The Right Honourable Charles Thomson Ritchie, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, having caused the Commissioner of Police to prepare a plan for the access and regress of Carriages on the day of the Coronation of Their Majesties, and the Executive Committee for the purposes of Their Majesties' Coronation having submitted the same to this Committee, their Lordships are pleased to approve thereof and to authorize the Right Honourable C. T. Ritchie to take all such measures as shall be necessary for carrying the said plan (of which a copy is hereunto annexed) into effect, and also for securing the passage of the carriages in the several routes therein set forth, and he is further authorized to make such alterations in the said plan as he may deem necessary and proper.

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED ON THE DAY OF THE CORONATION.

1. In pursuance of an Order of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, the following instructions have been framed for securing the commodious access and return of carriages conveying persons to and from Westminster Abbey, on the occasion of His Majesty's Coronation.

2. In conformity with these instructions, the necessary directions have been given to all His Majesty's Officers and Servants concerned, and to the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis

for carrying them into execution.

3. The entrances of Westminster Abbey will be opened at 6.30 o'clock in the morning. The gates of Hyde Park will also be opened for carriages at the same hour.

4. The gates of St. James's Park, except Storey's Gate, will be closed against all carriages

other than those of His Majesty The King and of Members of the Royal Family until after His

of Members of the Royal Family until after His Majesty has returned to Buckingham Palace.

5. His Majesty The King will proceed in State from Buckingham Palace by way of The Mall, St. James's Park, the Horse Guards' Parade, Whitehall, Parliament - street, and Broad Sanctuary, to the west entrance of Westminster Abbey, returning after the ceremony by Parliament-square, St. Margaret's-street, Parliament-street, Whitehall, Charing Cross, Cockspur-street, Pall Mall, St. James's-street, Piccadilly, Hyde Park-corner, and Constitution Hill to Buckingham Park-corner, and Constitution Hill to Buckingham Palace.

6. The Royal Procession will leave Buckingham Palace at 10.30 A.M. precisely.

7. The whole line of route to and from Westminster Abbey will be kept exclusively for the free passage of His Majesty The King and the Royal Procession from 8.30 A.M. until such time as His Majesty shall have returned to Buckingham Palace after the Coronation.

8. The Royal Procession will form up at 9.45.

DETAIL OF REGULATIONS FOR CARRIAGES. I. First Route.—To the West Entrance of Vestminster Abbey.

The carriages of persons who have tickets for the West Entrance will proceed by Knightsbridge, Wilton-place, Wilton-crescent, Belgrave-square, Upper Belgrave-street, Hobart-place, Grosvenorgardens, and Victoria-street (off side), or by Buckingham Palace-road and Victoria-street, setting down at the entrance to the Pavilion at the west door. They will draw off by way of Tothill-street and Westminster Broadway, and wait in Great Chapel-street, James-street, Palacestreet, and vicinity. These carriages will take up the reverse way, and return by the route by which they came.

II. Second Route.—Dean's-yard and Cloisters. The carriages of persons who have tickets for the entrances in Dean's-yard and the Cloisters will approach by the route laid down for the west door of the Abbey, turn into Dean's-yard, set down and draw off into Tufton-street, waiting in Orchard-street, Great Peter-street, Marsham-street, and vicinity. They will take up the reverse way, and return by the route by which they came.

III. Third Route.—To the North Entrance of

Westminster Abbey.

The carriages of persons having tickets for the North Door and for the entrances to the Nave and Galleries from St. Margaret's Churchyard, may enter the Royal line of route at Hamilton-place or Park-lane, Piccadilly (top of St. James's-street), the Haymarket, and at Charing Cross, proceeding thence by Whitehall, Parliament-street, and St. Margaret's-street, to the North Door, where they will set down. They will draw off by way of Little George-street, Parliament - square, and Great George-street, and wait in Birdcage Walk and Wellington Barracks Parade Ground. They will take up the reverse way and return by the route by which they came.

IV. Fourth Route.—To Poets' Corner entrance. The carriages of persons having tickets for the Poets' Corner entrance will proceed by Knightsbridge, Wilton-place, Belgrave-square, Eccleston-street, Belgrave-road, Warwick-street, Rochester-row, Vincent-square, Page-street, Millbank-street, and Abingdon-street, to Poets' Corner; or by Grosvenor-road and Abingdon-street to Poets' Corner, where they will turn round, set down, and draw off by Great College-street, waiting in Smith-square, Romney-street, Horse-ferry-road, and vicinity. Carriages may also approach this entrance by Whitchall (as for the North Door). They will take up the reverse way and return by the route by which they came.

V. Carriages with company for Westminster Abbey coming from places South of the River Thames will approach as follows:—

For West Door and Dean's Yard.—By Vaux-hall Bridge, Vauxhall Bridge-road, and Victoria-street.

For North Door.—By Waterloo Bridge, the Strand, Charing Cross, and Whitehall.

For Poets' Corner.—By Lambeth Bridge and Millbank-street.

VI. The routes to be followed by carriages to the Abbey are printed on the carriage tickets, and, should they not be adhered to, the carriages concerned are liable to be stopped and diverted from the line of approach at the nearest point.

VII. Peers, Pecresses, and other persons invited to Westminster Abbey, who reside within the barriers on the line of route will pass by the direct line from their residences to the West and other entrances.

VIII. The doors of Westminster Abbey will be opened at 6.30 A.M. and will be closed at 9 A M., and no carriage will be permitted to enter the line of route, or any of the lines of approach after 8.30 A.M.

IX. Barriers will be erected across the following streets:—Grosvenor-place, Grosvenor-crescent, St. George's-place, Hamilton-place, Parklane, Down-street, Brick-street, Whitchorsestreet, Half Moon-street, Clarges-street, Bolton-street, Berkeley-street, Dover-street, Albemarle-street, Old Bond-street, Piccadilly (west of Old Bond-street), Jermyn-street, Ryder-street, Kingstreet, Little St. James's-street, Clovelaud-row, George-street, John-street St. James's-square, Waterloo-place, The Haymarket, Suffolk-street, Whitcombe-street, St. Martin's-place, Great Scotland-yard, Whitehall-place, Horse Guards-avenue, Bridge-street Westminster, Millbank-street, Great College-street, Great Smith-street, Victoria-street, Tothill-street, Princes-street.

He then went to the assistance of a wounded Officer, and, whilst trying to place him in a comfortable position, was shot three times, but would not give in till he rolled over thoroughly exhausted. All the eight men at this point were wounded, and while they were lying on the Veldt, Surgeon-Captain Martin-Leake refused water till every one else had been served.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

Buckinghamshire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Stoke and Burnham, and the parishes of Hughenden, West Wycombe, Chepping Wycombe Rural, Little Marlow, Wooburn, and Hedsor, in the administrative county of Buckingham; and also comprising the borough of Chepping Wycombe (6 September, 1900).

Essex.—An Area comprising the petty sessional division of Rochford, and the parishes of Downham, Ramsden Bellhouse, Ramsden Crays,

Great Burstead, Little Burstead, Laindon, Lee Chapel, Basildon, Vange, Nevendon, Wickford, North Benfleet, Pitsea, and Bowers Gifford, in the administrative county of Essex; and also comprising the borough of Southend-on-Sea (2 November, 1901).

Gloucestershire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Whitminster, Stroud (except the parish of Cranham), Nailsworth, and Dursley, and the parishes of Harescombe and Cherrington, in the administrative county of Gloucester (5 March, 1902).

Hertfordshire and Middlesex.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Edmonton, South Mimms, and Highgate, in the administrative county of Middlesex; and also comprising the petty sessional division of Barnet, and the parish of Aldenham (excluding the detached part thereof), in the administrative county of Hertford (24 February, 1902).
