SPECIAL REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant of Customs in the Department of His Majesty's Customs (Supplementary to the General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations in the Civil Service included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 4th June, 1870).

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.
