FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT; 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under section 116 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, extending the provisions of that section (Particulars) to (1) factories and workshops in which the making of cart gear is carried on, and (2) outworkers employed in the making of iron and steel cables and chains, iron and steel anchors and grapuels, cart gear, and locks, latches, and keys.
