All persons having Cards of Admission to Westminster Abbey on the day of the Coronation, not being Peers, or Members of the House of Commons, are to appear in Uniform or in Full Court Dress. The Knights of the respective Orders are to wear their Collars, and the Robes they are entitled to as such.

The Members of the House of Commons may appear in Court Dress Uniform or in Morning Dress.

Ladies will appear in Court Dress without trains.

No Person will be permitted to pass into Westminster Abbey on the day of the Coronation, except on production of a card issued by me, under my Seal; or to walk in the Procession, unless his name or office be mentioned in the Ceremonial.

The Instructions framed by His Majesty's Secretary of State for securing the Commodious Access and Regress of Carriages to and from the Abbey, must, to prevent confusion, be followed in every particular.
