

accordance with the requirements of any occurrences which may have happened on board during the voyage.

5th. That ten days' quarantine from the date of the last case be imposed on any ship that has had cases, or may arrive with cases of plague on board.

6th. That flour arriving from Argentine ports may be received when packed in barrels.

7th. That only wheat in bulk which has been shipped at ports in the Provinces of Santa Fé, Corrientes and Entre Rios, situated on the Paraná to the north of Colastiné inclusive, shall be allowed to enter.

8th. That facilities for operating in quarantine may be afforded to ships arriving from infected or suspected ports.
