For the purposes of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1890, and all Provisional Orders and Licences made and issued thereunder, the Board of Trade approve of the pattern and construction of the meter for the measurement of electrical quantity, when supplied on the constant potential continuous current system, hereinafter described, viz.:—the meter, No. 9910, deposited at the Board of Trade, on the 15th day of April, 1902, by Chamberlain and Hookham Limited, of 4, New Bartholomew-street, Birmingham, and sealed by the Board of Trade and known as the Hookham Meter.

The Board of Trade further approve of the following manner of fixing meters of this description, and of connecting them with the service lines :-

The meter is to be fixed by screws to a hori-

zontal support.

In connecting the meter with the service lines one service line is to be cut and the ends bared of insulation at the cut for about one inch, the insulation being cut straight across. The outside of the insulating material is to be made to fit closely the hole through which the line is passed to the terminal, indiarubber tape or other insulating material being wound on to the requisite thickness if necessary.

The connection is to be made so that the current is passed through the meter in the right direction, viz. :- from the terminal marked + to the terminal marked -; the conductors are to be tightly clamped in their terminals: the insulation between each conductor and the case is to be good; and the ends of the conductors are not to

project beyond the tops of the terminal boxes.

Stolpmünde, Rugenwaldermünde, Kolbergermünde— Lights.

The German Government has given notice, dated 3rd May, 1902, that it is intended during the spring to make the following alterations in the lights at Stolpmünde, Rugenwaldermünde, and Kolbergermünde.

At each of the above ports the eastern mole heads will show a red fixed light, and the western mole heads a green fixed light, each light being elevated 26 feet above the sea, and visible from a distance of 6 miles. These lights will burn day and night, and are presumably unwatched.

At the same time the red fixed lights now exhibited at these ports will be altered to white occulting lights:-

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool with respect to Tramways and portions of Tramways for the time being belonging to and worked by them.

The Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool, in the County Palatine of Lancaster (hereinafter called "the Corporation" under the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Blackpool Improve-ment Act, 1896, do hereby, as promoters and owners of the Blackpool Corporation Tramways, make the following Bye-laws and Regulations with respect to the tramways and portions of tramways for the time being belonging to and worked by the Corporation.

For preventing the commission of any nuisance in or upon any carriage, or in or against any premises belonging to them.

For regulating the travelling in or upon any carriage belonging to them.

Extent of Bye-laws.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Corporation on any Corporation Tramway for the time being, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

Passengers getting on and off.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

Smoking.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any carriage or on either platform thereof.

Musical Instruments.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Intoxicated or Infected Persons.

5. A person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any infectious or contagious disease shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Committing Nuisance.

6. No person shall swear or use any obscene, Brighton and South Coast Railway and Railways I indecent, or offensive language whilst entering

or mounting or whilst in or upon any carriage, or expectorate or commit any nuisance in or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Wilful Damage.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, or linings of any carriage, or remove or deface any number. plate, printed, painted, or other notice or writing, or any advertisement in or on any carriage, or mark, break, or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage, or (unless a servant of the Corporation) touch, handle, or interfere with any machine apparatus, or appliance in, under, upon, or about any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Byelaws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Offensive Clothing, &c.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the seats, linings, or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter, mount, or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from entering, mounting, or remaining in or upon any carriage, and shall not enter, mount, or be or remain in or upon any carriage or any part thereof, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any carriage, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Fares.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation, the fare legally demandable for the journey or under such regulations as to tickets, or checks, or payment into a money box, or other system as the Corporation, with the approval of the Board of Trade, may from time to time determine.

Production of Tickets.

10. Each person shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly anthorized servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do by any servant of the Corporation, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Artizans' Special Carriage.

11. A passenger not being an artizan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament or Provisional Orders relating to the tramways and portions of tramways for the time being belonging to and worked by the Co poration, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket or any special carriage intended only for such artizans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

Luggage.

12. Every person about to enter or mount any carriage or being a passenger, and in either case having any luggage (including the tools of artizans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, place such luggage on the front or driver's platform, or on the rear or conductor's platform, or in a compartment specially set apart for the conveyance of parcels, and not elsewhere on any carriage. The conductor may decline to take into or upon any carriage any luggage which from its size or otherwise is not suitable for conveyance in or upon such carriage.

Standing on Steps of Platform.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall be permitted to travel on the steps, footboards, or platforms of any carriage, or to stand either on the roof or in the interior, or to sit on any rail, or any part of any carriage not intended for passengers, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

Travelling not on Seat.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, or an authorized servant of the Corporation, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

Full Number of Passengers.

15. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which may lawfully be conveyed thereby, no additional person shall euter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage, when warned by the conductor not to do

Notice thereof.

16. When a carriage contains the full number of passengers which may lawfully be conveyed thereby, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

Prevention of Overcrowding.

17. The conductor shall not permit any passenger or intended passenger beyond the authorized number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of any carriage.

Entering and Leaving Carriages in Motion.

18. No person shall enter, mount, hang on, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, hang on, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.

Dogs or other Animals.

19. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed . by or under the direction of the conductor.

Fire-arms or Offensive Articles.

20. No person shall enter, mount, or haig on any carriage, or travel in or on any carriage with loaded fire-arms, or with any article or thing which may in the opinion of the conductor be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

Obstructing Servants or Passengers.

21. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any tramway or carriage of the Corporation or upon or in any of the shelters, works, or pre-mises connected with the said tramways and portions of tramways, and no person shall wilfully obstruct or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, or endanger the safety of any person entering, mounting, leaving, or travelling on any carriage of the Corporation.

Enforcing the Law. 22. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent a breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

Penalty.

23. Any person offending against or committing a breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations

shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Conductor.

24. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Corporation and having charge of a carriage.

Copy Bye-laws.

25. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use and in every office, shelter, and waiting room of the Corporation a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

Repeal of former Bye-laws.

26. All former Bye-laws and Regulations (including the Bye-laws and Regulations made on the 2nd day of April, 1889, and the 5th day of June, 1899) made by the Corporation as Promoters or by the Promoters and lessees of any tramway now forming portion of the system known as "The-Blackpool Corporation Tramways," by virtue and in pursuance of the provisions of the said 46th section of the Tramways Act, 1870, or by virtue and in pursuance of the provisions of any special Act authorizing any tramway forming portion of the said Blackpool Corporation Tramways, including the Blackpool Corporation Tramways Order, 1884, confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act. 1884, are hereby repealed, as from the date of these Bye-laws and Regulations coming into force.

Date of Operation.

27. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of August, 1902.

BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, acting by the Council as the Local Authority in this behalf, did on the fifth day of May, 1902, make the following Bye-laws and Regulations:—

Borough of Blackpool.

Bye-Laws and Regulations made by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool, as the Local Authority under the powers conferred upon them by Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

The Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, hereinafter referred to as "the Council," being the Local Authority of the district of the said borough, under "The Tramways Act, 1870," do hereby, by virtue and in pursuance of the provisions of the 46th section of the said Act, make the following Bye-laws and Regulations with respect to:—

(a.) The rate of speed to be observed in travelling upon the tramways laid or to be laid

- within the said borough (hereinafter referred to as "the tramways").
- (b.) The distances at which carriages using the tramways shall be allowed to follow one after the other.
- (c.) The stopping of carriages using the tramways.
- (d.) The traffic on the road in which the tramways are laid,

to be observed by all Tramway Companies, Corporations, and persons running carriages on any of the tramways laid or to be laid within the said borough.

Definitions.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any carriage using any tramway within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

Speed of Cars.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven or propelled along the tramways at a speed which shall not exceed the rate of eight miles an hour.

Distance from other Cars.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than twenty yards.

Stations or Stopping Places.

4. No car using a tramway in any street in which the Council shall have appointed stations or stopping places for the taking up and setting down of passengers shall be stopped except at such stations or stopping places as aforesaid, or at a passing place or terminus for the taking up and setting down of passengers unless when necessary to preserve the distance required by Bye-law No. 3, or when required by any police officer having the direction of street traffic in any street. Every driver or conductor who shall wilfully disregard or not conform himself to the regulations as to stations or stopping places as aforesaid for the time being in force shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these Bye-laws.

Stopping for Passengers in Streets where no Stations or Stopping Places have been appointed.

5. In such streets as the Council shall not for the time being have appointed such stations or stopping places as aforesaid, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the car for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car for whom there is room and to whose admission no valid objection can be made; provided that nothing in this Byelaw shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steep-r than 1 in 25.

Cars not to be stopped at intersection of Streets nor within Ten Yards of Car on Adjoining Line.

6. Except at a passing place, station, or stopping place as aforesaid, or terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, or within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

Driver to Warn Person in charge of Obstructing Vehicle.

7. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the street so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

Impeding Traffic.

8. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on a tramway, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary traffic in the street.

Penalty.

9. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

Repeal of former Bye-laws.

10. All former Bye-laws and Regulations, including the Bye-laws and Regulations made on the 4th day of May, 1886, the 2nd day of June, 1896, and the 7th day of July, 1896, respectively

made by the Council as the Local Authority by virtue and in pursuance of the provisions of the said 46th section of the Tramways Act, 1870, or by virtue and in pursuance of the provisions of any special Act authorizing any tramway within the said borough (including the Blackpool Corporation Tramways Order, 1894, confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1884, and the Blackpool Corporation Tramways Order, 1893, confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation Act, 1893) are hereby repealed as from the date of these Bye-laws and Regulations coming into force.

Date of Operation.

11. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and two.

THE following Areas are now Areas Infected with Swine-Fever under the above-mentioned Acts:

Berkshire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Wantage, Ilsley, Lambourn, Newbury (including the detached part thereof), Reading and Wokingham, the parishes of East Shefford and West Shefford, and the borough of Wokingham, in the administrative county of Berks; and also comprising the boroughs of Newbury and Reading (9 May, 1902).

Buckinghamshire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Stoke and Burnham, and the parishes of Hughenden, West Wycombe, Chepping Wycombe Rural, Little Marlow, Wooburn, and Hedsor, in the administrative county of Buckingham; and also comprising the borough of Chepping Wycombe (6 September, 1900).

Cornwall.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Kerrier East (except the parishes of Constantine and Mawnan), Powder South, and Powder West, the parishes of Redruth and Illogan, and the boroughs of Penryn and Falmouth, in the administrative county of Cornwall; and also comprising the city of Truro (20 May, 1902).

Essex.—An Area comprising the petty sessional division of Rochford, and the parishes of Downham, Ramsden Bellhouse, Ramsden Crays, Great Burstead, Little Burstead, Laindon, Lee Chapel, Basildon, Vange, Nevendon, Wickford, North Benfleet, Pitsea, and Bowers Gifford, in the administrative county of Essex; and also comprising the borough of Southend-on-Sea (2 November, 1901).

Gloucestershire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Whitminster, Stroud (except the parish of Cranham), Nailsworth, and Dursley, and the parishes of Harescombe and Cherrington, in the administrative county of Gloucester (5 March, 1902).

Hertfordshire and Middlesex.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Edmonton, South Mimms, and Highgate, in the administrative county of Middlesex; and also comprising the petty sessional division of Barnet, and the parish of Aldenham (excluding the detached part thereof), in the administrative county of Hertford (24 February, 1902).

Isle of Wight.—An Area comprising the administrative county of the Isle of Wight, including the boroughs of Newport and Ryde (24 January, 1902).

Lincolnshire.—An Area comprising the borough of Grimsby (20 May, 1902).

Middlesex.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Uxbridge and Brentford, in the administrative county of Middlesex; and also comprising the borough of Ealing (22 January, 1902).

See also under Hertfordshire and Middlesex.

Oxfordshire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Bampton East, Wootton South (including the two detached parts thereof lying to the north of the city of Oxford, in the petty sessional division of Bullingdon) and Bullingdon (including the parishes of Hampton Gay and Hampton Poyle, but excluding the parishes of Tetsworth, Atlington, Thame, and Kingsey), and the borough of Woodstock, in the administrative county of Oxford; and also comprising the city of Oxford (18 February, 1902).

Staffordshire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Rushall and Handsworth, in the administrative county of Stafford; and also comprising the boroughs of Walsall, Wednesbury, West Bromwich, and Smethwick (29 August, 1901).

Surrey.—An Area comprising the administrative county of Surrey, including the boroughs of Guildford, Kingston-upon-Thames, Reigate, Richmond, and Godalming; and also comprising the borough of Croydon (3 March, 1902).

Sussex.—An Area comprising the petty sessional

divisions of Battle (except the parish of Ewhurst), and Hastings (including the two detached parts thereof, namely, the parish of Bexhill and a part of the parish of Hollington Rural, which was formerly known as the parish of Saint Matthew), in the administrative county of East Sussex; and also comprising the borough of Hastings, including the Liberty of the Sluice, but excluding the Cinque Port liberty of Hastings detached, known as Petit Iham, to the north of Winchelsea (7 March, 1902).

Wiltshire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Swindon, Malmesbury, Cricklade, Calne, Chippenham, Bradford, Melksham, Trowbridge, Westbury, Whorwelsdown, Warminster, and Tisbury and Mere, the parishes of Poulshot, Rowde, Potterne, Roundway, Bromham, and Chittoe, and the boroughs of Malmesbury, Calne, Chippenham, and Devizes, in the administrative county of Wilts; and also comprising the borough of Swindon (6 July, 1901).

Vorkshire.—(1.) An Area comprising the parishes of Sprotbrough, Balby-with-Hexthorpe, Loversall, Warmsworth, Cadeby, Mexborough, Denaby, Conisbrough, Braithwell, Edlington, Stainton, Wadworth, and Tickhill, in the administrative county of the West Riding of the county of York (30 November, 1901).
