

Ernest Augustus Eardley Wilmot, Clerk in Holy Orders, Prebendary of the cathedral Church of Wells, the Reverend Joseph Edmund Rogers, Clerk in Holy Orders rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish of Walcot in the county of Somerset, and the Reverend John Barton, Clerk in Holy Orders, of Castlenau, Wimbleton Hill, in the county of Surrey, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bradford (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parishes of Great Horton, All Saints Horton and Saint Andrew Bradford, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Columba Horton Bradford situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named "The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Columba Horton Bradford."

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

The consolidated chapelry of Saint Columba, Horton, Bradford, comprising all those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Great Horton, the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of All Saints, Horton, and the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Bradford, all in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bradford, from the new parish of Great Horton aforesaid at the junction of Legram's lane with Green-lane and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last named lane (thereby following the said boundary) for a distance of seventeen chains and a half or thereabouts to the junction of the same lane with Spencer Road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last named road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Toby Lane and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last named lane for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Bradford and Thornton Line of the Great Northern Railway across the said lane and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Great Horton from the new parish of All Saints, Horton aforesaid) for a distance of forty-seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the City-road Branch Line of the Great Northern Railway and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway for a distance of twenty-three chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the southern end of the tunnel under Alexandra-street and Great Horton-road and extending thence north-eastward along the southern end of the said tunnel and along the wall or fence at the southern end of the road which leads across Alexandra-street into Great Horton-road for a distance of thirty-five feet or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said

wall or fence and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said road leading across Alexandra-street for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Great Horton-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last named road (thereby following the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints, Horton from the new parish of Saint Andrew Bradford aforesaid) for a distance of forty feet or thereabouts to the point where the last-named road is carried by the aforesaid tunnel over the middle of the said City-road Branch Line of the Great Northern Railway and extending thence north-westward across the said Great Horton-road to and then along the middle of the last-mentioned branch line of railway for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Legram's-lane aforesaid over the said line of railway and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to the point where it is joined by Green-lane upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew Bradford from the new parish of Great Horton aforesaid, at which point the said imaginary line commenced.

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirty-first day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and two, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—
