2nd Battalion Royal Berkshire Regiment	Private House	William	During the attack on Mosilikatse Nek, on 2nd August, 1900, when a Sergeant, who had gone forward to reconnoitre, was wounded, Private House rushed out from cover (though cautioned not to do so, as the fire from the enemy was very hot), picked up the wounded Sergeant, and endeavoured to bring him into shelter, in doing which Private House was himself severely wounded. He, however, warned his comrades not to come to his assistance, the fire being so severe.

The grant of the Medal for Distinguished Conduct in the Field to Private House, which was notified in the London Gazette of 27th September; 1901, is hereby cancelled.

The Board of Trade have received from His Majesty's Representative at New Orleans the following copy of a Circular issued by the Louisiana State Board of Health respecting quarantine at that port :-New Orleans, September 13, 1902.

Gentlemen,

Your attention is respectfully called to the following resolutions adopted at the Meeting of the Louisiana State Board of Health held September 2, 1902 :--

"Resolved, that on and after Tuesday, October 15, detention after disinfection will be imposed only on vessels from ports actually infected, or which have had on board cases of quarantinable diseases, or cases suspected of being such. Passengers from healthy fruit ports to be released immediately after disinfection of baggage on and after that date, provided all are well. "Resolved, that His Excellency, the Governor

of Louisiana, be requested to withdraw his Pro-clamation of Quarantine of March 6, 1902*, oxcept as same refers to ports and places infected, or suspected of being infected, with bubonic plague and Asiatic cholera, such withdrawal to take effect on and after November 1, 1902.

In accordance with the request of the State. Board of Health the Governor of Louisiana issued his Proclamation, September 10, withdrawing quarantine on and after November 1, 1902 except in so far as it refers and applies to ports and places infected, or suspected of being infected with bubonic plague and Asiatic cholera.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF DUDLEY.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Dudley acting by the Council as the Local Authority, under Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

With respect to the rate of speed to be observed in travelling. The distances at which carriages using the transvay shall be allowed to follow one after the other. The stopping of carriages using the tramway. The traffic on the roads in which tramways are laid.

Interpretation of Terms.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations, the following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereinafter respectively assigned to them, that is to say :—

The term "Borough" means the County Borough of Dudley.

The term "The Council" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Dudley, acting by the Council.

The term "Car" shall mean any engine, machine, car, trailing car, carriage, or conveyance, using any tramways laid down within the said borough, whether moved by steam, air, gas, electricity, or any other motive power.

The term "Conductor" shall mean the person who collects passengers' fares, and who attends upon passengers when upon a tram car, or has the charge, management, or control of a tram car.

The term "Driver" shall mean the driver or other person having the charge, management, or control of the motive power of any tram or engine.

The term "Person" shall include any body of persons, whether corporate or unincorporate.

The term "Tramway" means any tramway laid down within the said borough.

The term "Vehicle" shall include a carriage, omnibus, waggonette, brake, cab, car, cart, dray, waggon, motor car, locomotive, and conveyance of whatever description.

2. Subject to Bye-law 3 the driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than 4 miles an hour on the average, and not exceeding 8 miles an hour.

3. The driver of every car shall drive the same at a speed not exceeding the following rates :---

In descending Castle Hill, Dudley, six miles an hour.

In descending the hill from King-street to Junction-street, Dudley, five miles an hour.

Through Castle-street, Dudley, on the journey from Dudley to Stourbridge, four miles an hour.

Through Castle-street, Dudley, on the journey from Stourbridge to Dudley, three miles an hour.

Through the Market Place, Dudley, four miles an hour.

Through High-street and Upper High-street, Dudley, four miles an hour.

In Wolverhampton-street, Dudley, between Parson's-street and Stafford-street, six miles an hour.

In descending Snow Hill, Dudley, from Eve Hill to Stafford-street, six miles an hour.

In descending High-street from King-street to the Junction with Blowers Green-road, five miles an hour.

4. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than 50 yards.

5. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 4 and 6, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers, when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made; provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 25.

6. Except at a passing place or terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within 10 yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

7. The driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same when and where required by any police officer of the borough.

8. In bringing any cars to a standstill immediately after or before any intersection or junction of streets at which a standstill is ordered to be made by the Bye-laws of the Board of Trade, such cars shall not remain there, except for taking up or setting down passengers, for more than a period of three minutes, unless otherwise ordered by a police officer of the borough, and subject to these Bye-laws and the provisions of the Bye-laws of the Board of Trade, no car shall stop in any of the streets of the borough except at a terminus or turnout. No car shall remain at the turnout, opposite St. Thomas's Church, in High-street, Dudley, for a longer period than two minutes.

9. Whenever it is necessary to avoid impending danger, the driver or conductor of a car shall cause the same to be brought to an immediate standstill, and it shall also be brought to a standstill on the request or requirement of any person driving or in charge of any vehicle, or of any person riding or in charge of any horse, who holds up his hand, or otherwise indicates that a stoppage is required.

10. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

11. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

12. No car shall be stopped for the purpose of delivering goods or parcels, except at such places, or at such distances as the Council may from time to time appoint or direct.

13. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

14. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of December, 1902.

15. The Bye-laws, rules, and regulations made by the Local Authority on the 5th day of May, 1885, the 7th day of July, 1885, and the 2nd day of February, 1886, respectively, are hereby repealed from and after the date of these Byelaws and Regulations coming into force.


