ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 8TH SEPTEMBER 1902.)

(Swine-Fever Infected Area.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Revocation of Order.

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and two.

> No. 591.—CHINA—NORTH COAST. Wei Hai Vei-Port Regulations.

Information, dated 7th July, 1902, has been received from the Commander-in-Chief, China, that in accordance with the power invested in him by Clause 82 of the Order in Council dated 24th July, 1901, the following regulations have been made respecting the use by mercantile vessels of the Admiralty waters at Wei Hai

The Admiralty waters are bounded on the south by a line from Flagstaff Point to Itau Island; on the east by a line from Itau Island to the eastern point of Hu An Lok Rocks; on the north by the south and west coasts of Leu Kung Tau to Kwoa pu (the northern point of Leu Kung Tau) and by a line from thence to a position with Outer Island bearing N. by W., distant one cable; and on the west by a line from a position with Outer Island bearing N. by W., distant one cable, to the east point of Weigell Cove bearing North true, distant one cable, and from thence South (true) until it meets the line drawn from Itau Island towards Flagstaff Point.

Government has German information respecting signals indicating obstructions for navigating the lower part of the River Elbe, as follows:-

- 1. A red flag by day (or a green light by night), with a white flag below it, indicates an obstruction which can be passed without any special precautions.
- 2. A black ball under the red flag, or near it, indicates vessels must reduce speed.
- 3. A black cylinder, that engines must be stopped.
- cone point downwards, that the obstruction must be passed at as great a distance as possible.
- 5. A cone point upwards, that anchorage within $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables of the obstruction is prohibited.
- 6. Two cones in the form of a quadrangle by day, or a red light over a green light at night, indicate that the obstruction cannot be passed.
- 7. Two cones points together, or two green lights vertical at night, indicate that the obstruction may only be passed with a favour-
- 8. Two black balls by day, or two white lights vertical at night, indicate that the obstruction should be passed on that side from which the signal is shown, the other side being marked at night by one white light. The two black balls or two white lights may, however, be shown on both sides of the obstruction, in which case the vessel must leave the obstruction on her port
- 9. Two black balls by day, or two white lights at night on one side, and three balls or three white lights on the other, indicate that vessels of 6 feet draught should pass on the side of the two black balls, or two lights, and vessels over that draught on the side of the three balls or three lights.
- 10. A ball 5 feet above a cylinder, or two red lights over one white light at night, each 5 feet apart, indicates that all vessels which do not steer well at low speeds must employ a tug to pass the obstruction.
- 11. The signals given in paragraphs 8 and 9 may be accompanied by figures made by the International Code for vessels of 13 feet draught and upwards. Vessels of this draught must only pass when their draught in decimetres is less than the figures shown.

Signals described in paragraphs 2, 3, 4, 5, and

11 are not made at night.

Several of the above signals may be made at the same time, and will be shown from a mast, gaff, or yard, from the obstruction itself when possible; if not, from a vessel anchored down stream close to it. When the vessel cannot be placed close to it, and is anchored up stream, she will carry a black ball as low as possible by day and a white lantern by night.

These signals cover a distance of about $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables from the point at which they are made.

If obstructions exist which are not provided for in the above signals, special vessels carrying the Prussian or Hamburg service flag by day, and a red light at the masthead in addition to the usual lights, will be in attendance. The orders of the captains of these vessels must be complied with.

Leeds Corporation Tramways Undertaking.

TOTICE is hereby given that the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Leeds, being the Promoters within the meaning of the Tramways Act, 1870, of the Leeds Corporation Tramways Undertaking and acting by

the City Council at a meeting held on Wednesday, the third day of September instant, did make the Bye-laws following, that is to say:

BYE-LAWS.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Leeds; the word "tramways" means the Tramway System worked by the Corporation, whether situate within the city of Leeds, or in any other district; the words "Tramways Committee" mean the Committee appointed by the Corporation for the time being to undertake the control and management of the tramways; the word "car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Tramways Committee having charge of or helping in the charge of a car; and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Tramways Committee driving or helping to drive

Entering and Leaving Cars.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

All persons desiring to alight from any car shall do so before any person boards such car for the purpose of travelling thereon and all persons desiring to board the car shall permit such persons to alight as aforesaid.

Smoking.

3. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, or cigar, or cigarette, inside any car.

Musical Instruments.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Intoxicated Persons.

5. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious, or infectious disorder, shall enter or mount upon any car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor.

Obscene or Offensive Language, &c.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or spit, or commit any nuisance, in or upon or against any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Damage to Car.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any car.

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, be liable to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Objectionable Persons.

8. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, nor any person, who, in the opinion of the conductor might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car.

No such person shall enter in or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any car, he shall, on the request of the conductor, leave such car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Payment of Fares.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, the fare legally demandable for the journey, or for the stage thereof for which it be demanded.

Payment into Box.

10. Each passenger, when tickets are not issued, shall, during each stage of the journey for which a fare is payable, pay into the box provided for the purpose the fare so payable, and any such fare shall be in respect of and for the stage of the journey only during which it is paid, and for no other stage thereof.

Tickets.

11. Each passenger, when tickets are issued, shall, as and when requested so to do, show his ticket to the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, and shall also, when requested so to do by the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, deliver up his ticket, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Luggage.

12. No passenger shall bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall be carried at the responsibility of the passenger, and shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the car as shall be directed by the conductor.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

13. No person other than the driver or the conductor of a car, and not being a member of the Works Sub-Committee of the Tramways Committee, or a servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall travel or ride upon the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, or shall stand in any case on the outside, or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, in the interior of any car.

in the interior of any car.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car.

Full Number of Passengers.

14. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any car contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

Entering or Leaving Car in Motion.

15. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any car whilst in motion.

Dogs.

16. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and, in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by, or under the direction of, the conductor.

Firearms, &c.

17. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

18. No person other than the conductor or driver, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car, or its equipment, and no person other than the conductor, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall signal a car to start.

Obstruction.

19. No person shall obstruct or impede any car, or obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws. 20. Every conductor and driver of a car shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws, and prevent the breach thereof.

Penalty.

21. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of any of the Bye-laws, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Repeal of existing Bye-laws.

22. From and after the date of these Bye-laws coming into force, the Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Leeds Tramways Company which came into force on the 10th day of March, 1875, shall be repealed.
