PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, as amended by an Order in Council, bearing date the tenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and one, it was directed that the Winter and Summer Assizes as defined in the said Orders should be holden as therein provided.

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Orders as regards the Summer Assizes, one thousand nine hundred and two, for the county of Glamorgan.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Most Honourable Privy Council is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The town of Cardiff shall, for the Summer Assizes, one thousand nine hundred and two, be the place where Assizes are holden in and for the county of Glamorgan.

2. So much of the said Order of the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, as amended by the said Order of the tenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and one, as is inconsistent with this Order, shall be repealed for the purposes of the said Summer Assizes, one thousand nine hundred and two.

3. Except where the context otherwise requires expressions used in this Order shall have the same meaning as in the said Order of the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, as amended by the said Order of the tenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and one.

4. This Order may be amended or added to or repealed by Order in Council.
