Government Notice. No. 214.

His Honour the Officer Administering the Government, having heard the opinion of the Council of Health, has been pleased to repeal Government Notice No. 204 of the 23rd August, 1902, and to direct that the following regulations be observed as regards vessels and passengers, viz:—

Infected Places.

1. The following countries are, for purposes of quarantine, to be treated as infected:

- (a.) Arabia 'excepting Perim and Aden);
- (b.) China;
- (c.) Egypt;
- (d.) India;
- (e.) Odessa.

2. And the following ports:

- (a.) Ports in the Persian Gulf.

Infected Vessels.

3. Infected vessels are vessels which have, or have had, on board, during the voyage or the preceding 20 days, cases of cholera, yellow fever, plague, or any disease with symptoms which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, resemble the symptoms of the said diseases.

Vessels which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate with Quarantine Establishments.

4. Infected vessels.

5. Vessels with pilgrims from the East, when not carrying a recognized Medical Officer.

6. Vessels from infected places, when not carrying a recognized Medical Officer.

Vessels allowed to load in Quarantine.

7. Vessels arriving at Malta without a clean bill of health.

8. Infected vessels when carrying a recognized Medical Officer and not having on board an actual case of the diseases mentioned in paragraph 3 on board.

9. Vessels from infected places not having on board an actual case of the diseases mentioned in paragraph 3, when arriving within 10 days from departure.

10. Vessels with pilgrims from the East when carrying a recognized Medical Officer.

Vessels from Infected Places admitted to pratique.

11. Vessels without a clean bill of health, or from infected places, will be admitted to pratique after 10 days from date of departure, except vessels from Egyptian ports or from Yambo, which will not be admitted to pratique before the lapse of 21 days from date of arrival.

Medical Inspection.

12. All vessels and passengers on arrival are subject to medical inspection.

Passengers.

13. Passengers, before landing, must declare on oath before a Marine Police Officer that they have not been in, or have not communicated with, Egypt or with Yambo within the last 21 days. Otherwise they shall remain in quarantine to complete 21 days from departure on board the vessel by which they shall have arrived.

14. Passengers, before landing, must also declare on oath before a Marine Police Officer that they have not been in, or have not communicated with, the infected places mentioned in

Article 1, except Egypt or Yambo, within 10 days. Otherwise they shall remain in quarantine to complete 10 days from departure.

15. Passengers arriving on vessels without a clean bill of health shall complete 10 days' quarantine from departure.

16. Passengers arriving from infected places, except Egypt or Yambo, after 10 days from date of departure are allowed to land in free pratique after strict medical inspection and thorough disinfection of their persons, effects and luggage, if the inspecting Medical Officer is satisfied that they are in good health.

17. Passengers not otherwise provided for are subjected to the restrictions applicable to the vessels on which they arrive.

18. When 20 days have elapsed from the last case of plague, cholera, or other disease against which restrictions have been in force with regard to a country or place declared to be an infected place, except Egypt or Yambo, a notice will be issued by the Collector of Customs to the effect that the place or port is no longer to be dealt with as infected.

N.B.—Vessels that carry a doctor and pass through the Suez Canal without taking on board either cargo or passengers, will not be considered infected by contact with Canal Pilots taken on board from a disinfecting station.

The word "passengers," as used in this Notice, includes the crew.

Government Notice. No. 215.

His Honour the Officer Administering the Government, having heard the opinion of the Council of Health, has been pleased to repeal Government Notice No. 312 of the 16th December, 1901, and to direct that the following Regulations be observed as regards Goods:—

1. The importation is prohibited of

(a.) Coffee, in beans, or ground, coloured with substances injurious to health;

(b.) Rags;

(c.) Susceptible goods which do not admit of being disinfected arriving on board infected vessels, vessels without a clean bill of health, or vessels from infected places.

(d.) Hides from any port subject to quarantine, or from any place in which cattle disease exists;

(e.) Vines, vine shoots, and fruit packed in vine leaves.

(f.) Hoofs and hair, raw silk, wool and human hair, skins raw, fresh, or untanned, when such articles arrive from infected ports.

(g.) Cotton seed arriving from countries in which anthrax is epidemic, or unless accompanied by a Certificate from the British Consul at the place of shipment showing that it has not been, during the last twelve months, in an "infected place."

2. The importation is prohibited, unless the goods be accompanied by a satisfactory Certificate from the British Consular Authority that Phylloxera is not known to exist in the place of origin of:—

Plants or roots from any port in the Mediterranean.

3. The importation is allowed, after disinfection, of

(a.) Wearing apparel, soiled linen and clothing, articles of bedding, feathers, bones; and jute goods, whatever be the port whence such articles may have arrived;

(b.) Used sacks, carpets, and embroideries which have been used, when such articles arrived from infected ports.

(c.) Goods which admit of being disinfected, or are not susceptible to infection, arriving on infected vessels, vessels without a clean bill of health, or vessels from infected places.

4. Cereals imported from infected ports are to be kept for 21 days at the Lazzaretto or any other place to be appointed by the Collector of Customs, to be aired under the direction of the Quarantine Authorities.

5. Infected vessels are vessels which have, or have had, on board, during the voyage or the preceding 20 days, cases of cholera, yellow fever, plague, or any disease with symptoms which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, resemble the symptoms of the said diseases.

6. For the purposes of this notice, the words "infected places" mean those countries or ports which are by Government Notice published in the Government Gazette from time to time, declared to be infected.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF

SOUTH-WEST WALES (MUZZLING AND
CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1902 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extent and Enforcement.

1. This Order applies to and shall be in force in the district described in the first schedule to this Order (in this Order referred to as the scheduled district), and shall be enforced by the Local Authority.

Movement of dogs out of scheduled district regulated.

2.—(1.) No dog shall be moved out of the scheduled district, except with a view to its detention for such period as the Board of Agriculture may require upon premises approved for that purpose by the Board, and no dog shall be so moved unless it is accompanied by a Licence of an Inspector of the Board authorizing the movement and prescribing the place, period, and conditions of detention.

(2.) This Article shall not apply to the movement of a dog through the scheduled district by railway from a place outside the said district to another place outside the said district without unnecessary delay and without being rebooked within the scheduled district.

Control of dogs in scheduled district.

3. A dog in the scheduled district, whether in a public place or not, shall between sunset and sunrise be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle, and also led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment, and shall between sunrise and sunset be either muzzled or led as above mentioned; but these provisions shall not apply to—

- (a.) any dog confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape, or secured by a collar and chain to some premises, not being in or on a public place; or
- (b.) Any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants, or being used or moved for the purpose of hunting; or
- (c.) any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep; or
- (d.) any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for the dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, detention, and disposal of dogs.

4.—(1.) Any dog found in or on any public place, which is not muzzled or is not led in manner prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:

- (i.) If the dog is affected with, or suspected of, rabies or has been bitten by a dog so affected or suspected it shall be forthwith slaughtered.
- (ii.) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or

otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii.) In any other case the dog shall be detained in some proper place and be there kept for such period as the Local Authority think expedient: Provided that where the person having charge of or the owner of a dog so detained is known, the Local Authority shall cause notice to be forthwith given to such person or owner of the fact of the dog having been so seized and detained, and the dog shall, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of this Order, be given up to such person or owner on payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such detention. If the dog so seized and detained has not been claimed by such person or owner within three days after the seizure, or, where such person or owner is known, within two days after the aforesaid notice has been given, the Local Authority may cause the dog to be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Local Authority deem expedient.

(2.) Every dog shall for the purposes of this Article be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place or otherwise in contact with any dog affected with or suspected of rabies, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

General provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Order, all the provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897 shall, so far as the same are applicable, continue to apply, during the continuance of this Order, to the scheduled district.

Offences.

6.—(1.) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order or of the conditions of any Licence thereunder, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any dog is not kept under control in manner prescribed by this Order the owner of the dog and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any dog found in or on any public place is not muzzled or is not led in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person allowing the same to be in or on such public place in contravention of this Order, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

7. In this Order—

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

"Public place" includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park garden or pleasure ground, common, uninclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1897.

Existing muzzling regulations of Local Authority.

8. All Regulations made under any Order of the Board by the Local Authority which are suspended by the Order hereby revoked, shall, as regards the scheduled district, continue to be suspended so long as this Order applies thereto.

Revocation of Order superseded.

9. The restrictions imposed by this Order are substituted for those imposed by the Order described in the second schedule to this Order, and such Order is accordingly hereby revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under that Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and two.

Short Title.

11. This Order may be cited as the SOUTH-WEST WALES (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1902 (No. 2).

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF

(DATED 20TH SEPTEMBER 1902.)

SWINE-FEVER (INFECTED AREAS)
ORDER OF 1902.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Definition of Infected Area.

1. This Order shall apply only to an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area, which area is in this Order referred to as an Infected Area.

Restriction on Movement of Swine.

2. Swine shall not be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in an Infected Area, whether in a vehicle or not, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Movement of Swine with Licence.

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place) may be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in an Infected Area if accompanied by a Movement Licence authorizing such movement (in the Form A set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are when the Licence is granted.

(2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue, and shall only be granted on a Declaration, to the effect hereinafter provided, signed by the owner of the swine or his agent authorized in writing for this purpose.

(3.) Every person to whom application is made for a Licence shall, so far as is practicable, before granting the same, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the Declaration, and that the proposed movement is necessary or expedient.

(4.) The Declaration shall be retained by the person granting the Licence and disposed of by him as may be directed by the Local Authority on whose behalf the Licence was granted.

(5.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in the Licence is in an Infected Area the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

(6.) A Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them under this Order.

Movement of Swine for Breeding Purposes with Licence.

4.—(1.) A Licence under this Order expressly granted for the movement of swine to any premises for breeding purposes shall be available as a Licence under this Order for the movement of the swine by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay back to the premises from which they were moved under the Licence: Provided that such movement shall take place within the four days or less period during which the Licence is available.

(2.) No Licence shall be granted for movement of swine for breeding purposes to premises in an Infected Area from premises not in an Infected Area.

Declaration necessary for Licence for Movement of Swine into Infected Area.

5. A Declaration in the Form B set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect shall be sufficient where the movement to be authorized by the Licence is to premises in an Infected Area from—

(a.) a railway station, wharf, or other premises in such Infected Area to which the swine mentioned in the Declaration have been moved without any movement along, over or across a highway or thoroughfare in an Infected Area; or

(b.) from premises not in an Infected Area.

Declaration necessary for Licence for Movement of Swine in other cases.

6. In any case to which the preceding Article does not apply, a Declaration in the Form C set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect shall be necessary.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

7. Where swine are moved with a Licence under this Order to premises in an Infected Area, the Licence shall, unless otherwise directed by any Order of the Board, forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

Regulation of Sales in Infected Area.

8. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of swine shall be held in an Infected Area except a sale held in accordance with the following conditions :

(i.) All the swine exposed at the sale must have been on the premises where the sale is held for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the date of the sale ; and no pig must have been brought on to those premises within such period, whether for breeding purposes or otherwise ;

(ii.) The swine must not be affected with swine-fever or have been exposed to the infection of swine-fever during the said period ; and

(iii.) The sale must not be held in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and the movement of the swine must not have been prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Straying of Swine on Highways.

9. No pig shall be allowed to stray on a highway or thoroughfare or on the sides thereof in an Infected Area.

Movement of Swine landed from Ireland in Infected Area.

10. Swine landed from Ireland at a port or place in an Infected Area may be moved free from any restrictions imposed by this Order from the landing-place forthwith by the most direct route to the nearest available railway-station from which the swine can be moved to their place of destination.

Certain restrictions on Movement of Swine not to be affected.

11. Movement of swine under this Order is subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of swine, and also to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than swine-fever.

Movement of Swine by Licence of Board.

12. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, swine may be moved in any circumstances if accompanied by a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

Granting of Movement Licences.

13.—(1.) A Local Authority may appoint fit and proper persons for the purpose of granting, subject to the provisions of this Article, Movement Licences for the purpose of this Order.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the swine, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

14.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

15. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

16.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address,

or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a Licence as required by this Order he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a market, fair, sale, or exhibition is held in contravention of this Order, the person holding the same, and the occupier of the premises where the market, fair, sale, or exhibition is held, and the owner or consignee of each pig exposed or exhibited thereat, and the person exposing or exhibiting the same thereat, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale or exhibition, and the person, if any, taking entrance-money or other payment for admission thereto, and the purchaser thereof of any pig, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market, fair, sale, or exhibition to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If any person in contravention of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

17. In this Order—

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture:
"Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the Board:

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation of Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896.

18. From and after the commencement of this Order the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 shall cease to apply to any then existing Infected Area and shall be revoked, and this Order shall thenceforth apply to any such Infected Area: Provided that the revocation of the said Order shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done thereunder before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, that Order before the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

19. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and two.

Short Title.

20. This Order may be cited as the SWINE-FEVER (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1902.

The movement of the swine is subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority for prohibiting or regulating the movement of swine, and also to any Order of the Board of Agriculture relating to any disease other than swine-fever.

If the swine are moved to any premises in a Swine-Fever Infected Area this Licence must, unless otherwise directed by any Order of the Board, forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

The swine must be accompanied by this Licence, and be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay. If the place of destination specified in this Licence is in an Infected Area, the swine must be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

This Licence is not available if it is granted by the owner of the swine to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the swine, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Buckinghamshire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Stoke and Burnham, and the parishes of Hughenden, West Wycombe, Chepping Wycombe Rural, Little Marlow, Wooburn, and Hedsor, in the administrative county of Buckingham; and also comprising the borough of Chepping Wycombe (6 September, 1900).

Cambridgeshire.—An Area comprising the parishes of Wicken, Burwell, Swaffham Prior, Swaffham

Bulbeck, Lode, Bottisham, Horningsea, Milton, Waterbeach, Landbeach, Cottenham, and Ramp-ton, in the administrative county of Cambridge (31 July, 1902).
