THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Despatch, dated March 6, from His Majesty's Representative at Copenhagen, forwarding a copy of the Regulations (which follow) put into force in Denmark owing to the outbreak of small-pox in London:—

Copenhagen, March 6th, 1902.

MY LORD,—With reference to your Lordship's despatch No. 3 Commercial of the 3rd instant, I have the honour to transmit herewith a translation of the Articles of the decree published on May 15th, 1900, which have now been put in force by a decree also inclosed, dated the 17th ultimo, owing to the outbreak of small-pox in London.

ORDER concerning regulations to be observed for the prevention of the introduction into the country of yellow fever, dysentery, exanthematous typhus, and small-pox.

In accordance with the law of March 16th this year (compare notification by the Ministry of Justice of the 14th instant, S. 25), the regulations are hereby fixed, which should be enforced for the prevention of introduction into the country of yellow fever, dysentery, exanthematous typhus, and small-pox.

I.—YELLOW FEVER.

S. 1.

As regards this disease, all the regulations contained in notification No. 104, of May 14th this year, Ss. 13 to 21 and 23, should be enforced. How far persons arriving in the country shall be liable to inspection on shore will be specially ordained in the notifications under which the regulations for each case are enforced.

II.—DYSENTERY, EXANTHEMATOUS TYPHUS, AND SMALL-POX.

S. 2.

All ships which arrive from or have communicated with places against which the notification mentioned in S. 12 of notification No. 104, of May 14th this year, is in force, and all ships which on the voyage have been in communication with a ship, having or having had on board sick or dead persons known or suspected to be suffering or to have suffered from one of the diseases mentioned in this section, must, in Danish territorial waters, or if they are bound for or intend to touch at a Danish port or coast, as soon as the same is in sight, hoist a yellow, or if such is not available, a white flag on the foretop. The flag shall remain hoisted until the ship has obtained pratique.

All ships which arrive here and have, or have during the voyage had, sick or dead persons on board with regard to whom there is reason to believe that their disease is, or has been, one of those mentioned in this section, are under the same obligation, even if no publication such as the one mentioned in the first paragraph has been issued.

S. 3.

Ships shall be kept isolated and none of those on board landed until permission has been obtained, in seaport towns from the Quarantine Committee, and outside the towns from the examining physician: in the latter case, if the ship does not on inquiry by the Coast Guard Authorities prefer to sail to a seaport town, the physician shall immediately be sent for by these authorities; in the same way nobody from the shore or from other vessels must go on board the ship in question, except on official service or business. Those who have been on board such ships shall, as regards disinfection, be subjected to the regulations which the Quarantine Committee or the Coast Guard Authorities may ordain, and, if necessary, they shall be subjected to the same treatment as those who have arrived in the ship.

S. 4.

The ship and those on board shall be submitted to an examination by a physician. If it appears from the medical examination and the declaration in writing, which the Master of the ship must make on his faith and honour, that the ship has not, either at the place of departure or during the voyage, or on arrival, had on board any sick or dead persons whose disease may be suspected to have been, or has been, any of those mentioned in this section, the passengers on board are allowed to pass freely ashore and to communicate with the shore. If the ship has goods on board, the import of which is forbidden, these shall be destroyed unless they can be disinfected on board, or unless the ship will depart after having landed sick persons and passengers.

The medical examination is omitted as far as men-of-war are concerned, provided the ship's doctor supplies the medical examiner in charge with the necessary information. The decisions

taken on the basis of this information, in accordance with this and the following paragraphs, shall be notified to the commander of the ship.

S. 5.

If the ship is found at the medical examination to have dead or sick persons on board, with regard to whom there is reason to believe that the disease is one of those mentioned in this section, or if it has had such on board during the voyage or in the place of departure those persons who are found perfectly free of the disease in question, shall all the same be allowed to pass ashore freely.

The Quarantine Committee or the Coast Guard authorities shall thereafter provide that the bodies are brought ashore and buried and that the sick persons are brought to the isolation premises. Then the ship is disinfected to the extent which the doctor considers necessary. If the ship has goods on board, the import of which is forbidden, these shall be destroyed, unless they can be destroyed on board, or the ship will depart after having landed sick persons and passengers.

If the ship has arrived at a place where the premises mentioned in notification 104 of May 14th this year, Ss. 9 and 10, do not exist, or if the isolation premises are not large enough to house all the sick persons, the Coast Guard Authorities or the Quarantine Committee can order the ship to one of the places where such premises are to be found. If the ship is then ordered away and if the Master or the passengers claim it and if it is considered necessary, a doctor shall, so far as possible, go with her with the necessary medicine.

The Quarantine Committee or the Coast Guard Authorities may, however, if the ship has been submitted abroad to treatment such as is prescribed in this paragraph, and if she has had no subsequent suspicious connection with the shore, or no suspicious case on board, allow her free communication with the shore.

S. 6.

If the Master of the ship declares on arrival that he only wishes to obtain coal, provisions, &c., or orders necessary for the continuation of the voyage, the ship shall, in those places where there is a Quarantine Committee, be free of medical examination, provided that the Captain submits to the special rules which the Quarantine Committee may consider proper so as to prevent anybody on board the ship from leaving her.

S. 7.

Ships which carry emigrants, and ships which on account of uncleanness or from other reasons, offer specially unfavourable conditions for health, may be ordered by the Quarantine Committee, or the officials in charge, to abide by the rules laid down in S. 5, although the conditions are in general not present.

S. 8.

The Quarantine Committee or the Police Superintendent gives the necessary orders as regards stranded ships or goods washed ashore, the import of which is forbidden. The regulations in the above paragraphs should, as far as possible, be complied with.

S. 9.

In cases of disinfection of the ship being ordered, the water ballast must always be disinfected and pumped out, this, however, must not take place in the harbour. The ship's stock of fresh water should be emptied out, and the ship provided with fresh water from the place. The Ministry of Justice may, however, fix more detailed rules for the disinfection. The ship liable to disinfection must, on the request of the Quarantine Committee or the officials in charge, give all assistance in her power.

III.—S. 10.

From places which according to notification are considered infected with either of the diseases mentioned in this Order, the import is forbidden of:—

- (a.) all kinds of rags.
- (b.) used clothing and bedding, not being passengers' luggage or for the use of the crew, or furniture on removal.

From this prohibition against importation are further excepted:—

(1.) Fresh refuse certified to come direct from the spinning mills, looms, clothing factory or bleacher, and shoddy.

(2.) Goods which are carried through the country in transit, if they are packed so that they cannot be touched, and

(3.) Goods which have been proved to have been despatched from the infected place at least 5 days before the breaking out of the epidemic.

Used clothing and bedding which, in accordance with the above, are allowed to be imported, must, however, only be imported after having been properly disinfected under public control.

NOTIFICATION that the provisions of the 2nd and 3rd sections of the Order concerning the rules to be observed for preventing the introduction into the country of yellow fever, dysentery, exanthematous typhus, and small-pox, dated May 15th, 1900, shall come into force until further notice as regards London.

A considerable number of cases of small-pox occurring at present in London, it is herewith decided that London shall be considered infected with small-pox.

In consequence hereof the provisions of the 2nd and 3rd sections of the Order concerning the rules to be observed for preventing the introduction into the country of yellow fever, dysentery, exanthematous typhus, and small-pox, shall come into force as regards London.

a. The provisions of Ss. 13-21 and 24 concerning Asiatic cholera in the Order of the Ministry of Justice, dated May 14th, 1900, shall come into force as regards the following places:—

- (1.) The ports in the Red Sea.
- (2.) The ports in Egypt.
- (3.) The ports in Tonkin and Cochin China, and the East Indies, including the Dutch East Indian Colonies.

Used clothing and bedding, the import of which is not forbidden, according to the above-mentioned provisions of S. 24 of the Order of May 14th, 1900, may, however, only be imported from the above-mentioned places, after having been properly and carefully disinfected under control.

b. The provisions of Ss. 26-35 and 38, concerning plague in the above-mentioned Order of May 14th, 1900, shall not be put into effect.

c. The provisions of Ss. 2-10, relating to small-pox, in the Order of May 15th, 1900, shall be put in force as regards London.

This notification comes into force at once, and is hereby published for the general information.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of the following Notice issued by the Governor of Malta respecting quarantine:—

Government Notice. No. 58.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Council of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 20 of the 30th January, 1902, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz.:—

1. The importation is forbidden of:

(a.) Cattle (except horses, mules, and asses) from Egypt, the Province of Naples, Calabria and Salonica.

(b.) Wool, hides, skins, horns, bones, and hoofs from the above places and from countries where epidemic diseases are reported;

(c.) Cattle arriving from any place, if affected with any disease in view of which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, their admission into the Lazaretto might prove detrimental to other cattle already in the Island.

2. Cattle which may be allowed to be landed under the conditions hereinafter specified, and subject to their being kept isolated and under observation in such of the enclosures at the Lazaretto as may be assigned or approved for that purpose for the period hereinafter stated.

(a.) Cattle from the Black Sea except Odessa, from the Sea of Azov, Syria, and Prevesa (unless the importation is otherwise prohibited)—subjected to 3 months' observation;

(b.) Russian cattle from Odessa—subjected to one month's observation;

(c.) Cattle from Roumania, except swine (unless the importation is otherwise prohibited)—subjected to 3 months' observation;

(d.) Cattle from Morocco, and Sardinia (unless the importation is otherwise prohibited)—subjected to 15 days' observation;

(e.) Cattle from Sicily (unless the importation is otherwise prohibited)—subjected to 10 days' observation.

(f.) Cattle from the Regency of Tunis (unless the importation is otherwise prohibited)—subjected to 5 days' observation;

(g.) Cattle from Bengazi (unless the importation is otherwise prohibited)—subjected to 2 days' observation.

(h.) Horses, mules, and asses from Egypt, the Province of Naples, Calabria, Salonica and Turkey in Asia—subjected to 3 days' observation. Such horses, mules, and asses shall be released, after inspection at the Lazaretto, provided the owner undertakes to keep the animals in a place approved of by the Collector of Customs, and to cause them to be inspected by a Government Medical Officer or Veterinary Surgeon twice a week for 9 weeks.

The Cattle referred to in this paragraph shall not be allowed to be landed, unless the consignee shall have in each case and before shipment, made a written application, stating the approximate number of animals intended to be imported, and obtained the necessary permission after having agreed to abide by any regulations which may be established. Such application shall imply that the consignee has bound himself to abide by any regulations which may be in force on the day of importation, or which may be issued during the time in which the cattle may have to remain in quarantine, and also to pay the entrance fees, fees for guards, and other fees for ordinary or extraordinary expenses usually levied on cattle at the Lazaretto.

3. Swine.

(a.) Swine arriving from the Ports of Turkey and Greece, except those referred to in sections 1 and 2, and swine arriving from Roumania, will be subjected to 8 days' observation at the Lazaretto.

4. General Provisions.

All cattle intended for importation into these Islands must be accompanied by a certificate from the British Consular Authority, or, in default, of the local Government Authority of the places of origin and embarkation, stating that cattle disease has not been officially reported in those places during the three months previous to the date of embarkation.

The term cattle includes horses, mules, asses, animals of the bovine species, sheep, goats and swine.

5. Vessels with Cattle on Board.

(a.) Vessels arriving in this Island, having on board more than 250 head of cattle (bovine) are to go into the quarantine harbour, and the cattle are to be inspected in the cattle enclosures of the Lazaretto.

(b.) Vessels which have, or have had, on board animals suffering from any contagious or infectious disease shall be disinfected in such manner as the Superintendent of the Public Health Department may direct. Should such disinfection be objected to, the vessels will be subject to quarantine, pending disinfection, on their returning to the Malta Harbour.
