In conclusion, I desire to place on record that in April, 1900, Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was graciously pleased to send me four woollen scarves, worked by Herself, for distribution to the four most distinguished private soldiers in the Colonial Forces of Canada, Australia, New Zealand, and South Africa, then serving under my command.

The selection for these gifts of honour was made by the officers commanding the contingents concerned, it being understood that gallant conduct in the field was to be considered the primary qualification.
