FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT; 1901.

SUFFOLK AUDIT DISTRICT. Guilteross Rural District.

To Mark William Dixon, Barrister-at-Law, District Auditor;—

To the Rural District Council of Guiltcross;—And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 31st day of January, 1902, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of Mark William Dixon as a District Auditor, and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which in the said Order was termed "The Suffolk Audit District";

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said Mark William Dixon to audit the Accounts of the said Rural District Council, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article II of the above-cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the area within which the powers, authorities, and jurisdiction of the said Rural District Council may be exercised shall be deemed to be within the said Suffolk Audit District.

To all to whom these presents shall come, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England send greeting:
WHEREAS a new church has been built within the parish of Marske in Cleveland, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York, and has been consecrated and dedicated to Saint Mark.

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Dalrymple, Archbishop of York as Diocesan, the Most Honourable Lawrence Marquess of Zetland, Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle as the patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Marske in Cleveland, and the Reverend Francis Grant James, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage, have, by an instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the fifth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and two, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said parish of Marske in Cleveland that the said new church of Saint Mark, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (dedicated to Saint Germain) of the same parish.
