The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated January 5, from His Majesty's Representative at The Hague, intimating that the following measures have been taken to prevent the spreading of the plague in Holland:—

"It is prohibited, excepting by permission of the Minister of the Interior and with due observance of the instructions to be given by him to prevent the spreading of infection:

1°. To search for the presence of plague germs in persons and merchandise by making experiments upon animals.

2°. To perform the operation of opening the bodies of persons who have died of the plague or are suspected of having had the plague.

3°. To convey substances which are plague germs, or are suspected of being plague germs.

Having read the advice of the Inspectors for the medical State supervision of 16th May, 1900; Has approved and sanctioned:

§ 1.

The examination of persons and merchandise for the presence of plague germs by making experiments upon animals.

Requests for permission for an examination of the kind may be made to the Inspector for the medical State supervision in whose district the examination is to be made.

With them must be given all possible information about the arrangements of the locality where the examination is to be made, and the precautions which will be taken at the examination to prevent the spreading of the plague germs.

Among others must be proved what precautions have been taken by the applicant:

a. To make the locality where the examination will be made, inaccessible to persons whose presence is not required at the examination, and to animals which are not used for it.

b. To prevent the escape of animals upon which experiments have been made.

c. To have the animals experimented upon properly killed.

d. For the persons, clothes and articles to be properly disinfected.

Further shall be declared what persons will be present at the examination, and information must be given about the ability, experience, accuracy and reliability of the persons who will assist at the examination.

The Inspector for the medical State supervision, after consulting (if necessary) with other experts, shall forward the request with his advice, as quickly as possible (if necessary by telegraph), to the Minister of the Interior.

§ 2.

The opening of the bodies of persons who have died of the plague, or are suspected of having had the plague.

Applications for permission to perform this operation may be made to the Inspector for the medical State supervision in whose district the operation is to take place.

With them must be given all possible information about:

a. The manner in which the substances taken from the body will be kept beyond the reach of animals which might spread the infection.

b. The manner in which the substances will be collected and made harmless.

c. The precautions against the spreading of plague germs to be taken by the persons who perform the operation of opening the body and their assistants.

The Inspector for the medical State supervision after consulting (if necessary) with other experts, shall forward the application with his advice, as quickly as possible (if necessary by telegraph), to the Minister of the Interior.

§ 3.

The transport of substances which are plague germs or suspected of being plague germs.

The transport of these substances unaccompanied is prohibited with every kind of conveyance.

The transport is allowed if accompanied by an Inspector of the medical State supervision, by a professor director of a pathological, hygienical or pharmaceutical laboratory, by a medical man, or by a person having in his possession a special written authorization from an inspector, a professor, or a medical man as above mentioned, provided that:

a. The substance to be examined is placed in a well closed bottle with stopper, closed water-tight, properly surrounded by some absorbent packing material, the whole placed in a well fastened wooden case.

b. The package has a distinct address and the words 'infected substance' are clearly marked on the outside of the package."

**ILFORD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL
ELECTRIC TRAMWAYS.**

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Ilford Urban District Council (hereinafter called the Council), as the Promoters, under the powers conferred on the Council by the Tramways Act, 1870.

Extent of Bye-laws.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Council, and to all places with respect to which the Council have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

Passengers getting on and off.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindmost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

Smoking.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any carriage.

Musical Instruments.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Intoxicated Persons.

5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Improper Language.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Wilful Damage.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Offensive Clothing.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Payment of Fares.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Council the fare legally demandable for the journey.

Inspection of Tickets.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Council, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Artizans' Tickets.

11. A passenger not being an artizan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Council, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artizans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

Personal Luggage.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artizans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

Standing on Steps or Platform.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Council shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

Holding on or hanging to any part of Carriage.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

Carriage full.

15. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers, which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

Carriage full.

16. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

Licensed number not to be exceeded.

17. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

Entering or leaving a Car in motion.

18. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

Dogs or other Animals.

19. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms.

20. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Council with loaded fire-arms.

Obstructing Officers or Servants.

21. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Council in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Council.

Enforcing Bye-laws.

22. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

Penalty.

23. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Conductor.

24. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Council and having charge of a carriage.

Copy of Bye-laws.

25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

26. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of March, 1903.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Ilford Urban District Council as the Local Authority, under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

Interpretation.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any (engine or) carriage using any tramway laid down within the said district, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a (an engine or) car.

Distance from other cars.

2. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than 100 yards.

Stopping for passengers.

3. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 2 and 4, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers, when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made at each or any of the specified stopping places along the route; provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 25.

Stoppage of Car.

4. Except at a passing place or terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

Warning to other persons in charge of other vehicles.

5. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

Wilful obstruction.

6. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

Penalty.

7. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

8. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of March, 1903.
