

When the Archbishops and the Dean of Westminster had communicated, Their Majesties received the Sacrament, the Archbishop Administering the Bread, and the Dean of Westminster the Cup.

The King and Queen then received Their Crowns from the Lord Great Chamberlain and His Majesty's Lord Chamberlain, and put them on, and also received back their Sceptres.

The Archbishop then proceeded with the Communion Service, at the end of which the Choir sang "Glory be to God on high," &c., and, the same being concluded, the Archbishop pronounced the Blessing.

The Service being concluded, His Majesty, attended as before, the four Swords being carried before Him, and the Noblemen who had carried the Regalia then lying upon the Altar, passed through the Door on the South side into St. Edward's Chapel; the Noblemen who had carried the Regalia receiving them from the Dean of Westminster as they passed by into the Chapel, the Organ and other Instruments all the while playing.

The Queen, at the same time went into the same Chapel at the door on the North side of the Altar.

Their Majesties being in the Chapel, the King standing before the Altar delivered the Sceptre with the Dove, which His Majesty had borne in His Left Hand, to the Archbishop, who laid it upon the Altar there.

His Majesty was then disrobed of His Royal Imperial Mantle or Robe of State, and arrayed in His Royal Robe of Purple Velvet, by the Lord Great Chamberlain, and received His Crown of State.

The Archbishop then placed the Orb in His Majesty's Left Hand.

The Noblemen who had carried the Gold Spurs, and St. Edward's Staff, delivered the same to the Dean, to be by him deposited on the Altar in the Chapel.

Whilst Their Majesties were in St. Edward's Chapel, the Officers of Arms arranged the Procession for the Return, so that all might be ready to move at the moment when the King and Queen left the Chapel.

Their Majesties then proceeded out of the Choir, and to the West Door of the Abbey; Their Majesties wearing Their Crowns, the King bearing in His Right Hand the Sceptre with the Cross, and in His Left the Orb, and the Queen bearing in Her Right Hand Her Sceptre with the Cross, and in Her Left the Ivory Rod with the Dove. Their Royal Highnesses the Princes and Princesses wearing their Coronets. The Four Swords were borne before the King, in the same order as before. The Dean and Prebendaries, and the Bishops who had carried the Bible, the Chalice, and the Patina, remained in the Choir. The Noblemen who had severally carried the Crowns, the Orb, the Sceptre with the Dove, the Spurs, and St. Edward's Staff, walked in the same places as before; those who had Staves and Batons carrying the same; all Peers wearing their Coronets; and the Kings of Arms their Crowns.

The Swords and the Regalia were received, near the West Door, by the Keeper of the Crown Jewels.

Their Majesties and the Princes and Princesses of the Blood Royal, and the Royal Guests, returned to the Royal Palace with the same State as in their Proceeding to the Abbey, in the following order: The King's Procession, The Prince of Wales's Procession, and the Procession of the Royal Family, and Royal Guests, by Parliament Street, Whitehall, Cockspur Street, Pall Mall, St. James's Street, Piccadilly, and Constitution Hill.

THE FOLLOWING WERE THE EARL MARSHAL'S ORDERS.

All those who are in the Sanctuary and others taking part in any way in the Ceremonial are directed, so far as possible, to kneel during the service of Holy Communion, from the end of the exhortation preceding the Confession to the end of the service, except only during the singing of the "Gloria in excelsis" when they will stand. This direction does not apply to the Noblemen bearing the Swords. They will stand throughout.
