Notice is hereby given, that His Majesty The King will hold Levées at Buckingham Palace on Monday, the 23rd February, and on Monday, the 9th March next, at 12 o'clock noon, and that for these and all future Levées Cards of Admission will be required, as the numbers at each of these Ceremonies must be limited.

In consequence of the State Apartments at St. James's Palace being temporarily required for other purposes, the Levées will be held, until further notice, at Buckingham Palace.

The following are the rules to be observed:—
ATTENDANCES AND PRESENTATIONS.

- 1. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.
- 2. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army, Militia, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Adjutant-General at the War Office.
- 3. All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.
- 4. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the Colonies possessing responsible Government, who will ap ly to the War

Office for their cards for attendance or for presentation by the Adjutant - General. The application must in all cases be supported by a credential from the Governor or Officer commanding the local Forces of the Colony.

- 5. Similarly, all Gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office, the Home Office, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament or any Government Department, will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation at Levées from the Department under which they serve.
- 6. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, are requested to make their applications through the Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.
- 7. Peers, Bishops, Members of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all Gentlemen other than the above mentioned, will be good enough to communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace, when they will each be furnished with a card of admission for use at the Levée.

In the case of the Levée to be held on the 23rd instant all names, both for attendance and presentation, must be received at the various offices not later than Wednesday next, the 18th instant.

For the Levée to be held on the 9th March, and for all future Levées, the names, both for attendance and presentation must be received at the various Offices above indicated not later than eight days prior to the date of each Levée, except in the case of Officers who make application to the War Office, where, owing to the great number of applications to be dealt with, fourteen days before the date of each Levée will be required.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE,

(DATED 12TH FEBRUARY 1903.)

Manchester (Parasitic Mange) Order of

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

1.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same

to the Local Authority.

Duty of Inspector to act immediately.

2. An Inspector of the Local Authority on receiving in any manner whatsoever information of the supposed existence of parasitic mange, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of parasitic manage, shall proceed with all practicable speed to the place where such disease, according to the information received by him, exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall see that the provisions of this Order are complied with.

Treatment for Parasitic Mange.

3.—(1.) A person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with parasitic mange, shall from time to time as often as may be necessary treat that horse, ass, or mule, or cause it to be treated, with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange.

(2.) If any person fail to comply with the requirements of this Article he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

4.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following pur-

poses, or any of them:

(a.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange:

(b.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected:

(c.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or occupier.

(2.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, to be cleansed and disinfected, and to recover summarily the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such

(3.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of any place in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

1894.

Occupiers to give facilities for Cleansing.

5.—(1.) Where the power of causing any place to be cleansed and disinfected under this Order is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier thereof shall give all reason-

able facilities for that purpose.

(2.) If any person fail to comply with the requirements of this Article he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

6.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Regulation

made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (powers of police); Section forty-four (powers of inspectors); and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

Exemption of Army Veterinary Department and Veterinary Colleges.

8. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Department, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Interpretation.

9. In this Order-

"The Board" means the Board of Agricul-

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Extent.

10. This Order extends to the city of Manchester only.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and three.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the Manchester (Parasitic Mange) Order of 1903.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE

(DATED 10TH FEBRUARY 1903.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. The provisions of this Order shall apply to the vessel named in the Schedule hereto and to all animals carried in such vessel while this Order remains in force.
- Any Inspector of the Board of Agriculture shall be permitted to examine the animals at such time or times as he may require while the vessel is in any port of Great Britain.
- 3. No person, except as hereinafter provided. shall while the animals are in any port of Great Britain enter a pen in which the animals are, or have recently been kept; Provided that Inspectors of the Board of Agriculture and all persons while actually engaged in tending the animals or cleansing or disinfecting the pens shall be exempted from the prohibition contained in this Article.
- 4. Every person upon leaving a pen in which the animals are or have recently been kept shall thoroughly wash his hands with soap and water and disinfect his boots with a five per cent. solution of carbolic acid, and every such person shall before landing from the vessel in Great Britain change or effectually disinfect his clothes.
- 5. The vessel shall, as soon as is practicable after its arrival in any port of Great Britain, be cleansed and disinfected as follows:-
 - (i.) All parts of the vessel with which any animal or its dung have come in contact shall be scraped and swept and then thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water, and subsequently disinfected 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

- with a five per cent. solution of carbolic acid or with chloride of lime or some other suitable disinfectant.
- (ii.) All fittings, pens, hurdles, or utensils used for or about the animals shall be scraped and then cleansed and disinfected in the same manner as the vessel.
- (iii.) While any part of the vessel is being cleansed or disinfected all animals shall be temporarily removed therefrom.
- (iv.) The scrapings and sweepings shall be forthwith thoroughly mixed with lime, and then carried by water outside the port in which the vessel is lying, and there discharged into the sea.
- 6. While the vessel remains in any port of Great Britain, all dung of the animals, and all litter removed from the pens, shall at intervals not exceeding twenty-four hours be thoroughly mixed with lime and then carried by water outside the port and there discharged into the sea.
- 7. No animal or carcase of an animal shall be landed from the vessel in any port of Great Britain while this Order remains in force.
- 8. If anything is done or omitted to be done with respect to the vessel or the animals therein, or the carcase of any such animal, in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel shall each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- 9. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires-
 - "Animals" means cattle, sheep and goats, and all other ruminating animals, and swine:
 - "Master" includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel:
 - "Carcase" means the carcase of an animal, and part of a carcase, and the meat, bones, hide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal, or other part of an animal, separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof:
 - "Port" includes a sub-port, haven or creek, and the limits of a port for the purposes of this Order shall be the limits declared under the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876.
