WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-seven sections six and eight duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-seventh day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and two, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-seven sections six and eight have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property formerly belonging to the Prebend of Selsey in the Cathedral Church of Chichester and now vested in us.

“Whereas on the vacancy of the said prebend which occurred on or about the sixth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine by the decease of the Reverend Thomas Valentine the then prebendary all the hereditaments then belonging to the said prebend (except rights of patronage) became by virtue of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen
