The following Address was presented to His Majesty at Portsmouth, on board the Royal Yacht "Victoria and Albert," on the 14th instant :-

To Their Most Gracious Majesties King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra.

May it please Your Majesties, We, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portsmouth, desire, on the Coronation of Your Majesties, to assure You of the loyalty and devotion of the inhabitants of this borough to Yourselves and Family, and to offer our sincere wish that Your Majesties may have a long and prosperous reign. The deep interest which has always been taken by Your Majesties and Family in all matters affecting Your people and the various public bodies and institutions is well known, and is responded to by the general loyalty and devotion of the inhabitants in all parts of the Empire, and, although the duties and responsibilities of Your Majesties, consequent on Your accession to the Throne of England, are, and will be heavy and onerous, Your Majesties may rest assured of the loyalty and support of Your people.

In common with Your Majesties' subjects, we have shared the deepest anxiety during His Majesty The King's recent illness, and rejoice in His restoration to health.

We also desire most heartily to congratulate Your Majesties on the restoration of peace in South Africa, and trust that the blessings of peace may soon be felt in that country, and the welfare and prosperity of its people be restored.

#### FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

Quarantine. Under the power and authority vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner orders that all direct arrivals from Constantinople shall be subjected to five days' quarantine to be undergone at Larnaca. 2nd July, 1902.

#### (No. 6219.) Quarantine.

His Excellency the High Commissioner in exercise of the powers vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," has been pleased to pass the following Regulation, namely :-

Port of Karavostassi.

Whenever and so long as quarantine is imposed upon arrivals from Egypt, Syria or Asia Minor, or from any port or district in the said countries, passengers coming from the country or district against which quarantine is imposed will not be allowed to land at the port of Karavostassi.

### Quarantine.

Under the power and authority vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner directs that any vessel arriving from any port or place on the coast of Egypt shall be subjected to twelve days' quarantine to be undergone at Larnaca, unless such vessel shall have performed twelve days' quarantine at an intermediate port and shall be provided with a clean bill of health, and, further, that any such vessel which has per-formed quarantine for less than twelve days at an intermediate port and is provided with a clean bill of health, shall be required to complete the prescribed period of quarantine at Larnaca.

The High Commissioner is further pleased to direct that no passengers from Egypt shall, unless they have their place of domicile in Cyprus or are coming to Cyprus on Government business, be allowed to perform quarantine on shore.

In pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, Majesty's 1893, Postmaster - General His hereby gives notice that a Warrant dated the 25th day of August, 1902, has been made on his representation by the Commissioners of Ilis Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Post Office Acts, directing and declaring that on and from the 1st day of September, 1902, parcels may be transmitted between the United Kingdom (including the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man) and the United States of America at the rates of postage and other charges respectively specified in the said Warrant, and in accordance with the regulations and conditions respectively therein contained.

And the Postmaster-General further gives notice that copies of the said Warrant may be purchased, either directly or through any book-seller, from Eyre and Spottiswoode, East Harding-street, Fleet-street, E.C.; or Oliver and Boyd, Edinburgh; or Edward Ponsonby, 116, Grafton-street, Dublin.

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### PARCEL POST WITH THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

His Majesty's Postmaster-General hereby gives notice that on the 1st of next month a Parcel Post will be established with the United States of America (hereinafter referred to as "the United States"). This service has been established in cooperation with the American Express Company, who arrange for the conveyance throughout the United States in both directions, while the Postmaster-General, on the other hand, is responsible for the conveyance in this country and for the Atlantic transport.

Limits of Weight and Dimensions.

1. The limits are those applicable in the Inland Parcel Post.

#### Charges.

2. The charges payable on parcels for the United States are :-

(a) For conveyance in this country, in the United States and across the Atlantic :-

On Parcels for New York City, Brooklyn, Jersey City or Hoboken.-Not over 3 pounds, 1s. 0d.; from 8 to 7 pounds, 2s. 0d.; from 7 to 11 pounds, 3s. 0d.

. On Parcels for any other part of the United States.-Not over 8 pounds, 2s. 0d.; from 3 to Dart Mills (Miltord Haven), Leonard Neil 7 pounds, 3s. Od.; from 7 to 11 pounds; 4s. Od.

(b) A fixed charge of one shilling on every parcel, due to the American Express Company for the fulfilment of Customs clearance and formalities, and also a fixed fee of one shilling in respect of the charges levied by the United States Government under the title of "Sample Office Fee" or "Storage fee" on every parcel entering the country.

(c) Customs duty is also leviable according to the ordinary Customs tariff of the United States.

#### Mode of Prepayment.

3. The charges for conveyance must always be prepaid by means of stamps affixed to the cover of the parcel. It is further open to the sender—

I. To prepay in the same way the charges for Customs clearance and Storage fee.

II. While prepaying the charges specified under heading I, to assume responsibility for the. Customs charges, so that the parcel may be delivered free of cost to the recipient. This arrangement ensures a speedier conveyance, since ordinary parcels will remain at the New York Custom House until the addressees have remitted thither the amount of duty and other charges upon them.

The charges not prepaid by the sender will be collected from the addressee.

#### Parcels Forwarded in Bond.

4. The sender may without extra charge direct that a parcel be sent through the New York Custom House in bond, for Customs examination at any one of the "United States Ports of Entry," or Inland Custom Houses, of which a list is given below. This arrangement also does away with the delay at New York referred to in the preceding paragraph; but, on the other hand, the addressees will have to make arrangements for the delivery of parcels so treated after they have been cleared at the Custom House of the Inland Port of Entry.

The sender of a parcel intended to be forwarded in bond must mark it plainly "In bond to ," naming the inland Port of Entry chosen; and the same words must also appear in the same handwriting on the Customs declaration which accompanies the parcel.

#### Delivery.

5. In the United States, as in many British Colonies and Foreign Countries, parcels are not in all cases delivered at the houses of the recipients. Parcels will, however, be delivered at all places within the delivery of any Express Company of the United States; and, when it is not delivered, a notice of its arrival will be sent to the addressee, who must then arrange to obtain it at the point where it is lying.

#### General Regulations.

6. The regulations of the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post apply generally to this service also. But attention should be paid to the points of difference stated below.

#### Customs Declarations.

7. The non-adhesive form of Customs declaration must be used. Two copies are required. If the parcel is to be sent in bond to an Inland Port of Entry, it must be endorsed as directed in paragraph 4. Moreover, if the value of the goods contained in the parcel exceeds 100 dollars or £20 10s., the declaration must be made before a United States Consul on forms supplied by him.

8. In addition to those articles which are excluded from transmission by the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post, the undermentioned articles are prohibited from importation into the United States :--

Eatables, ox-hides, prison-made wares, wines containing more than 24 per cent. of alchohol,... cigars and cigarettes in quantity numbering less than 3,000, casks of wine and spirits containing less than 14 gallons, opium containing less than 9 per cent. of morphine. Wine and spirits may be sent in bottles, but Customs duties will be charged as if each parcel contained not less than 12 bottles.

9. The conditions under which compensation is granted for the loss or damage of insured or uninsured parcels correspond with those applicable to Foreign and Colonial Parcels. But the sums payable for insurance are at the following special rates :--

To secure compensation up to £12 a fee of 6d. To secure compensation up to £24 a fee of 1s. To secure compensation up to £36 a fee of 1s. 6d.— To secure compensation up to £48 a fee of 2s. To secure compensation up to £60 a fee of 2s. 6d. To secure compensation up to £72 a fee of 3s. -To secure compensation up to £84 a fee of 3s. 6d. To secure compensation up to £84 a fee of 4s. To secure compensation up to £96 a fee of 4s. To secure compensation up to £108 a fee of 4s. 6d.


