WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (City and County of Bristol) Order, 1902.

Dated 5th July, 1902.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the Council of the City and County of Bristol, I hereby make the following Order:—

TITLE.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (City and County of Bristol) Order, 1902."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended, so far as concerns the City and County of Bristol, so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the City and County of Bristol to the following species of Wild Birds as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Buzzard, Chaffinch, Hobby, Honey Buzzard, Kestrel, Magpie, Martins, Merlin, Osprey, Shrikes, Swallow, Swift, and Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of February following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the City and County of Bristol:—

Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Blackbird, Black Cap, Blue Tit, Buntings, Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiff Chaff, Cole Tit, Coot, Cuckoo, Flycatchers, Garden Warbler, Golden-crested Wren, Goldfinch, Great Tit, Gulls, Hedge Sparrow (or Dunnock), Hobby, Honey Buzzard, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Landrail (or Corncrake), Lark, Lesser White Throat, Linnet, Longtailed Tit, Magpie, Martins, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owls, Redstart, Reed Warbler, Robin (or Redbreast), Sedge Warbler, Shrikes, Starling, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Thrushes, Wagtails, Wheatear, Whinchat, White Throat, Willow Warbler, Woodpeckers, Wood Warbler, Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

All Birds protected on Sundays.

V. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of February following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the City and County of Bristol.

EGGS.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the City and County of Bristol.

VI. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the City and County of Bristol:—

Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Blackbird, Black Cap, Blue Tit, Buntings, Buzzard, Chiff Chaff, Cole Tit, Coot, Cuckoo, Flycatchers, Garden Warbler, Golden-crested Wren, Goldfinch, Great Tit, Hawfinch, Hedge Sparrow (or Dunnock), Hobby, Honey Buzzard, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Landrail (or Corncrake), Lesser White Throat, Lark, Linnet, Longtailed Tit, Magpie, Martins, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owls, Plover (Lapwing or Peewit), Redstart, Reed Warbler, Robin (or Redbreast), Sedge Warbler, Shrikes, Starling, Stonechat, Swallow,
