The following General Order, dated 1st August, 1902, publishing a Despatch from Major-General C. C. Egerton, C.B., D.S.O., regarding the part taken by the Waziristan Militia in the recent Mahsud Blockade Operations, has been received from the Government of India:—

Field Operations.

No. 702. In continuation of G. G. O. No. 611, dated the 4th July, 1902, His Excellency the Governor-General in Council is pleased to direct the publication as a Despatch of the following letter from Major-General C. C. Egerton, C.B., D.S.O., A.D.C., regarding the part taken by the Northern and Southern Waziristan Militia in the recent Mahsud Blockade Operations.

From Major-General C. C. Egerton, C.B., D.S.O., A.D.C., to the Deputy Adjutant-General, Punjab Command.—(No. 2047-B, dated Sunamarg, Kashmir, the 12th July, 1902.)

In continuation of my former Despatch regarding operations against the Mahsud Waziris, I have now the honour to forward for the information of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief the correspondence marginally noted,* together with copies of reports by the Officers Commanding the Northern and Southern Waziristan Militias, on the services rendered by their respective commands.

2. I most cordially endorse the opinions expressed by the Commissioner on Special Duty and of the Chief Commissioner, North-West Frontier Province, as to the excellent work performed by these recently raised but already extremely efficient bodies of Tribal Militia.

3. Having now for the first time before me details of the work done by them, I freely acknowledge the value and excellence of the services rendered by these Militias, the more creditable to them by reason of their being so lately raised.

4. I trust that His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief will agree with me in thinking that the efficiency and gallantry displayed by these corps is deserving of recognition by the military authorities.

5. I have already brought to favourable notice the names of Major R. Harman, D.S.O., and of Captain A. F. Ferguson-Davie, the Commandants, respectively, of the Southern and Northern Waziristan Militias, and I now beg to add those of Captain A. W. F. Knox, 5th Punjab Infantry, Adjutant, Southern Militia, whose services are repeatedly brought to notice by Major Harman, and of Captain F. E. Finnis, of the Northern Militia.

6. I presume that the native Officers and rank and file whose names are brought to notice will be dealt with by the political authorities.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from His Majesty's Representative at Trieste, enclosing the following translation of a circular issued by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste, respecting preventive measures against infection by plague to goods imported from the Littoral of Jaffa and Gaza:—

By Decree of November 13, 1902 (B. L. J. No. 209), issued by the Imperial and Royal Ministries of the Interior, of Commerce and Finance in conjunction with the Royal Hungarian Government, and accordingly to the International Sanitary Convention of April 15th, 1893 (B. L. J. No. 69E, 1894), the importation and transit of the following goods and articles is—on account of cholera cases verified in the Littoral of Jaffa and

Gaza, in Syria (Palestine)—prohibited and respectively restricted from the Syrian Littoral (Palestine); that is from the Egyptian frontier to Berutti (this port excluded):—

(1.) Of used body linen clothes, of old clothing (personal effects), old bed clothing, when such articles are forwarded as personal baggage or as household effects in consequence of change of residence, they will be subject upon passing the frontier to special regulations and treatment by the sanitary police.

(2.) Of rags and tatters. The following are not included in this prohibition:—

(a.) Tatters compressed by hydraulic power, which are packed in bales with iron bands, as wholesale articles of commerce and which are sent with the marks and numbers of origin recognized by the authority of the country where the goods are forwarded.

(b.) New (unused) refuse from the spinning and weaving mills, from sartorial, and from bleaching establishments, artificial wool (laines artificielles: shoddy), unused paper shavings. The transit of the above described articles is, however, allowed if such goods are so packed to exclude during the voyage any contact whatsoever, and if it is proved that importation and transit is allowed in the Foreign territory of transit and respectively of importation.

The present Order comes into force on the day that it is received respectively by the Custom House Offices and by the Marine Sanitary Offices.

This is issued for information and guidance with the observation that the above-mentioned goods as well as—in general—those that would be considered suspect from a sanitary point of view which would be introduced into the Austrian Littoral during the time that the present Decree is in force, will be sent to the nearest Lazaretto at the expense of the parties, and there they will be subjected by the Authorities either to destruction, or to disinfection according to the case, without taking into consideration the damages of the goods, and this will be done at the expense of the parties without granting any compensation.

Quarantine.

Under the power and authority vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner directs that any vessel arriving from any port or place on the coast of Egypt shall be subjected to ten days' quarantine to be undergone at Larnaca, unless such vessel shall have performed ten days' quarantine at an intermediate port and shall be provided with a

clean bill of health; and, further, that any such vessel which has performed quarantine for less than ten days at an intermediate port and is provided with a clean bill of health, shall be required to complete the prescribed period of quarantine at Larnaca.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 26TH NOVEMBER 1902.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extension of Limits of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board dated the twentieth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and two, are hereby extended so as to comprise the Area described in the Schedule to this Order,

and the Area so described is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the third day of December, one thousand nine hundred and two.

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture have hereunto set their Official Seal this twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and two.

FOREIGN ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1902 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Animals from certain States in the United States of America prohibited.

1. Unless and until the Board otherwise order, it shall not be lawful to land any animal brought from the following States in the United States of America, namely, the States of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Rhode Island, and the First Schedule (*Prohibited Countries and Parts of Countries*) to the Foreign Animals Order of 1896 shall be read and have effect as if the said six States were included in the list of prohibited countries and parts of countries mentioned in that Schedule.

Interpretation.

2. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in the Foreign Animals Order of 1896.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and two.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOREIGN ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1902 (No. 2).

It is not intended to run on such tramways carriages or trucks adapted to run on railways, except on the portion of Tramway No. 2 as does not lie between the level crossing in Bridge-street and the termination of such tramway at the Market Place.

To authorize the Council in connection with the proposed tramways and works to make and maintain all necessary approaches, retaining walls, piers, abutments, embankments, girders, cantilevers, bridges, arches, sewers, drains, goits, culverts, excavations, and other works and conveniences.

To enable the Council by agreement with the County Council of Lancashire to rebuild, alter, or widen the bridges across the River Irwell (known respectively as Rose Bank Bridge in Stubbins-lane and Peel Bridge in Peel Brow, or to contribute to the cost thereof, and to empower the County Council and any other Local Authority, railway or other company to contribute to such cost, and to raise the necessary money for that purpose.

To sanction agreements with the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company or other railway company with reference to level crossings at Ramsbottom and elsewhere, and to prescribe the conditions upon which the tramways may be laid across such level crossings and the working thereof.

To authorize the Council to deviate in the construction of the said tramways and works, both vertically and laterally, to the extent shown on the deposited plans and sections, or to be defined by the Order and prescribed by the Board of Trade.

To enable the Council for the purposes of the Order to temporarily and permanently break-up, stop-up, divert, alter and interfere with streets, highways, sewers, drains, pipes, gas and water mains, and electric apparatus, and to alter the levels of any streets for the purpose of effecting convenient junctions with any of the said works.

To authorize the Council to underpin and strengthen any houses or buildings which may be rendered insecure by the construction, maintenance or user of the said works.

The motive power to be used on the proposed tramways is animal, steam, compressed air, gas, oil, and any other mechanical power (applied by means of locomotive engines or by motors in the carriages, or by means of wire or rope cables worked by stationary engines) and electric energy generated at stations, and applied by means of motors in the engines or carriages, or communicated by electric lines in, or underground, or overhead (all which powers other than animal power are herein included in the expression "mechanical power"), and it is intended to apply for power to use the said motive power on all or some of the tramways.

To empower the Council to execute all such works on or in connection with the tramways and in, over or under the streets or roads in which the same are laid as may be necessary or expedient for adapting the same to be worked by mechanical power, and to empower the Council to lay down, construct and maintain on, in, under or over the surface of any street, road or place, and to attach to any house and building such posts, conductors, wires, tubes, mains, plates, cables, ropes and apparatus, and to make and maintain such openings and ways in, on or under any such surface as may be necessary or convenient either for the working of the tramways or any tramway, tramroad or light railway within or (by agreement with the Local Authority, and the company or person owning or working the same) without the Council's district, which may for the time being be connected with any of the Council's tramways, or for connecting any portions of the said tramways or any tramways within or without the Council's district, which can be worked in connection with any of the Council's tramways, or for providing access to or forming connections with any generating station or stations, engines, machinery or apparatus.

To empower the Council to construct and maintain on the following lands a station or stations for generating electric energy, and for a car shed (to be used for all purposes for which the same is or may become applicable) with all buildings, engines and dynamos, machinery and appliances

necessary or expedient for the purpose, and by means thereof to produce and supply such energy accordingly. The lands in this paragraph referred to are:—

Certain lands, situate in the parish, township or urban district of Ramsbottom aforesaid, and on the easterly side of Stubbins-lane, belonging to or reputed to belong to the Calico Printers' Association, and containing 10,950 square yards, or thereabouts, bounded on the east by land belonging to the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, on the north by a bridge leading to the railway sidings, on the west by Stubbins-lane and Factory-lane, and on the south by land and buildings belonging to the Calico Printers' Association and the Council.

To confer on and to reserve to the Council and their lessees the exclusive right of using on any of the proposed tramways carriages drawn or propelled by any motive power hereinbefore mentioned, and having flanged wheels adapted to run on or in a grooved or other rail on such tramways.

To provide for the repair by the Council or their lessees, or other persons, bodies or authorities of any streets, roads, highways or thoroughfares in which any tramway, channel or electric line may for the time being be laid or placed, and for the use or disposition of any materials or things found in the construction or repair of any of the tramways or channels, or electric lines.

To empower the Council for the purposes of the proposed works and for the erection of a tramway, carriage-house, dépôt, stables and other buildings, and for other the purposes of the Order, to appropriate or to purchase or acquire by agreement, or to take on lease any lands, houses or buildings, and to acquire by agreement, rights or easements in, over or connected with any lands, houses and buildings.

To authorize the Council to appropriate and lay out for building purposes portions of any lands already acquired or to be acquired by them under the powers of the Order, and to sell or exchange or otherwise dispose of and grant building and other leases, and to let for building purposes all or any lands, buildings and hereditaments for the time being belonging to them, and to sell and dispose of such annual rents, and the reversion of any lands or buildings, and to extend the powers of the Council with respect to the holding, retaining or disposing of lands, and to empower the Council to appropriate and use the soil and surface of any highway stopped up or

diverted, and to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of the same.

To empower the Council and their lessees to place and run carriages on the tramways, and to work the same and demand and take tolls, rates and charges in respect of the use of such tramways and carriages, and for the conveyance of passenger, animal, goods and mineral merchandise and other traffic thereon and therein, and to alter the existing or authorized tolls, rates and charges, and to confer exemptions from such tolls, rates and charges, and to demand and take tolls, rates and charges for the use of omnibuses or motor-cars, and both within and without the district to provide stables, buildings; carriages, trucks, horses, harness, engines, motors, machinery, apparatus, and steam, electric, cable and other plant, fixed and movable, necessary or convenient for working such tramways by any motive power hereinbefore mentioned, and to sell, exchange or dispose of such of the before-mentioned articles and things as may not be required.

To authorize the Council and the County Council of Lancashire, and any corporation, council, person, company or body to enter into and fulfil contracts and agreements for and in relation to the construction, maintenance, use, working, lease, sale and purchase of the whole or any part of the tramways authorized to be constructed by them respectively, whether within or without the Council's district, the exercise of running powers thereover, the interchange of traffic thereon, the supply of motive power, rolling-stock and plant, and the division of profits, and the maintenance and repair of streets and roads in which any such tramways are or will be laid in consideration of such gross sum or sums, rent or rents, or other payments, and generally upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed on between the contracting or agreeing parties, or as the Order may define, or as may be prescribed by the Order, and the Order will or may confirm, with or without alteration, any agreements which may have been, or which during the progress of the Order may be entered into for, or in relation to, the matters aforesaid or any of them, and to empower any such authority as aforesaid, to apply to any of the purposes aforesaid, any of their corporate funds or local rates or other moneys under their control, and to borrow moneys, and so far as may be necessary for the purpose to exercise the powers of the intended Order or some of them on behalf of or instead of the Council.

To empower the Council and any Local Authority, company, body or person to enter into and carry into effect agreements for the supply of electric energy for the purpose of the tramways to and by the Council, by and to such Local Authority, company, body or person.

To enable the Council to acquire, hold and use patent rights and other rights and licenses.

To empower the Council to run omnibuses or motor-cars in connection with their tramways, or when the running of carriages thereon is impracticable.

To provide for the application of the revenue of the Council in respect of their tramways undertaking, to authorize the establishment of a reserve fund, to provide for the application of such fund, and to provide for the payment of any deficiency in the revenue of the Council in respect of their tramways undertaking.

To empower the Council to borrow or raise money for the purposes of the Order, or for the purposes of any works, whether in connection with the Council tramways or the electrical equipment thereof, or the supply of electrical

energy thereto, or for the purposes of the Tramways Act, 1870, or the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, or any Order or Orders relating to the district made under such respective Acts, and confirmed by Parliament, and to charge the same as to the general district fund, and upon the estates, undertakings, rates, rents, revenues and other property of the Council, or upon any of such securities, and to execute and grant mortgages, and to authorize the Council to apply any of their existing funds or any moneys they are authorized to borrow for any of the purposes of the Order.

To empower the Council to combine with any neighbouring Local Authority or with any company working tramways in any adjoining district in the working of the tramways in the district, and to grant running powers over the tramways of the Council, and to run tramcars belonging to the Council outside the district, and to demand and take tolls and charges in respect thereof.

The Order will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which might in any way interfere with its objects, and will confer other rights and privileges, and will, or may, incorporate with itself, and with or without amendments, all or some of the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, the Lands Clauses Acts (except as to compulsory powers for purchase of land), and the Local Loans Act, 1875, and enable the Council in addition to the powers herein specifically mentioned to exercise all or any of the powers by the Tramways Act, 1870, conferred on the persons therein referred to as Promoters.
