The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from His Majesty's Representative at Rotterdam, intimating that the Netherlands Government have issued a Notice stating that from and after October 5, the import into and transit through the Netherlands is prohibited of rags, clothes, and unwashed linen and bedding from Bombay, Calcutta, Cape Town, and Port Elizabeth (Cape Colony).

Passengers' luggage, in respect of unwashed linen and bedding, is included in this prohibition.

Goods arriving from the above-named ports and which can be proved to have been originally forwarded from elsewhere and to have been so packed as not to have been in contact with infected goods are exempt from the prohibition, as likewise those destined for transit and whose packing cannot in any way be altered or tampered with.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 13TH OCTOBER 1902.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Revocation of Order.

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected

Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and two.
