

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 1ST NOVEMBER 1902.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Revocation of Order.

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected

Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and two.

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902.

Inclusion in Area of two Existing Areas.

2. The Swine-Fever Infected Areas described in the Second Schedule hereto, which are included in the area declared by this Order, shall, from and after the commencement of this Order, cease to be separate areas.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and two.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

Description of Infected Area Declared by this Order.

An area comprising the administrative county of Worcester (including the boroughs of Bewdley, Droitwich, Evesham, and Kidderminster, but excluding the parish of Blockley, and the parishes of Conderton, Cutsdean, Daylesford, Evenlode, Overbury, and Teddington, transferred by agreement to the administrative county of Gloucester, and the parishes of Alderminster, Shipston-on-Stour, Tidmington, and Trecington, transferred by agreement to the administrative county of Warwick); and also comprising the parishes of Aston Somerville, Childswickham with Murcott, and Hinton-on-the-Green, transferred by agreement from the administrative county of Warwick, and the city of Worcester.

THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

Descriptions of Existing Infected Areas Included in Area Declared by this Order.

1. An Area comprising the petty sessional division of Northfield, in the administrative county of Worcester.

2. An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Worcester, Great Malvern, Pershore (including the detached part thereof, but excluding the parishes of Overbury, Conderton, and Teddington), and Evesham (including the detached part thereof), and the borough of Evesham, in the administrative county of Worcester; and also comprising the city of Worcester.
