Dover-Pier Works Light-Vessel Replaced.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 283 of 1902:-

Information, dated 21st July, 1902, has been received from the Trinity House, London, that the Pier Works Light-vessel at Dover, exhibiting a white flashing light, which has been since the sinking of the former lightship on 10th May last moored E. 3 S., 2 cables from the position of the old Light-Vessel, has now been removed to the exact position occupied by that vessel, viz.:-6 cables S. 68° E. from the turret on the Admiralty Pier.

No ocean-going vessel should pass between the light-ship and the extremity of the extension works of the Admiralty Pier.

Neglect of this precaution has caused the loss of the Light-vessel and great danger to life.

The Pier Works Light-vessel shows the characteristics and gives the same fog signal as the former vessel, as stated in the Admiralty List of Light, Part I, 1902, No. 175a.
