**INEBRIATES ACT, 1898.
LICENSING ACT, 1902.**

Regulations made by the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in pursuance of section 20 of the Inebriates Act, 1898, respecting the detention of Inebriates committed to a Retreat under section 5 of the Licensing Act, 1902.

I, the Right Honourable Aretas Akers-Douglas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby, by virtue of section 20 of the Inebriates Act, 1898, make the following regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of section 5 of the Licensing Act, 1902, respecting the detention of Inebriates committed to Retreats:—

1. Before applying under section 12 of the Habitual Drunkards Act, 1879, for a Justice's Order for the discharge of a patient committed to the Retreat under section 5 of the Licensing Act, 1902, the Licensee shall give notice of his intention seven full days previously to the Secretary of State, and shall specify the reasons for his application, and the name and address of the Justice to whom it is to be made.

2. The Licensee shall give immediate notice to the Secretary of State of any visit and examination, pursuant to section 18 of the Habitual Drunkards Act, 1879, of any patient committed under section 5 of the Licensing Act, 1902.

**LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.
Padstow, Bedruthan, and Mawgan Light
