Padena (Peneda) Point—Electric Lights Exhibited near Lighthouse.

THE Austrian Government has given notice, dated 1st February, 1902, that until further notice several electric lights, one of which is shown from a high pole, will be exhibited in the vicinity of Padena (Peneda) Point lighthouse, Brioni Islands.

No. 124.—CHINA SEA—PALAWAN, EAST COAST.

Port Royalist—Beacons and Buoys Disappeared, Bank Eastward of.

WITH reference to Notices to Mariners Nos. 209 of 1899, 135 of 1900, and 655 of 1901:—

The United States Government has given notice, dated 1st February, 1902, that the beacons situated about 4 cables N. 58° W. and 7 cables N. 43° W., respectively, from Tide Pole Point lighthouse, and buoy painted in black and red horizontal bands, situated about 11 cables N. 45° W. from the same lighthouse do not now exist.

Approximate position, Tide Pole lighthouse, lat. 9° 43' N., long. 118° 48½' E.

Also, that the United States steamship "General Alava," passed over a small coral bank, with apparently a depth of from 10 to 15 fathoms over it, about 17 miles to the eastward of Port Royalist, or in approximately lat. 9° 43' N., long. 119° 03' E., but no soundings were obtained on this bank, as the vessel passed over it before a cast of the lead could be got.

Banc de la Coubre Buoy—Replaced by Light-Buoy.
