A Lady who makes a presentation to Their Majesties must be personally acquainted with and responsible for the Lady she presents. She must herself attend the Court, and cannot present more than one Lady in addition to her daughter or daughter-in-law.

If it should not be convenient for a Lady to attend or be presented at the particular Court to which she is invited, it will be open to her to make her excuses to the Lord Chamberlain in writing, when her name can, if desired, and if possible, be transferred to another List.

The Courts will be held in the evening.

The Dress Regulations are:—Ladies: Full Court dress with feathers and trains. Gentlemen: Full Court dress.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Vic., 1 1st January, 1903.

cap. 110), I, Miles Kirk Burton, General Manager and Secretary of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board, hereby give notice that the said Board propose to alter and extend the Liverpool Landing Stage in accordance with plans deposited at the office of the Mersey Conservancy.

The work in question, which is to provide additional berthage accommodation for passenger ferry steamers, consists of continuing the western face of the stage, a distance of 15 feet to a point opposite the present south end of the stage, and extending it beyond that point a further distance of 15 feet. This extension will be supported on pontoons, which will rise and fall with the tide in the same way as the existing stage, and have similar draught—about 3 feet.

The work will be commenced in two months time, and will not project beyond the western face line of the existing structure, nor further impede or interrupt the tidal or other waters of the River Mersey.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 31ST DECEMBER 1902.)

ORKNEY (STRANGLES) ORDER OF 1902.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

1. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and strangles of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called strangles) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely): Sections nineteen and twenty (slaughter and

compensation);

Section forty-three (powers of police); Section forty-four (powers of inspectors); and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

2. Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of strangles shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected to an Inspector of the Local Authority or to one of his Assistants who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

Duty of Inspector to act immediately.

3. An Inspector of the Local Authority on receiving in any manner whatsoever information of the supposed existence of strangles, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of strangles, shall proceed with all practicable speed to the place where such disease, according to the information received by him, exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall there and elsewhere put in force and discharge the powers and duties conferred and imposed on him as Inspector by or under the Act of 1894 and this Order.

Public Warning as to Existence of Strangles.

4.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, give public warning by placards, advertisement, or otherwise, of the existence of strangles in any stable, building, field, or other place, with or without any particular description thereof, as they think fit, and may continue to do so during the existence of the disease, and in case of a stable, building, or other like place, until the same has been cleansed and disinfected.

(2.) It shall not be lawful for any person (without authority or excuse) to remove or deface any

such placard.

## Slaughter.

5.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, cause to be slaughtered-

(i.) any horse, ass, or mule affected with

strangles; or

(ii.) any horse, ass, or mule being or having been in the same stable, building, field, or other place in which strangles exists or is suspected to exist, or being or having been in contact with a horse, ass, or mule affected with strangles

(2.) Provided that if the owner of the horse, ass, or mule gives notice in writing to the Local Authority, or their Inspector or other officer, that he objects to the horse, ass, or mule being slaughtered, it shall not be lawful for the Local Authority to cause that horse, ass, or mule to be slaughtered except with the further special authority of the Board first obtained.

### Compensation.

6. The Local Authority shall, except as hereinafter provided, pay out of the local rate as compensation for any horse, ass, or mule slaughtered under this Order, the value of the horse, ass, or mule immediately before it was slaughtered.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Movement.

- 7. The Local Authority may, with the view of preventing the spreading of strangles, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of
  - (a.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules in the whole of their District or in such part or parts thereof as may be specified by the Local Authority:
  - (b.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules out of the whole of their District or out of such part or parts thereof as may be specified by the Local Authority:

(c.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement out of any stable, building, field, or other place of a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of strangles:

(d.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement out of any stable, building, field, or other place in which strangles exists or is suspected to exist of a horse, ass, or mule that has been in contact with or in the same stable, building, field, or other place with a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of strangles:

(e.) For regulating the taking out of any stable, building, field, or other place of any fodder, litter, or other thing that has been in contact with or used for or about a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of strangles;

but nothing in any such Regulation shall authorize movement in contravention of any provision of any Order of the Board for the time being in force; and a Regulation under paragraph (d) of this Article shall operate so long only as any horse, ass, or mule which in the judgment of the Local Authority is affected with strangles, remains in the stable, building, field, or other place to which the Regulation refers, and in case of a stable, building, or other like place, until the Regulations of the Local Authority as to cleansing and disinfection have been complied with.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

8.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of strangles, make Regulations for the following purposes, or

(a.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of strangles:

(b.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and such disinfection are to be effected:

(c.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect the same at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or occupier.

(2.) If any person fails to cleanse and disinfect ; in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without pre-judice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such blace to be cleansed and disinfected, and to recover summarily the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such person.

Occupiers to give facilities for Cleansing.

9.—(1.) Where the power of causing any place to be cleansed and disinfected under this Order is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier thereof shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

(2.) Any person failing to comply with the provisious of this Article shall be deemed guilty

of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

10.-(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Regulation

made by them under this Order.
(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

# Withholding of Compensation.

11.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, withhold, either wholly or partially, compensation in respect of a horse, ass, or mule slaughtered by their order under this Order where the horse, ass, or mule was in their opinion affected with strangles at the time of its being

brought into their District.

(2.) The Local Authority before determining under sub-section seven of section twenty of the Act of 1894 or under this Article, to withhold, either wholly or partially, compensation or other payment in respect of a horse, ass, or mule slaughtered by their order under this Order, shall give to the owner of the horse, ass, or mule an opportunity of making representations to them respecting the facts and circumstances of the case, and shall consider the same.

# Record of Slaughter.

12. The Local Authority shall keep, in the form provided by the Board, a record relative to borses, asses, or mules slaughtered by their order under this Order, stating the particulars indicated in such form, with such variations as circumstances require.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

13.—(1.) Every person in charge of any horse, ass, or mule being moved, where under any Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

### Offences.

14.—(1.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark clipped, painted, or stamped on any horse, ass, or mule as required by a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

(3.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of any place in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a person in charge of any horse, ass, or mule being moved, where, under a Regulation o the Local Authority made under this Order, a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

"Fodder" means hay or other substance commonly used for food of horses, asses, or

-"Litter" means straw or other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about horses, asses, or mules:

"Master" includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel:

Other terms have the same meaning and scope as in the Act of 1894.

Extent.

16. This Order extends to the county of Orkney only.

Commencement.

17. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of January, one thousand nine hundred and three.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and three.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District:-

# SOMERSETSHIRE AUDIT DISTRICT.

To John Arthur Lander, District Auditor; -

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised within the said Unions respectively ;-

To the Authorities referred to in Article I (3) of this Order;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas John Arthur Lander is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment to the office of District Auditor of the said John Arthur Lander (hereinafter referred to as "the District Auditor"), and do order and prescribe as follows:-

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers; namely:-

- (1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this
- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions.

- (3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions, and whose accounts are not subject to audit by any other District Auditor.
- (4.) Such other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II .- The District Auditor shall audit the said accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the District Auditor shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The Somersetshire Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, and the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in Paragraph (4) of Article I of this

ARTICLE IV .-- Any Order in force assigning a District to the District Auditor for the discharge of his duties or prescribing his duties shall, from and after the date upon which this Order shall come into operation, be rescinded, but nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the existing duties and powers of any District Auditor as regards any Audit, or any matters or proceedings already commenced.

ARTICLE V.—In this Order—

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

ARTICLE VI.—This Order shall come into operation on the Fifth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and three, provided that, for the purpose of the giving of notices of any Audit, it shall operate from the date hereof.
