W IIEREAS by Section 1 of "The Pharmacy Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or keep open shop for retailing, dispensing, or compounding poisons, or to assume or use the title "Chemist and Druggist," or Chemist or Druggist, or Pharmacist, or Dispensing Chemist or Druggist, in any part of "Great Britain," unless such person shall be a Pharmaceutical Chemist, or a Chemist aud Druggist within the meaning of that Act, and be registered under that Act, and conform to such regulations as to the keeping, dispensing, and selling of such poisons as may from time to time be prescribed by the Pharmaceutical Society with the consent of the Privy Council :

And whereas the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain did, on the 11th day of January, 1899, adopt certain regulations for the keeping, dispensing, and selling of poisons within the meaning of "The Pharmacy Act, 1868," in accordance with the provisions set forth in Section 1 of that Act:

And whereas the said regulations received the consent of the Lords of the Council on the 31st day of January, 1899:

And whereas the Pharmaceutical Society did, on the 28th day of May, 1902, resolve that Clause 3 of the regulations be amended by the deletion of the word "and" preceding the word "lotions," and that the words "and liquid disinfectants" be added immediately after the word "lotions":

And whereas the said Society has submitted the said resolution for the consent of the Privy Council.

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council are hereby pleased to signify their consent to the said amendment, and to consent to the said regulations so amended (copy whereof is hereunto annexed). *A. W. FitzRoy.* Regulations referred to in the foregoing Order. "1. That in the keeping of poisons, each bottle, vessel, box, or package containing a poison be labelled with the name of the article, and also with some distinctive mark indicating that it contains poison.

"2. Also that in the keeping of poisons, each poison be kept on one or other of the following systems, viz. :---

"(a.) In a bottle or vessel tied over, capped, locked, or otherwise secured in a manner different from that in which bottles or vessels containing ordinary articles are secured in the same warehouse, shop, or dispensary; or

same warehouse, shop, or dispensary; or "(b.) In a bottle or vessel rendered distinguishable by touch from the bottles or vessels in which ordinary articles are kept in the same warehouse, shop, or dispensary; or

"(c.) In a bottle, vessel, box, or package kept in a room or cupboard set apart for daugerous articles.

gerous articles. "3. That in the dispensing and selling of poisons, all liniments, embrocations, lotions and liquid disinfectants, containing poison be sent out in bottles rendered distinguishable by touch from ordinary medicine bottles, and that there also be affixed to each such bottle (in addition to the name of the article, and to any particular instructions for its use) a label giving notice that the contents of the bottle are not to be taken internally."

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (City of Sheffield) Order, 1902. Dated 3rd July, 1902.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the Council of the City of Sheffield, I hereby make the following Order :-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (City of Sheffield) Order, 1902."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is probibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Sheffield so as to be between the last day of February and the 12th day of August in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Sheffield to the follow-ing species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:

Song Thrush, Redstart, Whitetbroat, Garden Warbler, Chiff Chaff, Willow Warbler, Wood

Warbler, Longtailed Tit, Great Tit. Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Marsh Tit, Crested Tit, Nuthatch, Tree-creeper, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Redbacked Shrike, Woodchat, Spotted Flycatcher, Pied Flycatcher, Swallow, House Martin, Sand Martin, Greenfinch, (haffinch, Crossbill, Yellowhammer, Cirl Bunting, White Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Swift, Marsh Harrier, Hobby, Osprey, Turtle Dove, Moor Hen.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 11th day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Sheffield :---

Missel Thrush, Ring Ouzel, Stonechat, Robin, Nightingale, Hedge Sparrow, Black Cap, Golden Crested Wren, Longtailed Tit, Great Tit, Blue Crested Wren, Longtaneu III, Gront III, Treecreepe., Tit, Coal Tit, Marsh Tit, Crested Tit, Treecreepe., Wren, Dipper, White Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Tree Pipit, Meadow Pipit, Skylark, Woodlark, Swift, Wren, Dipper, Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtau, 1100 A. All Birds protected on Sundays.

V. During the period between the 11th day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Sheffield.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the Year.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Sheffield : -

Song Thrush, Blackbird, Ring Ouzel, Wheatear, Whinchat, Redstart, Robin, Nightingale, White-throat, Lesser Whitethroat, Garden Warbler, Blackcap, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Grass-hopper Warbler, Chiff Chaff, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Common Sand Piper, Redshank, Longtailed Tit, Great Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Marsh Tit, Crested Tit, Nuthatch, Dipper, Spotted Flycatcher, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Linnet, Crossbill, Cirl Bunting, Grey Wagtail, Skylark, Woodlark, Nightjar, Curlew, Great Crested Grebe, Kingfisher, White Owl, Longeared Owl, Shorteared Owl, Tawny Owl, Marsh Harrier, Hen Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Kestrel, Osprey, Common Heron Wild Duck Landmil Osprey, Common Heron, Wild Duck, Landrail, Spotted Crake, Golden Plover, Woodcock, Common Snipe, Little Grebe.

Arrête :

ART. Ier. La ville de Majunga est placée sous le régime de la patente brute.

ART. II. Un cordon sanitaire est établi autour de la ville dans les limites suivantes : Le cordon sanitaire partira du bord de la mer près de l'abattoir, suivra la ligne de séparation créée à Mahabibo, où sont établis le lazaret d'observation et l'hôpital spécial, se dirigera sur Monaco et, de là, à la mer.

ART. III. Les personnes et les marchandises ne pourront franchir le cordon sauitaire que dans les conditions fixées par les instructions annexées au présent arrêté.

Les contrevenants seront poursuivis conformément aux dispositions de la loi du 3 avril 1822 et du décret du 31 avril 1897.

ART. IV. MM. le Secrétaire Général, le Procureur Général, le directeur du service de santé, l'administrateur-maire de Majunga et les autorités sanitaires sont chargés, chacun en ce qui le l délivré par le médecin chargé de ce service.

Instructions

annexées à l'arrêté du 26 mai 1902, sur les mesures à prendre à l'occasion de l'épidémie de peste à Majunga.

I° MESURES POUR L'EXTÉRIEUR.

Patente. 1° La ville de Majunga est mise sous

le régime de la patente brute. Voyageurs. 2° Les personnes désirant quitter Majunga par la voie de mer seront soumises à une observation de cinq jours au lazaret de Katsepe; leurs vêtements et bagages devront être désinfectés. En cas de peste, leur départ ne pourra avoir lieu que quinze jours au moins après leur guérison (art. 42 du décret du 31 mars 1897).

Un passeport leur sera délivré par les soins de l'agent principal de la santé. Marchandises. 3° Les marchandises suscepti-

bles ne pouvant être désinfectées seront prohibées, les autres devront être embarquées après désinfection pratiquée sous la surveillance d'un médecin, soit au lazaret, soit au wharf. Dans ce cas, un certificat de désinfection, signé par le médecin, devra toujours les accompagner.

Navires. 4° Les navires qui auront communiqué avec Majunga seront admis dans les ports à lazaret de l'Île après une quarantaine de cinq jours et après désinfection; les voyageurs et les marchandises seront débarqués au lazaret pour y subir la désinfection.

Dans les autres ports, ils ne pourront être reçus sans un certificat de l'agent principal de la santé à Tamatave, attestant qu'avant leur départ ils ont purgé cinq jours de quarantaine et que toutes les marchandises ont été désinfectées. Si aucun cas de maladie contagieuse ne s'est manifesté à bord, ils auront la libre pratique sans avoir de nouvelle quarantaine à subir.

II° MESURES POUR L'INTÉRIEUR. Cordon sanitaire. Un cordon sanitaire est établi à Majunga dans les limites suivantes : Le cordon sanitaire partira du bord de la mer près de l'abattoir, suivra la ligne de séparation créée à Mahabibo, où sont établis le lazaret d'observation et l'hôpital spécial, se dirigera sur Monaco, puis vers la mer.

Voyageurs munis de passeport. Les voyageurs désirant se rendre dans l'intérieur devront séjourner pendant cinq jours au lazaret de Monaco, où leurs effets et bagages seront désinfectés. Ils ne devront apporter que les vêtements absolument nécessaires au voyage, lesquels seront désinféctes par immersion dans une solution antiseptique

concentrée et par exposition au soleil. Si un cas de peste se déclarait au lazaret, le départ du malade ne pourrait avoir lieu que quinze jours au plus tôt après sa guérison.

Un passeport sanitaire sera délivré par le médecin du lazaret, ainsi qu'un certificat de désinfection Ce passeport devra être pour les bagages. soumis au visa du médecin de Maevatanana, puis, sur la ligne d'étapes, au visa du chef de poste de surveillance d'Andriba-

Bagages. 3° Les marchandises suceptibles ne pouvant être désiufectées seront prohibées; les marchandises provenant des magasins de Majunga ne pourront franchir le cordon qu'après désinfection à l'un des lazarets et sur le vu d'un certificat

Les colis n'ayant fait que transiter à Majunga seront admis à franchir le cordon aprés simple désinfection extérieure, à condition qu'ils soient 1 evêt 18 d'une enveloppe suffisante.

Voyageurs non munis de passeport. Les voyageurs ou les bourjanes provenant de la zone contaminée et non munis de passeport seront sonmis à une quarantaine de rigueur de 12 jours.

Les bagages ou marchandises non accompagnés de certificat de désinfection seront désinfectés si cette opération est possible et s'ils ne rentrent pas dans la catégorie des matières susceptibles; dans le cas contraire, ils seront brùlés.

A l'entrés de Tananarive, une surveillance rigoureuse sera exercée par le service de la police sur les bourjanes et convois quelconques provenant de la région de Majunga.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of the following Memorandum from the Colonial Secretary at Gibraltar with respect to quarantine against arrivals at that place :

The practice at Gibraltar is to regard all vessels arriving from ports infected with plague, yellow fever or cholera, as "foul," and not to admit them to free pratique unless they have been more than 12 days out in the case of vessels from plagueinfected port and more than ten days out in the case of vessels from ports infected with yellow fever or cholera, have had no case of plague, yellow fever or cholera during the voyage and have good health on board on arrival. Vessels have good health on board on arrival. and their cargo are subject to such measures of disinfection as the medical authorities of the port may consider necessary; and those vessels which do not carry a doctor are also subject to medical visit.

Ports infected as aforesaid are not considered clean until they have been officially declared so by the Spanish authorities, when all restrictions are removed and arrivals are admitted to free pratique; but vessels which left an infected port before it was declared clean would not be so admitted until after the expiration of the periods above mentioned from the date of their departure from such port.

Vessels having on board cases of infectious disease, other than those before mentioned, are not subjected to any quarantine restrictions, but when necessary, such cases are landed in quaran-


