SHORES OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT LOWESTOFT.

Removal of Materials Prohibited.

Whereas the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Lowestoft to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between a point near Warren House, Gunton Denes, and a point 400 feet north of the seaward end of Bath House-road, Lowestoft, being within the said port.

Now the Board of Trade do hereby by this Order prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between the points above mentioned.

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897, We, the Local Government Board, directed that, from and after the 29th day of September, 1897, certain Regulations should, except in so far as We might assent to a departure therefrom, be in force in the several Poor Law Unions for the time being in England and Wales with respect to the nursing of the sick poor in Workhouses, and the appointment, qualification, and duties of Nurses, including Superintendent Nurses, therein; and by Article III (3) of that Order provided as follows:—

(3.) Any Superintendent Nurse appointed after the commencement of this Order shall, unless We dispense with the requirement, be a person qualified for the appointment by having undergone, for three years at least, a course of instruction in the Medical and Surgical Wards of any Hospital or Infirmary being a Training School for Nurses, and maintaining a Resident Physician or House Surgeon.

And whereas the Infirmary of each of the Stapleton and Eastville Workhouses of the parish of Bristol is a Training School for Nurses, but does not maintain a Resident Physician or House Surgeon, but it is nevertheless expedient that such Infirmary should be deemed to be within the above-cited provision for the purposes of the qualification therein mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Direct as follows:—
