FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the process of file-cutting by hand to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make regulations for factories and workshops (including tenement factories and tenement workshops) in which that process is carried on.

Copies of the regulations proposed to be made may be obtained at the office of the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, London, and at the local offices of the Inspectors of Factories. Objections to the draft regulations by or on behalf of any persons affected by the regulations must be sent to the Secretary of State within 40 days from the date of this notice.
