(b) As to the desirability of establishing some authority or tribunal to which all schemes of Railway or Tramway construction of a local character should be referred, and the powers which it would be advisable to confer on such a

body.

whatsoever.

And We do by these presents authorize and empower you, or any five or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do by these presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you Our said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any five or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any five or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in your inquiries We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved Lynden Livingston Macassey, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be Secretary to this Our

Commission.

#### BOROUGH OF PLYMOUTH.

OTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Plymouth, in exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, have made Bye-laws and Regulations (of which the following is a copy) with regard to the Tramways, viz. :

Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Plymouth (hereinafter called the Corporation) under the powers conferred on the Corporation

by the Tramways Act, 1870.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Corporation, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's plat-

form, and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any

carriage.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or per-

form upon any musical instrument.

- 5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.
- 7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contraven-tion of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.
- 8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in the interior of any carriage shall on request of the conductor leave the interior of the carriage, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for

the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Corporation and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artizan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artizans,

mechanics, or daily labourers.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artizans, mechanics, and daily labourers), shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of

any carriage.

13. No passenger or person nor any tramway employé in the employ of the Corporation other than the driver and conductor shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof, or sit on the outside rail on the roof, or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, stand in the interior of any carriage and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

14. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided in such interior no person beyond such number shall enter, mount or remain therein, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained. When any car contains on the outside thereof

the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

15. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

16. No dog or other animal shall be allowed

in or on any carriage.

- 17. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Corporation with firearms, except that on the outside thereof unloaded firearms may be carried by any member of His Majesty's Imperial Forces.
- 18. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Corporation.
- 19. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.
- 20. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.
- 21. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Corporation and having charge of a carriage.
- 22. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.
- 23. From and after the date of these Bye-laws and Regulations coming into force, the Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Corporation which came into force on the 1st day of January, 1898, shall be repealed.
- 24. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on Tuesday, the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and three.

#### CITY AND COUNTY OF NEWCASTLE-UPON-TYNE.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City and County of Newcastle-upon-Tyne did on the fourth day of February, 1903, make the following Bye-laws and Regulations:—

City and County of Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

Bye-Laws and Regulations made by the Mayor,
Aldermen, and Citizens of the City and County
of Newcastle-upon-Tyne with respect to the
tramways and portions of tramways for the
time being belonging to them.

The Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City and County of Newcastle-upon-Tyne (hereinafter called "the Corporation"), being the promoters and owners of the tramways in the City and County of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and the urban districts of Walker and Benwell and Fenham, and so much of the tramways in the urban district of Gosforth as are authorized by the South Gosforth Tramways Order, 1881, and the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Tramways Extensions Act, 1902, do hereby make the following Byelaws and Regulations with respect to the tramways and portions of tramways for the time being belonging to the Corporation, pursuant to the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870.

Repeal of former Bye-laws and Regulations.

1. From and after the date of these Bye-laws and Regulations coming into force, all Bye-laws and Regulations heretofore made by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens, or by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, with respect to the tramways within the said City, shall be repealed; but any proceedings pending at the time of such repeal may be continued and prosecuted as if such repeal had not taken effect.

Interpretation.

2. Throughout these Bye-laws and Regulations the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City and County of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and shall include any lessees or persons for the time being working the tramways as hereinafter defined; the word "tramways" means the tramways and portions of tramways for the time being belonging to the Corporation, and situate in the City and County of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and the urban districts of Walker, Gosforth, and Benwell and Fenham; the word "car" means any carriage or car run by the Corporation upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car; the word "motor-man" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car; and words importing the masculine gender include females.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

3. Every person shall mount or alight from a car by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

4. All persons desiring to alight from any car shall (if ready when the car stops) do so before any person mounts the car for the purpose of travelling thereon, and all persons desiring to mount the car shall allow such persons to alight as aforesaid.

#### Full Cars.

- 5. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is constructed to carry and which number is posted in or on the car, no additional person shall mount, enter, or remain in or upon any such car. The conductor shall have power to prevent any person beyond such number of passengers from mounting, entering, or remaining in or upon any part of a car. All such persons shall leave the car immediately upon the request of the conductor.
- 6. When a car contains the full number of passengers which it is constructed to carry, a notice to that effect shall as soon as practicable be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the car.

Unauthorized Travelling.

- 7. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, or an officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty, shall mount or enter a car, and no person, or passenger, except such officer or servant as aforesaid shall hold or hang on by or to the dashboard or steps or any other part of a car, except straps or other appliances provided inside or on the roof of the car for the convenience of passengers. No person or passenger shall sit on or lean against the outside rails on the roof of any car. No person or passenger shall stand or sit on any platform or stairs of any car. And no person or passenger shall, except with the permission of the conductor, stand inside any car when sitting accommodation is available either inside the car or on the roof.
- 8. No person, except an officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty, shall mount or attempt to mount, or shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any water carriage or other carriage used upon the tramways for any purpose other than the conveyance of passengers.

Entering or Leaving a Car when in motion.

9. No person (except an officer of the Tramway Department of the Corporation) shall mount, enter, or alight from, or attempt to mount, enter, or alight from any car whilst in motion.

## Persons suffering from Disease not to travel on Cars.

10. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall mount, enter, or travel on any car, or attempt so to do. And no driver or conductor shall knowingly suffer or permit any such person so to do.

#### Disabled Cars.

- 11. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, all passengers, shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the car, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but shall be entitled to continue their journey by the next available car. No person shall, except with the permission of the conductor, mount or enter a disabled or damaged car.
- 12. The Corporation shall not be bound to complete the journey of any car in any specific time.

#### Cars proceeding to Sheds.

13. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed and is not on its usual route unless permitted so to do by the conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

#### Smoking.

14. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars, or cigarettes inside any car except in a compartment specially set apart for the purpose.

#### Dogs.

15. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

#### Firearms.

16. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms or dangerous articles or things.

#### Objectionable Persons.

- 17. Any person who is in a state of intoxication shall not mount or enter upon any car, and may be prevented from doing so by the conductor or other officer or servant of the Corporation. Any person offending against or committing a breach of this Bye-law shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person fail to leave the car when requested to do so by the conductor, it shall be lawful for the conductor or any other officer or servant of the Corporation or any police constable to remove such person from the car.
- 18. A person whose dress or clothing might in the opinion of the conductor of a car soil or injure the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, is by reason of vermin, disease, dress, or want of cleanliness, offensive to passengers, or unfit to be a passenger, shall not be entitled to mount or enter or remain upon any car, and may be prevented by the conductor or other officer or servant of the Corporation from mounting or entering any car, and shall not mount or enter any car, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found upon any car, shall, on request of the conductor, and upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned, leave the car, failing which it shall be lawful for the conductor or any other officer or servant of the Corporation, or any police constable, to remove such person from the car.

#### Offensive Language or Conduct.

19. No person shall swear or use obscene abusive or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or spit or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or waiting room, or other premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements, or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

Luggage and Parcels.

- 20. No person shall without the consent of the conductor take upon any car any personal luggage exceeding twenty-eight pounds in weight, or any parcel (not being personal luggage of not more than twenty-eight pounds in weight accompanied by a passenger) or any luggage (including the tools of artizans, mechanics, and daily labourers) which from its size or otherwise is in the opinion of the conductor unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the car.
- 21. No personal luggage unaccompanied by a passenger shall be conveyed in or on any car.
- 22. The conductor may decline to take, and may prevent any person from taking upon any car any personal luggage exceeding twenty-eight pounds in weight, and any parcels (not being personal luggage of not more than twenty-eight pounds in weight accompanied by a passenger), and any luggage (including the tools of artizans, mechanics, and daily labourers), which from its size or otherwise is in the opinion of the conductor unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the car.
- 23. All luggage conveyed in or on any car shall be placed in such positions, and in such parts of the car as shall be directed by the conductor.

#### Damaging Cars.

24. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains or linings, or any other part of any car, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any car. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, to pay the amount of any damage so done.

#### Payment of Fares.

25. Each passenger shall, either on demand or before leaving the car (whichever first happens), pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation the fare for his journey and shall obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey. Any person travelling beyond the destination to which his ticket was available shall pay a fresh fare from the point to which such ticket was available and shall obtain another ticket for such fresh fare. No child under five years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this exemption shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the ordinary fare.

#### Tickets.

- 26. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to the conductor, or any duly authorized officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, deliver up his ticket. Any passenger unable to produce his ticket shall pay the fare for the distance travelled over by such passenger.
- 27. Tickets shall not be transferable from person to person, and (except special tickets for transfer to another car) shall only be available on the car and for the journey for which they are issued.
- 28. Special tickets for transfer to another car shall only be used upon the first of such other cars which is available.
- 29. A passenger, not being an artizan, mechanic, or daily labourer, going to or return-

ing from his work, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artizans, mechanics, or daily labourers, nor ask to have such ticket issued to him.

Interference with the Duties of the Conductor or Motor-man.

30. No person other than the conductor or motor-man shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, switches, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car or its equipment, or signal a car to start.

Conductors and Motor-men to enforce Bye-laws.

31. Every conductor and motor-man shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations, and prevent the breach thereof.

Obstructing Officials in execution of duty. 32. No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car.

Power to remove Passengers committing offence.

33. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any offence against or any breach of any of the foregoing Bye-laws or Regulations numbered respectively five, seven, ten, eleven, thirteen, fourteen, sixteen, nineteen, twenty, twenty-four, twenty-five, twenty-six, thirty, and thirty-two, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid, and if such person fail to leave the car when requested to do so by the conductor, it shall be lawful for the conductor or any other officer or servant of the Corporation or any police constable to remove such person from the car.

Penalty.

34. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding forty shillings.

These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come

into force on the first day of May, 1903.

Tunis—Uniform System of marking Tunny Fisheries.

The French Government has given notice, that from the 1st January, 1903, the Tunny Fisheries on the coast of Tunis will be marked uniformly in the following manner:—

On shore.

Beacons, 10 feet high, made of wood or iron, surmounted by rectangular topmarks, will mark the shore limits of the area containing the nets.

At sea
