A DESPATCH from Field-Marshal Earl Roberts, K.G., G.C.B., V.C., &c., to the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for War, War Office, London, W. :—

London,
1st March, 1902.

SIR,

IN continuation of my Despatch, dated London, 4th September, 1901, in which I brought to your notice, in a very comprehensive and representative list, the services rendered by the various arms and departments of the Army in South Africa, during the time I was in chief command in that country, up to 29th November, 1900, I now have the honour to submit the following additional names of Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, Men, Nurses, and Civilians who also have rendered meritorious service, but the investigation of whose cases for special mention was not sufficiently advanced to admit of their claims being considered in time for inclusion in my former Despatch.

Delay in completing the list has partly been caused by the pressure of current work at the War Office, as well as by the necessity for repeated references to South Africa, in connection with some of the cases under consideration. Apart from these reasons, however, I thought it desirable to allow such a period to elapse before forwarding my final recommendations, as would enable me to receive representations from General and Commanding Officers in the field on behalf of those whose names might have been overlooked in my previous Despatches, and whose services were deemed worthy of recognition.
