The following Addresses were presented to His Majesty on the occasion of Their Majesties' visit to the Herbert Hospital, Woolwich, on Monday, the 16th instant:—

To Their Most Excellent Majesties King Edward and Queen Alexandra.

The loyal and dutiful Address of the Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors of the Metropolitan Borough of Woolwich.

May it please Your Majesties:—

On behalf of the inhabitants of this Borough, we desire to offer Your Majesties a most loyal and hearty welcome upon the occasion of Your Majesties' most gracious visit to the Herbert Hospital. We beg respectfully to remind Your Majesties, that Woolwich is the birthplace of the King's Royal Navy; that it fitted out Sir Francis Drake's ships, and prepared Sir Walter Raleigh's expeditions, besides many other conquering and colonising enterprises, which helped to found Your Majesty's vast Empire; that it is also an important Garrison, and can claim to have been, from the establishment of the regiment until very recently, the home of Your Majesty's Royal Artillery, and has yet in its midst the chief school of military science—the Royal Military Academy—where His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught received his first military training.

The Royal Arsenal, where some 20,000 of Your Majesty's workmen are employed in manufacturing guns and munitions of war for the defence of Your Realms, has helped to make famous the name of Woolwich.

The Royal Manor of Eltham also forms part of the Borough, and was, for probably many centuries, the home of English Sovereigns. We therefore, having in mind these many Royal associations, humbly rejoice that Your Majesties have most graciously honoured us by passing through our Borough on the mission of mercy which forms the object of Your Majesties' visit—a mission in keeping with the noble purpose which has always characterised Your Majesties' lives.

We do not fail to remember that the last occasion upon which the Borough was honoured with the presence of Royalty was when Her late lamented Majesty Queen Victoria journeyed to the Herbert Hospital to cheer Her sick and wounded soldiers returned from South Africa.

Whilst assuring Your Majesties of our continued loyalty and devotion to Your Majesties' Persons and Throne, we earnestly pray that Your Majesties' lives may long be spared to fulfil the great and beneficent projects so dear to Your hearts, and which are fraught with so much blessing to the millions privileged to own Your sway.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

"On behalf of Queen Alexandra and Myself, I thank you for Your loyal and dutiful Address.

"It is with great pleasure that We visit this Borough, which holds a unique position with regard to the Naval and Military defences of My Empire, and which has had for many generations a close association with the Royal House of Great Britain.

"I am deeply touched by your reference to the last time on which My revered Mother, Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, came among you; and I rejoice that between that date and My first visit to you as King the War which was then being carried on in South Africa has been brought to a satisfactory conclusion."

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

*Movement of swine into out of or within
Scheduled District.*

1. No swine shall be moved into or out of the district described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the EAST RETFORD AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1903.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board.

POOR LAW CONFERENCES.

(Rescinding previous Orders.)

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions in England and Wales :—
And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 2 of the Poor Law Conferences Act, 1883, it is enacted as follows :—

“The guardians of any union may, when empowered by and subject to any regulations made by the Local Government Board (which regulations the said Board is hereby authorised from time to time to make, vary, or rescind), pay the reasonable expenses of any guardian or guardians, or clerk to the guardians, incurred in attending any conference of guardians held for the purpose of discussing any matter which is connected with the duties which devolve on them, and any reasonable expenses incurred in purchasing reports of the proceedings of any such conference, and may charge the amount to their common fund, or, if they have no common fund, to the fund under their control.”

And whereas by a General Order dated the 17th day of September, 1883, as amended by a General Order dated the 21st day of April, 1902, We, the Local Government Board, empowered the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions in England and Wales to pay the reasonable expenses incurred in attending any such Conference as is mentioned in the said section, and in purchasing reports of the proceedings of any such Conference, subject to the regulations set forth in the said General Orders ;

And whereas it is expedient that other provision should be made in the matter as hereinafter mentioned :

Now therefore, in pursuance of Our powers in that behalf, We do hereby rescind the said General Orders dated respectively the seventeenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and the twenty-first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and two; and do hereby empower the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions in England and Wales to pay the reasonable expenses incurred in attending any such Conference as is mentioned in the said section, and in purchasing reports of the proceedings of any such Conference, subject to the following regulations :—

ARTICLE I. The expenses incurred by the Guardians of any Union in respect of the attendance of their representatives at a Conference shall only be paid in respect of such attendance at the Central Conference held in London, or at a Conference convened for a District including that Union.

ARTICLE II. The attendance at any Conference of a Guardian or Guardians, or of the Clerk to the Guardians, of any Union, shall be expressly authorized by a resolution passed at a meeting of the Guardians of that Union, a written or printed notice that the proposal is to be considered at that meeting having been sent, by post or otherwise, to each Guardian not less than four days prior to the date of the meeting; and where the attendance of more than one Guardian is authorized, the number of Guardians authorized to attend shall be specified in the resolution.

ARTICLE III. The maximum number of Guardians authorized to attend the Central Conference held in London shall be two for each Union, and the maximum number of Guardians authorized to attend any Conference convened for a District shall be three for each Union included in the District.

ARTICLE IV. The number of copies which may be purchased by the Guardians of any Union of the report of the proceedings of the Central Conference, or of any Conference convened for a District including that Union, shall be such as the Guardians of the Union may, by resolution, determine.

ARTICLE V. This Order may be cited as the Poor Law Conferences Order, 1903.
