WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (City and County of Bristol) Order, 1902.

Dated 5th July, 1902.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the Council of the City and County of Bristol, I hereby make the following Order:—

TITLE.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (City and County of Bristol) Order, 1902."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended, so far as concerns the City and County of Bristol, so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the City and County of Bristol to the following species of Wild Birds as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Buzzard, Chaffinch, Hobby, Honey Buzzard, Kestrel, Magpie, Martins, Merlin, Osprey, Shrikes, Swallow, Swift, and Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of February following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the City and County of Bristol:—

Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Blackbird, Black Cap, Blue Tit, Buntings, Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiff Chaff, Cole Tit, Coot, Cuckoo, Flycatchers, Garden Warbler, Golden-crested Wren, Goldfinch, Great Tit, Gulls, Hedge Sparrow (or Dunnock), Hobby, Honey Buzzard, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Landrail (or Corncrake), Lark, Lesser White Throat, Linnet, Longtailed Tit, Magpie, Martins, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owls, Redstart, Reed Warbler, Robin (or Redbreast), Sedge Warbler, Shrikes, Starling, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Thrushes, Wagtails, Wheatear, Whinchat, White Throat, Willow Warbler, Woodpeckers, Wood Warbler, Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

All Birds protected on Sundays.

V. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of February following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the City and County of Bristol.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the City and County of Bristol.

VI. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the City and County of Bristol:—

Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Blackbird, Black Cap, Blue Tit, Buntings, Buzzard, Chiff Chaff, Cole Tit, Coot, Cuckoo, Flycatchers, Garden Warbler, Golden-crested Wren, Goldfinch, Great Tit, Hawfinch, Hedge Sparrow (or Dunnock), Hobby, Honey Buzzard, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Landrail (or Corncrake), Lesser White Throat, Lark, Linnet, Longtailed Tit, Magpie, Martins, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owls, Plover (Lapwing or Peewit), Redstart, Reed Warbler, Robin (or Redbreast), Sedge Warbler, Shrikes, Starling, Stonechat, Swallow,

Swift, Thrushes, Wagtails, Wheatear, Whinchat, White Throat, Willow Warbler, Woodpeckers, Wood Warbler, Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Arrêté du Conseil fédéral concernant les pays et circonscriptions, qui doivent être considérés comme contaminés par la peste.

(Du 12 juin 1902.)

Le Conseil fédéral suisse, en exécution de l'article 49 de l'ordonnance du 30 décembre 1899, * concernant les mesures à prendre contre le choléra et la peste en ce qui concerne les entreprises de transport et le service des voyageurs, des bagages et des marchandises;

en modification et en abrogation de ses arrêtés concernant les pays et circonscriptions qui doivent être considérés comme contaminés par la peste, du 29 février 1900 et des 22 février et 16 juillet 1901; sur la proposition de son Département de l'Intérieur,

arrête :

ARTICLE 1er. A teneur des rapports parvenus au Conseil fédéral, les circonscriptions suivantes : Rio de Janeiro (Brésil), Smyrne et ses environs (Asie mineure) et Constantinople, doivent être considérées comme n'étant plus contaminées, et les mesures prophylactiques prises à l'égard de ces circonscriptions sont par conséquent rapportées.

ARTICLE 2. Par contre, la peste ayant été signalée à Sydney et à Freemantle (Australie), dans l'île de Madagascar, dans le protectorat anglais de l'Afrique orientale, à Pernambuco et à Porto Alegre (Brésil), ainsi qu'à Buenos-Aires (République argentine), ces circonscriptions sont déclarées contaminées par la peste.

Sont, en conséquence, applicables à ces circonscriptions les dispositions des articles 33 à 35 (surveillance des voyageurs au lieu d'arrivée) et 37 à 48 (prescriptions concernant les marchandises et les bagages) de l'ordonnance susmentionnée, articles déclarés en vigueur par l'arrêté du Conseil fédéral du 19 janvier 1900.†

ARTICLE 3. Le présent arrêté entre immédiatement en vigueur.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated June 23, from His Majesty's Representative at Athens, enclosing copy of the following translation of a Royal Decree, dated 28th May/10th June, abrogating the Quarantine Regulations prescribed by the Decree of the 31st August/13th September, 1901, and substituting others in their place:—

Royal Decree.

George I, King of the Hellenes.

Having taken into consideration paragraph 5 of Article 13 of the Sanitary Law; upon the proposal of Our Minister of the Interior and on the advice of the Board of Health, We have resolved and decreed.

ARTICLE I.

Ships subject to five days' quarantine, on account of their having come from plague-infected countries, will obtain free pratique after a severe medical inspection, and without undergoing quarantine, if they have completed ten days at sea, and have fulfilled the following conditions:—

(a.) If it is proved from the ship's official papers that in the course of the voyage they have undergone the necessary disinfection for the

destruction of the rats on board, either in the port of sailing, or any other port, or in a lazaretto.

(b.) That during the voyage they have not communicated with infected or suspected countries, or ships which are on this account subject to quarantine in Greece.

(c.) That the health of the crew and passengers has been maintained unimpaired during the voyage.

ARTICLE II.

Ships subject to five days' effective quarantine in Greece by reason of their having come from plague-infected countries, which have not undergone the necessary disinfection for the destruction of the rats on board, as above mentioned, will be sent to some lazaretto in the Kingdom.

These ships will be granted free pratique, at the lazaretto, after a strict medical visit, if the aforesaid conditions marked (b.) and (c.) have been fulfilled, and after disinfection of the luggage of the crew and third class passengers.

The provisions of Our Decree of August 31st of last year, "concerning the imposition of disinfection, etc., on ships arriving from plague-infected countries after a voyage of fifteen days" are abolished.

Our aforesaid Minister is charged with the publication and execution of the present Decree.

Contraction of Limits of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area contracted by Order of the Board dated the seven-teenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and two, are hereby contracted so as to comprise only the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area so described is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and two.
