He Cardinal de Feurbin had on Tuesday last a long Audience of the Pope, whom he pressed to dispatch his Bulls for the rest of the French Bishops that Itill want them; and at the same time prayed him to halten way his Extraordinary Nuncio's to the feveral Courts to promote the Work of a Peace; and the better to ngige the Pope therein, 'tis faid, the French have infanded to him that the Squadron, now fitting at Toufor fall not be fent on the Coalts of Italy. The Dukes of smello, Bonelli, and Caffoli, who were funmoned to appear at Naples, to answer for their not affitting at the late Cavalcade of the Spanish Ambassador, when he presented to the Pope the usual Tribute it r the Kingdom of Naples, have fince made their Submilions, and accommodated the Business. The Ambifilder of Venice has received Affurances from the Pope, that he will fend the Squadron of his Galles to joyn the Venetian Fleet in the Levane this

On the 8th instant arrived Lezbrne, Feb. 11. herea Vessel from Argiers, by which we have the Confirmation of the War being declared by that Go-terment against the King of Fez, and of their laring given Orders to their Men of War, to take, or dettroy, all the Ships belonging to Sally, which they shall happen to meet at Sea. We hear that the French are fitting out at Toulon a Squadron of Monof War, to be Commanded by the Count d'E free; who is expected there from Paris about the

eginning of the next month.

Lemberg in Poland, Feb. 10. The King is come lither this day with the whole Court from Jawarow, and intends to pass the Carneval in this City, and after that to return to Warfarr, where a great Council of War, will be held some time the next Month. The Tartais continue encamped in a confiderable Body under the Cannon of Caminiec, the great quantity of Snow that has lately fallen hinding the Incursions they defigned to make into the frontier Provinces of this Kingdom. Intelligence with the Poles, he fent for him, and having taxed him with it, was going to strike him with a Stick he had in his Hand, but the General wrested it from him; as also his Sabre, which the Hospodar drew upon him; but in the mean time his Guards came in, and cut the General in pieces: Atter this the Holpodar caused his Chancellor, with his Son, and Brother, and 7 of the Chief Boyars, or great Men, to be put to Death; and divers others to be Imprisoned; and at the same time fent to the Turks and Tartars for Affirtance.

Vienna, F.b. 28. The Letters from the Blockade of Great Waradin of the 17th initant tell us, That the Tucks of that Garilon had two or three days before made a great Silly, to which they were en-couraged by fome advice they had received that our Huffars, who were posted near the place, might eafily be surprized, but they soon found their mistake; for the Hullars were not only on their Guard, through the Care and Vigilance of the General, Count & Aversperg, but received the Enemy very vigorously, so that they were beaten back with great lofs, and disappointed of their chief Aim, which was to have got some Wood for Fuel, which they thand in great need of within the place: Some Pritoners were taken in this occasion; and the day after two Deferters came over to us, who all agreed in their Relations of the great Mileries which the Garifon do fuffer; and that the Aga had been forced to promife them, that he would Capitulate if they were not relieved in a Fortnight. From Croatia, we have an account, That the Bassa of Bosnia appeared on the 10th of this Month with 4000 Turks and Tartars, and two pieces of Cannon; before Dubieza, on the Unna, and Stormed the place, but was repulsed; After which he planted his Cannon o batter the Wall of the Town, and then made a fecond Affault, but was again beaten off; The Fartars at the same time passed the Unna, but some of our Troops that were drawn together on the other fide, obliged them presently to reine; several of the Tartars being killed, and divers others drowned in their repaffing the River; all which so discouraged the Basla, that he drew off his Men from before Dubiega, and retired towards his own The last Advices from Turker fay, That Quarters. the Grand Vifier does wholly apply himself to the Preparations for carrying on the War, and that he intends to have three Armies in Hungary this Summer. On the other fide we prepare likewife for the Campagne, with all the diligence and vigor imaginable: The Emperor has retolved to augment his Cantomir, having intercepted a Letter, which gave Forces in Hungary to 80000 Men; and to that end hima Suspicion, that the General of his Forces held is treating for Froops with the King of Denonary,
