*North Watcher—Intended Light.*

THE Netherlands Government has given notice, dated 26th February, 1902, that probably during May of the present year a 5th order white flashing light every five seconds, elevated 295 feet above high water, and said to be visible in clear weather from a distance of 23 miles, will be exhibited from an iron framework tower, erected on the summit of North Watcher Island, northern entrance to Makassar Strait.

Approximate position on Chart No. 2636, lat.  $0^{\circ} 35' N.$ , long.  $119^{\circ} 47' E.$

No. 149.—CHINA SEA—CARIMATA STRAIT.

*Serutu Island—Intended Light.*

THE Netherlands Government has given notice, dated 26th February, 1902, that probably during May of the present year a 3rd order white flashing light every five seconds, elevated 574 feet above high water, and said to be visible in clear weather from a distance of 30 miles, will be exhibited from an iron framework tower, painted white, erected upon a hill near the western point of Serutu Island, northern entrance to Carimata Strait.

Approximate position, lat.  $1^{\circ} 43' S.$ , long.  $108^{\circ} 41\frac{1}{2}' E.$
