*Dover—Pier Works Light-Vessel Replaced.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 283 of 1902:—

Information, dated 21st July, 1902, has been received from the Trinity House, London, that the Pier Works Light-vessel at Dover, exhibiting a white flashing light, which has been since the sinking of the former lightship on 10th May last moored E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  S., 2 cables from the position of the old Light-Vessel, has now been removed to the exact position occupied by that vessel, viz.:—6 cables S. 68° E. from the turret on the Admiralty Pier.

No ocean-going vessel should pass between the light-ship and the extremity of the extension works of the Admiralty Pier.

Neglect of this precaution has caused the loss of the Light-vessel and great danger to life.

The Pier Works Light-vessel shows the characteristics and gives the same fog signal as the former vessel, as stated in the Admiralty List of Light, Part I, 1902, No. 175a.

*Sandettié Bank—Intended Light-Vessel.*

The French Government has given notice, dated 8th July, 1902, that during the present year a light-vessel, exhibiting a white flashing light every five seconds, elevated 39 feet above the sea, and visible from a distance of 11 miles, will be established in a depth of 12 fathoms to

the westward of Sandettié bank; the light-vessel, which will have a military mast in the centre, will be painted red, and marked "Sandettié" on each side.

The light, having a light-power of 35,000 candles, will be dioptric and exhibited from the military top.
