LONDON GOVERNMENT ACT, 1899.

PASSPORTS IN SERVIA AND ELSEWHERE.

His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a Despatch from His Majesty's Minister at Belgrade, pointing out that British subjects travelling to Serbia should on no account omit to provide themselves beforehand with passports, which are the only documents accepted as proof of identity by the Servian Police Officials. Such passports, if intended to be used for the purpose of a journey through Serbia into Turkey or Roumania, should bear the visa of a Turkish or Roumanian Consular Officer, as the case may be.

His Majesty's Secretary of State desires also to call attention to the advisability of British subjects travelling abroad providing themselves with passports, to facilitate their identification, even in countries where the production of a passport is not actually obligatory.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 22nd instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, 52 Vic., cap. 6, and 2 Edward VII, c. 27, to the amount of £2,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 26th September, 1902, and will be payable at six months after date, viz. :—on the 26th March, 1903.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 23rd instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Friday, the 26th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
