For appointing Saturday, October 25th, a Bank Holiday in the County of London.

EDWARD R. and I.

We, considering that it is desirable that Saturday, the twenty-fifth day of this instant October, being the occasion of Our Royal Progress through London, should be observed as a Close Holiday in all Banks throughout the County of London, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," Do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, appoint Saturday, the twenty-fifth day of this instant October, being the occasion of the said Royal Progress, as a special day to be observed as a Close Holiday in all Banks throughout the County of London, under and in accordance with the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects concerned to order themselves according!

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twentieth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and two, and in the second year of Our Reign.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 it is provided (inter alia) as follows:—

If two-thirds of the Council of a borough agree to petition and the Council thereupon petition the Queen for the division of the borough into wards or for the alteration of the number and boundaries of its wards it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time by Order in Council to fix the number of wards into which the borough shall be divided and the borough shall be divided and the borough shall be divided into that number of wards. Where an Order has been so made the Secretary of State shall appoint a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of the wards and apportioning the Councillors among them. In case of alteration of wards the Commissioner shall so apportion among the altered wards the Councillors for those wards so as to provide for their continuing to represent as large a number as possible of their former constituents.

And whereas the said Municipal Corporations Act 1882 was in certain particulars amended by the Municipal Corporations Act 1893.

And whereas in the year one thousand nine hundred and one Her late Majesty the Queen Victoria died and was succeeded by His Majesty

King Edward the Seventh.

And whereas on the eighteenth day of June one thousand nine hundred and two the Right Honourable Charles Thomson Ritchie one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State did in pursuance of the said Municipal Corporations Act 1882 (amended as aforesaid) duly warrant and appoint Archibald Bence Bence-Jones, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the wards of the borough of Newport (Mon.) the number of such wards having been fixed by the Order of His Majesty in Council made in that behalf on the eleventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and two.

Now I the said Archibald Bence Bence-Jones do hereby in pursuance of the said warrant and appointment declare this to be my scheme for the purposes of the said Municipal Corporations Act 1882 (amended as aforesaid) and I hereby fix and determine that the boundaries of the wards of the said borough of Newport (Mon.) shall be as follows namely:—

The Crindau Ward

Shall include so much of the said borough of Newport as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing in the centre of the channel of the River Usk at Newport Bridge and proceeding thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the channel of the said river to the northern boundary of the borough thence in a westerly direction along the said boundary to the point in the boundary of the borough where the said boundary is intersected by the Abergavenny Branch of the Monmouthshire Canal thence along the northern and eastern sides of the said canal to the point at which Barrack Hill crosses the said canal thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Dos-road and Queen's Hill to Mill-street thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Mill-street to the Eastern Valleys Branch of the Great Western Railway thence in a southerly direction along the western side of the said Eastern Valleys Branch to the centre of High-street and thence in an easterly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

The Caerau Ward

Shall include so much of the said borough of Newport as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the boundary of the Crindau Ward as hereinbefore defined in the centre of High-street where High-street crosses the Eastern Valleys Branch of the Great Western Railway thence proceeding along the western boundary of the Crindau Ward as here-inbefore defined to the northern boundary of the borough thence in westerly and southerly directions successively along the northern and western boundary of the borough to the point at which the said boundary of the borough is intersected by Risca-road thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Risca-road and Stow Hill to Caerau-road, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Caerau-road to Clyfford-crescent thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Clyfford-crescent and Saint Mary-street to North-street thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Northstreet to Havelock-street thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Havelock-street to Stow Hill thence in a northerly direction along the centres of Stow Hill and High-street respectively to the point of commencement aforesaid.

The Saint Woollos Ward

Shall include so much of the said borough of Newport as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the eastern boundary of the Caerau Ward as hereinbefore defined at the junction of Stow Hill and Havelock-street proceeding thence in a north-westerly direction along the boundary of the Caerau Ward as hereinbefore defined to the boundary of the borough at Risca-road thence along the western boundary of the borough to the point at which the said boundary is intersected by Cardiff-road thence in easterly and northerly directions along the centres of Gardiff-road and Commercial-street respectively to the junction of Commercial-street

and Stow Hill thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Stow Hill to the point of commencement aforesaid.

The Tredegar Ward

Shall include so much of the said borough of Newport as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the eastern boundary of the Saint Woollos Ward as hereinbefore defined at the junction of Commercial-street and Cardiff-road proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction along the southern boundary of the Saint Woollos Ward as hereinbefore defined to a point in Cardiff-road aforesaid opposite Mendalgyf-road thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Mendalgyf-road to a point in Mendalgyf-road opposite Price-street thence in an easterly direction to and along the centres of Price-street and Courtybella-terrace to the railway level crossing at the south end of Commercial-road thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Commercial-road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

The Alexandra Ward

Shall include so much of the said borough of Newport as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the north-eastern boundary of the Tredegar Ward as hereinbefore defined at the railway level crossing aforesaid at the south end of Commercial-road proceeding thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Commercial-road to Potter-street and thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Potter-street and in a continuous straight line across Newport Docks to the centre of the channel of the River Usk thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the channel of the said river to the boundary of the borough thence along the southern and western boundaries of the borough successively to the point aforesaid where Cardiff-road intersects the said boundary thence in easterly and south-easterly directions successively along the southern boundaries of the Saint Woollos Ward and the Tredegar Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

The Central Ward

Shall include so much of the said borough of Newport as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at the point aforesaid in the centre of the channel of the River Usk at Newport Bridge aforesaid proceeding thence along the centres of High-street Commercial-street and Commercial-road successively to the junction of Commercial-road and Potter-street thence eastwards along the northern boundary of the Alexandra Ward as hereinbefore defined to the centre of the channel of the River Usk thence northwards along the centre of the channel of the said river to the point of commencement aforesaid.

The Saint Julian Ward

Shall include so much of the said borough of Newport as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at the point aforesaid in the centre of the channel of the River Usk at Newport Bridge and proceeding thence in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of the Crindau Ward as hereinbefore defined to the northern boundary of the borough thence in northerly easterly and southerly directions successively along the boundary of the borough to the first point of contact of the said boundary

and the Christchurch-road thence in a westerly direction along the centres of Christchurch-road Church-road Caerleon-road and Clarence-place successively to the point of commencement afore-

The Maindee Ward

Shall include so much of the said borough of Newport as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the southern boundary of the Saint Julian Ward as herein-before defined at the junction of Caerleon-road and Chepstow-road and proceeding thence in an easterly direction along the southern boundary of the Saint Julian Ward to the boundary of the borough thence in a south-easterly direction along the eastern boundary of the borough to the point at which Chepstow-road intersects the said boundary thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Chepstow-road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

The Victoria Ward

Shall include so much of the said borough of Newport as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at the point aforesaid at the junction of Caerleon-road and Chepstow-road and proceeding thence in a south-easterly direction along the southern side of the Maindee Ward as hereinbefore defined to Wharfe-road thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Wharfe-road to the railway lines crossing over Wharfe-road thence in a southwesterly direction along the western side of the Great Western Wharfe Railway to the terminus at the coal wharf of the said line of railway continuing thence in a straight line to the centre of the channel of the river Usk thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the said river to Newport Bridge thence eastwards along the centre of Clarence-place to the point of commencement aforesaid.

The Liswerry Ward

Shall include so much of the said borough of Newport as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the boundary of the Victoria Ward as hereinbefore defined at the junction of Chepstow-road and Wharfe-road and proceeding thence in an easterly direction along the boundary of the Maindee Ward as hereinbefore defined to the eastern boundary of the borough thence along the eastern and southern boundaries of the borough to the centre of the channel of the River Usk thence in northerly easterly and northerly directions successively along the centre of the channel of the River Usk to the boundary (opposite the coal wharf aforesaid of the Great Western Wharfe Railway) of the Victoria Ward as hereinbefore defined thence along the south-eastern boundary of the Victoria Ward aforesaid to the point of commencement aforesaid.

And I the said Commissioner in further pursuance of the terms of the said warrant and for the purposes aforesaid do hereby assign and apportion all the existing Councillors among the wards as hereinbefore defined of the said borough of Newport as follows namely:-

And whereas, on the eleventh day of June one thousand nine hundred and two, the Right Honourable Charles Thomson Ritchie, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did, in pursuance of the 30th section of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882, duly warrant and appoint Henry Best Hams Hamilton Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of, and apportioning the Councillors among, the wards of the said borough of Ilkeston, the number of such wards having been fixed, as aforesaid.

such wards having been fixed, as aforesaid.

Now I, the said Henry Best Hans Hamilton do hereby, in pursuance of the said warrant and appointment, determine the boundaries of the six wards into which the said borough shall be divided, which wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows, that is to say:—

North Ward. No. 1 . . Granby Ward. No. 2 ٠. Market Ward. No. 3 . . Victoria Ward. No. 4 . . Old Park Ward. No. 5 . . South Ward. No. 6

No. 1. North Ward.

I do hereby determine, that North Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough of Ilkeston, as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of Heanorroad, where the said Heanorroad passes over the centre of the Great Northern Railway, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the said Heanorroad to the extreme northeastern boundary of the borough aforesaid (adjoining the south-east portion of the parish of Shipley) thence in a north-easterly direction along the said borough boundary to a point in the centre of the River Erewash, thence in a south-easterly direction, following the said River Erewash, to a point in the centre of the said River Erewash, to a point in the centre of the Great Northern Railway line aforesaid, thence in a south-westerly direction, along the centre of the said Great Northern Railway, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 2. Granby Ward.

I do hereby determine, that Granby Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Ilkeston, as is contained within an imaginary line drawn from a point in the centre of the Heanor-road, where the same passes over the centre of the Great Northern Railway, thence in a north-easterly direction following the southeast boundary of the north ward hereinbefore described, to the borough boundary at a point in the centre of the River Erewash, thence in a southerly direction following the said borough boundary in the centre of the said River Erewash, to a point in the centre of the Midland Railway, where the said Midland Railway passes over the said River Erewash, thence in a westerly direction, along the centre of the Midland Railway aforesaid, to the terminus thereof, thence in the same direction to a point in the centre of Bath-street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the said Bath-street, and the centre of the said Heanor-road, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 3. Market Ward.

I do hereby determine, that Market Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Ilkeston, as is contained within an imaginary line drawn

from a point in the centre of Bath-street opposite to the Midland Railway Town Station, thence following in an easterly direction the southern boundary of Granby Ward hereinbefore described, to the borough boundary at a point in the centre of the River Erewash, thence in a southerly direction along the said borough boundary in the centre of the said River Erewash, to a point where the said River Erewash passes under the ancient Bridle-road, leading from Ilkeston to Cossall, thence in a westerly direction, along the centre of the said Bridle-road, over the Erewash Canal Bridge, thence along the centre of Parkroad, to the ancient public highway footway, thence along the centre of the said public highway footway, to a point where the said public highway footway joins the road adjacent to the entrance to the cemetery, thence along the centre of the said road in a westerly direction, to the Old Park Recreation Ground, thence along a public highway footway upon the southern and south-western boundary of the said Old Park Recreation Ground, thence in a westerly direction, along the centre of the said public highway footway, to and along the south side of the old burial-ground into Hallcroft-place, thence to a point in the centre of Market-street, lying between the Anchor Inn, No. 7, Market-street, and the premises known as Messrs. F. and C. Sudbury's Hosiery Factory, thence in a northerly direction, along the centre of the said Market-street for a distance of forty-three yards, to a point opposite the east end of Coronation-street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the said Coronation-street to a point in the centre of South-street, thence in a northerly direction, along the centre of the said South-street to the Market-place, thence along the centre of the main road on the western and north-western side of the said Market-place, to a point in the centre of Bath-street, thence in a northerly direction, along the centre of the said Bath-street, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 4. Victoria Ward.

I do hereby determine, that Victoria Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Ilkeston as is contained within an imaginary line, commencing at a point in the centre of the junction of Derby-road with South-street and White Lion-square, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Derby-road to the borough boundary at a point in the centre of the River Nutbrook, thence in a northerly direction along the borough boundary in the centre of the said River Nutbrook, thence following the said borough boundary in an easterly direction, to a point in the centre of Heanor-road opposite the Board Schools, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the said Heanor-road and Bath-street, thence along the centre of the main road upon the north-west and west side of the Market-place to South-street, and thence along the centre of the said South-street, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 5. Old Park Ward.

I do hereby determine, that Old Park Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Ilkeston as is contained within an imaginary line, commencing at a point at the junction of Derbyroad with White Lion-square and South-street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the said South-street to a point opposite the west end of Coronation-street, thence in an

easterly direction along the centre of Coronationstreet, following the southern boundary of Market Ward hereinbefore described, to the borough boundary at a point in the centre of the Bridle-road leading from Ilkeston to Cossall, over the River Erewash, thence in a southeasterly and southerly direction, along the said borough boundary in the centre of the said River Erewash, to a point in the centre of Nottingham-road on the county bridge over the said River Erewash, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the said Nottingham-road to the said White Lion-square, thence through the centre of White Lion-square to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 6. South Ward.

I do hereby determine, that South Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Ilkeston as is contained within an imaginary line, commencing at a point in the centre of Derby-road, where the same passes over the borough boundary in the River Nutbrook, thence in an easterly direction, following the southern boundary of the Victoria Ward hereinbefore described, to a point at the junction of the said Derby-road with South-street, thence in a south-easterly direction, following the south-west boundary of Old Park Ward, hereinbefore described, to the borough boundary in the centre of the River Erewash, to a point where the said river passes under the county bridge, thence in a southerly and easterly direction, along the said borough boundary in the centre of the said River Erewash to its junction with the said River Nutbrook, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the said River Nutbrook, which forms the said borough boundary to the south and south-west, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

And I, the said Henry Best Hans Hamilton by virtue of the power given to me by the said warrant of appointment, and in accordance with the provisions of the thirtieth section of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882, do hereby assign and apportion to each of the said six wards hereby determined three Councillors that is to say:—

Infected Vessels.

3. Infected vessels are vessels which have, or have had, on board, during the voyage or the preceding 20 days, cases of cholera, yellow fever, plague, or any disease with symptoms which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, resemble the symptoms of the said diseases.

Vessels which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate with Quarantine Establishments.

4. Infected vessels.

5. Vessels with pilgrims from the East, when

not carrying a recognized Medical Officer.
6. Vessels from infected places, when not carrying a recognized Medical Officer.

Vessels allowed to load in Quarantine.

7. Vessels arriving at Malta without a clean bill of health.

8. Infected vessels when carrying a recognized Medical Officer and not having on board an actual case of the diseases mentioned in paragraph 3 on

9. Vessels from infected places not having on board an actual case of the diseases mentioned in paragraph 3, when arriving within 10 days from

10. Vessels with pilgrims from the East when carrying a recognized Medical Officer.

Vessels from Infected Places admitted to pratique.

11. Vessels without a clean bill of health, or from infected places, will be admitted to pratique after 10 days from date of departure, except vessels from Egyptian Ports, from Arabia (excepting Perim and Aden) and Syria between Sur and Port Said, which will not be admitted to pratique before the lapse of 21 days from date of arrivāl.

Medical Inspection.

12. All vessels and passengers on arrival are subject to medical inspection.

Passengers.

13. Passengers, before landing, must declare on oath before a Marine Police Officer that they have not been in, or have not communicated with, Egypt, Arabia (except Perim and Aden), or Syria between Sur and Port Said, within the last 21 days. Otherwise they shall remain in quarantine to complete 21 days from departure on board the

vessel by which they shall have arrived.

14. Passengers, before landing, must also declare on oath before a Marine Police Officer that they have not been in, or have not communicated with, the infected places mentioned in Article 1, except Egypt, Arabia (not including Perim and Aden), or Syria between Sur and Port Said, within 10 days. Otherwise they shall remain in quarantine to complete 10 days from departure.

15. Passengers arriving on vessels without a clean bill of health shall complete 10 days'

quarantine from departure.

16. Passengers arriving from infected places except Egypt, Arabia (not including Perim and Aden), or Syria between Sur and Port Said, after 10 days from date of departure are allowed to land in free pratique after strict medical inspection and thorough disinfection of their persons, effects, and luggage, if the inspecting Medical Officer is satisfied that they are in good health.

17. Passengers not otherwise provided for are subjected to the restrictions applicable to

the vessels on which they arrive.

18. When 20 days have elapsed from the last case of plague, cholera, or other disease against which restrictions have been in force with regard to a country or place declared to be an infected place, except Egypt, Arabia (not including Perim and Aden), or Syria between Sur and Port Said, a notice will be issued by the Collector of Customs to the effect that the place or port is no longer to be dealt with as infected.

N.B.—Vessels that carry a doctor and pass through the Suez Canal without taking on board either cargo or passengers, will not be considered infected by contact with Canal Pilots taken on

board from a disinfecting station.

The word "passengers," as used in this Notice,

includes the crew.
