The KING taking into his Royal consideration that upon the decease of William Thomas Spencer, Earl Fitzwilliam, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, which happened on the twentieth day of February last, the title and dignity of Earl Fitzwilliam devolved upon William Charles De Meuron, now Earl Fitzwilliam, as the only son and heir of William Wentworth Fitzwilliam, commonly called Viscount Milton, who whilst living was eldest son and heir apparent to the said William

Thomas Spencer, Earl Fitzwilliam, and that accord-
 ing to the ordinary rules of honour the sisters of
 the said William Charles De Meuron, now Earl
 Fitzwilliam, cannot enjoy that place and prece-
 dence which would have been due to them had
 their said father survived his father the said
 William Thomas Spencer, Earl Fitzwilliam, and
 thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl
 Fitzwilliam, his Majesty has been pleased to
 ordain and declare that Laura Mary, the wife of
 Captain George Sholto Douglas, late the Camero-
 nians (Scottish Rifles), Mabel Florence Harriet,
 the wife of William Mackenzie Smith, Esq., and
 Theresa Evelyn Vilunza Wentworth-Fitzwilliam,
 Spinster, the only sisters of the said William
 Charles De Meuron, now Earl Fitzwilliam, shall
 henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title,
 place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if their
 late father had succeeded to the title and dignity
 of Earl Fitzwilliam:

And to command that the said Royal order and
 declaration be registered in His Majesty's College
 of Arms.
