

Playing Musical Instruments.

6. A passenger shall not while travelling in or upon any carriage sound or play upon any musical instrument.

Intoxicated Persons.

7. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and, if found in or upon any carriage may be immediately removed by or under the directions of the conductor.

Offensive Language, &c.

8. A person shall not swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Spitting.

9. A person shall not spit within or upon any carriage.

Damaging Carriages.

10. A person shall not wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number, plate, printed or other notice, or advertisement, in or on any carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to pay the amount of any damage done in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations.

Objectionable Persons.

11. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of the carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor might, for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter in or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from mounting any carriage, and shall not mount any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found upon any carriage, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage, upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned.

Payment of Fares.

12. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, the fare legally demandable for the journey. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his or her journey. A child under five years of age, who is sitting on the lap of a passenger, shall not be liable to pay a fare provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger. Any additional child irrespective of age, accompanying such person, shall pay the full ordinary fare.

Tickets.

13. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any), when required so to do, to the conductor, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket, or pay the fare legally demanded for the distance travelled over by such passenger. Tickets shall not be transferable, and shall only be available by the car on which they are issued.

Wrongful use of Workmen's Tickets.

14. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Wallasey Tramways and Improvements Act, 1899, or Incorporated Acts, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended only for artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

Luggage.

15. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers),

shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior, or on the roof of any carriage. The conductor may decline to take into or upon the carriage any luggage, which from its size or otherwise, is not, in the opinion of the conductor, suitable for conveyance in or upon the carriage.

Disabled Cars.

16. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid. A person shall not, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

Time of Journey.

17. The Council shall not be bound to complete any journey in any specific time.

Travelling by Cars proceeding to Sheds.

18. A person shall not travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed, and is not on its usual journey, unless permitted so to do by the conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable for the journey.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

19. A passenger or other person not being a servant of the Council employed in the tramway service, shall not travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage.

Interfering with Bells, Brakes, &c.

20. An unauthorized person travelling in or upon any carriage, shall not wilfully touch, or interfere, or meddle in any way with any bell, or brake, or any other appliance, machinery, or mechanism fixed to, connected with, or in anywise belonging to such carriage.

Passengers only to enter Cars, &c.

21. A person not being a passenger or intending passenger shall not enter or mount any carriage, and a person shall not hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein, otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

Entering full Carriages.

22. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is authorized to carry, an additional person, not being a servant of the Council employed in the tramway service, shall not enter, mount, or remain in, or on any such carriage, when warned by the conductor not to do so.

Mounting or Dismounting from Carriages in Motion.

23. A person shall not enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any carriage whilst it is in motion.

Excess of Passengers.

24. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

Passengers having Infectious Disease.

25. A person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall not mount, enter, or travel on any car, or attempt so to do, and a conductor shall not suffer or permit any such person so to do.

Dogs, &c.

26. A dog or any other animal shall not be allowed in or on any carriage. A person shall
