PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.  
**W**HEREAS, two-thirds of the Council of the borough of Ilkeston in the county of Derby agreed to petition, and the Council of the said borough thereupon petitioned His Majesty, for the alteration of the number and boundaries of the wards of the said borough.

And whereas, His Majesty was pleased to refer the said petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council for consideration, and upon their report, in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in His Majesty by the Municipal Corporations Act 1882, and in pursuance of every other power enabling His Majesty, in that behalf, did, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, fix the number of wards into which the said borough shall be

henceforth divided, and thereupon ordered and directed that the number of the said wards shall be six.

And whereas, on the eleventh day of June one thousand nine hundred and two, the Right Honourable Charles Thomson Ritchie, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did, in pursuance of the 30th section of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882, duly warrant and appoint Henry Best Hans Hamilton, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of, and apportioning the Councillors among, the wards of the said borough of Ilkeston, the number of such wards having been fixed, as aforesaid.

Now I, the said Henry Best Hans Hamilton do hereby, in pursuance of the said warrant and appointment, determine the boundaries of the six wards into which the said borough shall be divided, which wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows, that is to say:—

- No. 1 .. North Ward.
- No. 2 .. Granby Ward.
- No. 3 .. Market Ward.
- No. 4 .. Victoria Ward.
- No. 5 .. Old Park Ward.
- No. 6 .. South Ward.

No. 1. North Ward.

I do hereby determine, that North Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough of Ilkeston, as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of Heanor-road, where the said Heanor-road passes over the centre of the Great Northern Railway, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the said Heanor-road to the extreme north-eastern boundary of the borough aforesaid (adjoining the south-east portion of the parish of Shipley) thence in a north-easterly direction along the said borough boundary to a point in the centre of the River Erewash, thence in a south-easterly direction, following the said borough boundary in the centre of the said River Erewash, to a point in the centre of the Great Northern Railway line aforesaid, thence in a south-westerly direction, along the centre of the said Great Northern Railway, to the point of commencement aforesaid.
