MOUNTSORRELL (LEICESTERSHIRE).—Forthwith and entirely in Christ Church, in the parish of Mountsorrell; and in the churchyard except as follows:—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard, burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave.

(c) In the said churchyard in a grave space belonging or reputed to belong to Mrs. Scott, in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom, or of any member of the family for which, such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein.
