant to the provisions of the above-mentioned Act, of their intention to raise the level of certain land adjacent to the River Mersey and subject to tidal influence

at high tides, in accordance with plans and sections deposited at this Office, a copy of which notice is subjoined.

IN pursuance of an Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Vic., cap. 110), we, Messrs. Monks, Hall, and Co. Limited, Athertons Quay, Warrington, Iron Manufacturers, hereby give you notice that we propose to raise the level of land in accordance with Plans and Sections deposited at the office of the Mersey Conservancy, where shown coloured yellow, being on the north-west bank of the Mersey, lower down the river, and immediately adjoining the westerly boundary of our Iron Works, for an area of about 3,822 yards, where a 21 feet tide can now run to an average depth of about one foot, which will displace about 207,000 gallons of water from a 21 feet tide. DOGS) ORDER OF 1902.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Extent and Enforcement.*

1. This Order applies to and shall be in force in the part of a District of a Local Authority mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall be enforced by the Local Authority of such District.

*Muzzling of Dogs.*

2.—(1.) No dog shall be allowed to be in or on any public place unless such dog is efficiently muzzled with a wire cage muzzle so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while wearing the same to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent such dog from breathing freely or lapping water.

(2.) Provided that the provisions of this Article shall not apply—

(a.) to packs of hounds or to any dog while being used for sporting purposes or for the capture or destruction of vermin, and in every case in charge of a competent person;

(b.) to any dog while being taken to or from an exhibition, show, or other place, if such dog is confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

*Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Unmuzzled Dogs.*

3.—(1.) Any dog found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:

- (i.) If the dog is diseased or suspected or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog it shall be forthwith slaughtered.
- (ii.) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.
- (iii.) In any other case the dog shall be detained in some proper place and be there kept for such period as the Local Authority think expedient: Provided that where the person having charge of or the owner of a dog so detained is known, the Local Authority shall cause notice to be forthwith given to such person or owner of the fact of the dog having been so seized and detained, and the dog shall, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of this Order, be given up to such person or owner on payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such detention. If the dog so seized and detained has not been claimed by such person or owner within three days after the seizure, or, where such person or owner is known, within two days after the aforesaid notice has been given, the Local Authority may cause the dog to be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Local Authority deem expedient.

(2.) Every dog shall for the purposes of this Article be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

*General Provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897.*

4. Subject to the provisions of this Order, all the provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897 shall, so far as the same are applicable, continue to apply, during the continuance of this Order, to the part of a District to which this Order applies.

*Offences.*

5. If any dog is found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person allowing the same to be in or on such public place in contravention of this Order, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Interpretation.*

6. In this Order—

“Disease” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies:

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park garden or pleasure ground, common, uninclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1897.

*Existing Muzzling Regulations of Local Authority.*

7. **ORKNEY (INFLUENZA) ORDER OF 1902.**

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.*

1. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and influenza, otherwise called or known as pink eye, or bilious fever, of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called influenza) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section twenty (slaughter and compensation);

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

*Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.*

2. Every person having, or having had in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of influenza shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected to an Inspector of the Local Authority or to one of his Assistants who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

*Duty of Inspector to act immediately.*

3. An Inspector of the Local Authority on receiving in any manner whatsoever information of the supposed existence of influenza, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of influenza, shall proceed with all practicable speed to the place where such disease, according to the information received by him, exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall there and elsewhere put in force and discharge the powers and duties conferred and imposed on him as Inspector by or under the Act of 1894 and this Order.

*Public Warning as to Existence of Influenza.*

4.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, give public warning by placards, advertisement, or otherwise, of the existence of influenza in any stable, building, field, or other place, with or without any particular description thereof, as they think fit, and may continue to do so



during the existence of the disease, and in case of a stable, building, or other like place, until the same has been cleansed and disinfected.

(2.) It shall not be lawful for any person (without authority or excuse) to remove or deface any such placard.

#### *Slaughter.*

5.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, cause to be slaughtered—

- (i.) any horse, ass, or mule affected with influenza; or
- (ii.) any horse, ass, or mule being or having been in the same stable, building, field, or other place in which influenza exists or is suspected to exist, or being or having been in contact with a horse, ass, or mule affected with influenza.

(2.) Provided, that if the owner of the horse, ass, or mule gives notice in writing to the Local Authority, or their Inspector or other officer, that he objects to the horse, ass, or mule being slaughtered, it shall not be lawful for the Local Authority to cause that horse, ass, or mule to be slaughtered except with the further special authority of the Board first obtained.

#### *Compensation.*

6. The Local Authority shall, except as herein after provided, pay out of the local rate as compensation for any horse, ass, or mule slaughtered under this Order, the value of the horse, ass, or mule immediately before it was slaughtered.

#### *Regulations of Local Authority as to Movement.*

7. The Local Authority may, with the view of preventing the spreading of influenza, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:

- (a.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules within their District or within such part or parts thereof as may be specified by the Local Authority:
- (b.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules out of their District or out of such part or parts thereof as may be specified by the Local Authority:
- (c.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement out of any stable, building, field, or other place of a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of influenza:
- (d.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement out of any stable, building, field, or other place in which influenza exists or is suspected to exist of a horse, ass, or mule that has been in contact with or in the same stable, building, field, or other place with a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of influenza:
- (e.) For regulating the taking out of any stable, building, field, or other place of any fodder, litter, or other thing that has been in contact with or used for or about a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of influenza; but nothing in any such Regulation shall authorize movement in contravention of any provision of any Order of the Board for the time being in force; and a Regulation under paragraph (d) of this Article shall operate so long only as any horse, ass, or mule which in the judgment of the Local Authority is affected with influenza, remains in the stable, building, field, or other place to which the Regulation refers, and in case of a stable, building, or other like place, until the Regulations of the Local Authority as to cleansing and disinfection have been complied with.

#### *Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.*

8.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of influenza, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:

- (a.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of influenza:
  - (b.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and such disinfection are to be effected:
  - (c.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect the same at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or occupier.
- (2.) If any person fails to cleanse and disinfect in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place to be cleansed and disinfected, and to recover summarily the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such person.

#### *Occupiers to give facilities for Cleansing.*

9.—(1.) Where the power of causing any place to be cleansed and disinfected under this Order is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier thereof shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

(2.) Any person failing to comply with the provisions of this Article shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### *Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.*

10.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

#### *Withholding of Compensation.*

11.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, withhold, either wholly or partially, compensation in respect of a horse, ass, or mule slaughtered by their order under this Order where the horse, ass, or mule was in their opinion affected with influenza at the time of its being brought into their District.

(2.) The Local Authority before determining under sub-section seven of section twenty of the Act of 1894 or under this Article, to withhold, either wholly or partially, compensation or other payment in respect of a horse, ass, or mule slaughtered by their order under this Order, shall give to the owner of the horse, ass, or mule an opportunity of making representations to them respecting the facts and circumstances of the case, and shall consider the same.

#### *Record of Slaughter.*

12. The Local Authority shall keep, in the form required by the Board, a record relative to horses, asses, or mules slaughtered by their order under this Order, stating the particulars indicated in such form, with such variations as circumstances require.

#### *Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

13.—(1.) Every person in charge of any horse, ass, or mule being moved, where, under any Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority produce and show to him the Licence,

if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### Offences.

14.—(1.) If any horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of such horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying such horse, ass, or mule, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of any place in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a person in charge of any horse, ass, or mule being moved, where, under a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

"Fodder" means hay or other substance commonly used for food of horses, asses, or mules:
