

the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Crook, situate in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five and published in the London Gazette upon the twenty-first day of the same month a part of the parish of Brancepeth in the said county of Durham and diocese of Durham was assigned as a chapelry district to the consecrated church of Saint Catherine situate at Crook within the limits of the said parish and the said chapelry district was named 'The Chapelry District of Crook.'

"And whereas the said chapelry district of Crook has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and four become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine and published in the London Gazette on the fifth day of the following month certain contiguous portions of the said new parish of Crook and of the new parish of Willington in the said county of Durham and diocese of Durham were assigned as a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John Sunnybrow situate within the limits of the said new parish of Crook and the said consolidated chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John Sunnybrow.'

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Crook should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn Bishop of the said diocese of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Crook shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish of Crook which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint John Sunnybrow.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Crook in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham and to be annexed to the consolidated chapelry of Saint John Sunnybrow, in the said county and diocese being:—

"All that portion of the said new parish of Crook which includes part of the township of Willington and also a small part of the township of Crook and Billy Row and which is bounded upon the south-west and upon the south-east by the said consolidated chapelry of Saint John Sunnybrow upon the north-east partly by the new parish of Willington and partly by the parish of Brancepeth both in the said county and diocese upon the north by the said parish of Brancepeth upon the north-west partly by the new parish of Stanley in the said county and diocese, and partly by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Stanley from the said new parish of Crook at the point where Billy Hall-road is joined by the road or footway leading from the house called Billy Hall and extending thence southward along the middle of Billy Hall-road for a distance of half-a-chain or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Crook from the said consolidated chapelry of Saint John Sunnybrow."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual
