No. 15.—THE PHILIPPINE ISLANDS—LUZON, SOUTH COAST.

Tayabas River Entrance—Shoal Reported.

The United States Government has given notice that a shoal about a quarter or half a mile long, and with a depth of 4 fathoms over it, is reported to exist about 3 miles S. 9° E. from the entrance to Tayabas River.

Approximate position, lat. 13° 51' N., long. 121° 37' E.

No. 16.—CANADA, RIVER ST. LAWRENCE—LAKE ST. LOUIS.

Soulanges Canal—Lights and Light-Buoys Established.

The Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, dated 2nd December, 1902, that the undermentioned light and light-buoys have been established as guides for entering the eastern end of the Soulanges Canal, Lake St. Louis:—

Lights.

1. On the southern pier head a white occulting light every twelve seconds, thus:—light, eight seconds; eclipse, four seconds; it is elevated 34 feet above the Summer Lake level, is visible from a distance of 4 miles, and is shown from a pyramidal framework structure.

Approximate position, lat. 45° 20½' N., long. 73° 56' W.

2. On the northern pier head a red fixed light, elevated 37 feet above the Summer Lake level, and visible from a distance of 2 miles, is shown from a cylindrical tower, 29 feet high, painted white, with red lantern.

A red fixed light, elevated 59 feet above the Summer Lake level, and visible from a distance of 2 miles, is exhibited from a similar tower, 45 feet high, situated at a distance of 3 cables S. 78° W. from the above.

These two lights in line S. 78° W. lead to the entrance of the canal.

Light-Buoys.

a. A light-buoy has been established with the above-mentioned lights (2) in line S. 78° W., distant 4 $\frac{2}{10}$ cables from the light (front) on the northern pier head, and with the eastern extremity of Cascades Island bearing S. 13° E.

b. A second light-buoy has been established S. 76° E., distant 23 cables from the first buoy, with Beauharnois leading lights in line S. 65° W., at a distance of 2 $\frac{1}{10}$ miles from the front light, and with the southern extremity of Fortiers Point N. 58° W.

c. A third light-buoy is moored in a line between the above two light-buoys at a distance of $13\frac{7}{10}$ cables S. 76° E. from the western buoy.

Each of the above buoys exhibits a white fixed light, is painted red, and carries a conical topmark.

Landsort—Shoals North-Eastward of.

No. 18.—CANADA, BRITISH COLUMBIA—FRASER RIVER.

New Westminster—Bridge Constructing.

The Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, dated 2nd October, 1902, that a bridge is under construction across the Fraser River at New Westminster, the eastern end of which joins the river's bank about one cable to the northward of Brownville Jetty, and the western end at about 8 cables to the southward of Brunette Saw-mill. During the progress of the works the channel at that point will be marked in the daytime by a red flag, affixed to a spar or pile, on each side of the channel; at night the flags will be replaced by red fixed lights.

Mariners are warned that the channel is between the above marks, and that obstructions exist elsewhere, also that speed is to be reduced to a minimum for at least a cable's length before and after passing the bridge works.

Gedney Channel—Light-Buoy Placed Experimentally.

The United States Government has given notice that, on 25th October, 1902, a spar-shaped gas buoy, painted red, and exhibiting a red occulting light every ten seconds, thus:—light, five seconds; eclipse, five seconds, was moored for experiment midway between buoys E. 2 and G.E. 2, in Gedney Channel, New York Lower Bay entrance.

Approximate position, lat. 40° 29' N., long. 73° 56' W.

Thimble Shoal Fog Signal—Intended Alteration in.

The United States Government has given notice, that on 15th January, 1903, the fog bells at Thimble Shoal Lighthouse, Hampton Roads Approach, will be replaced by a fog siren, which will during thick or foggy weather, give one blast every nine seconds, thus:—blast, four and a half seconds; silent interval, four and a half seconds.
