

No such person shall enter in or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any car, he shall, on the request of the conductor, leave such car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Payment of Fares.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, the fare legally demandable for the journey, or for the stage thereof for which it be demanded.

Payment into Box.

10. Each passenger, when tickets are not issued, shall, during each stage of the journey for which a fare is payable, pay into the box provided for the purpose the fare so payable, and any such fare shall be in respect of and for the stage of the journey only during which it is paid, and for no other stage thereof.

Tickets.

11. Each passenger, when tickets are issued, shall, as and when requested so to do, show his ticket to the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, and shall also, when requested so to do by the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, deliver up his ticket, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Luggage.

12. No passenger shall bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall be carried at the responsibility of the passenger, and shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the car as shall be directed by the conductor.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

13. No person other than the driver or the conductor of a car, and not being a member of the Works Sub-Committee of the Tramways Committee, or a servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall travel or ride upon the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, or shall stand in any case on the outside, or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, in the interior of any car.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car.

Full Number of Passengers.

14. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any car contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

Entering or Leaving Car in Motion.

15. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any car whilst in motion.

Dogs.

16. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and, in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by, or under the direction of, the conductor.

Firearms, &c.

17. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

18. No person other than the conductor or driver, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car, or its equipment, and no person other than the conductor, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall signal a car to start.

Obstruction.

19. No person shall obstruct or impede any car, or obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws.

20. Every conductor and driver of a car shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws, and prevent the breach thereof.

Penalty.

21. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of any of the Bye-laws, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

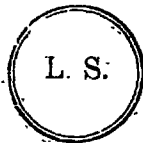
Repeal of existing Bye-laws.

22. From and after the date of these Bye-laws coming into force, the Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Leeds Tramways Company, which came into force on the 10th day of March, 1875, shall be repealed.

Operation.

23. These Bye-laws shall come into force on Monday, the 10th day of November, 1902.
