

### TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 24th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £2,720,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 30th instant.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 29th March, 1902, and will be payable at twelve months after date, viz.:—on the 29th March, 1903.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 25th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than one o'clock, on Saturday, the 29th instant.

### REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS AND DEATHS.

Order No. 22/1902.

NOTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance of the provisions of the twenty-first section of an Act passed in the thirty-eighth year of the reign of Her late Majesty, intituled "The Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874," I, Reginald MacLeod, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, have, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, ordered and declared that on and after the 1st day of April next, Tottenham Sub-District of Edmonton Registration District shall be subdivided into three separate Sub-Districts to be constituted as follows; (1) a Sub-District to be called and known as Wood Green Sub-District, to be co-extensive with Wood Green Civil Parish and Urban District as now constituted; (2) a Sub-District to be called and known as East Tottenham Sub-District to consist of the Lower, Middle, and High Cross Wards of Tottenham Civil Parish and Urban District, as determined by the Middlesex County Council Order, dated the
